PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1986 SESSION

AN ACT concerning cooperation between high schools and institutions of higher education.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. The Commissioner of Education and the Chancellor of Higher
2 Education jointly shall establish a program to promote increased
3 cooperation between the State's high schools and institutions of
4 higher education. The objective of this program shall be to increase
5 the access of our State's ***[most]*** able high school students to the
6 educational resources available in our institutions of higher edu-
7 cation. This program shall supplement the efforts of local school
8 districts to provide appropriate education to their ***[most gifted]***
9 students and shall not relieve a district of any obligation established
10 by statute or regulation.

11 The program shall increase the availability of college-level in-
12 struction for high school students through courses offered by
13 institutions of higher education at their campuses and in high
14 schools. The program shall seek the involvement of all institutions
15 of higher education, two-year and four-year, public and nonpublic,
16 and all school districts, including those which are not located in
17 close proximity to an appropriate institution of higher education.

1 2. The Commissioner of Education and the Chancellor of Higher
2 Education shall examine the regulations previously adopted by
3 their respective departments to identify and then modify any
4 regulations which may be inconsistent with the objectives of this
5 act. Within one year of the effective date of this act, they shall
6 report to the Legislature on the effectiveness of the program.

STATEMENT

This bill directs the Commissioner of Education and the Chancellor of Higher Education jointly to establish a program to encourage increased cooperation between our State's high schools and institutions of higher education. The program would seek to involve more of the State's high schools and colleges in arrangements where outstanding students are able to take some college-level courses, offered either at the high school or at the institution of higher education. These arrangements would supplement the high schools' responsibility to provide appropriate education to their most gifted students.

DATED: JANUARY 30, 1986

The Assembly Education Committee favorably reports this bill as amended.

As amended, this bill directs the Commissioner of Education and the Chancellor of Higher Education jointly to establish a program to make the educational resources of colleges and universities available to New Jersey's able high school students. The program shall increase the availability of college-level instruction for high school students through courses offered by institutions of higher education on their own campuses and in high school facilities.

The program is intended to supplement the efforts of local districts to provide appropriate educational programs and will not relieve districts of any responsibilities toward gifted students established by statute or regulation.

The bill directs the commissioner and chancellor to examine the regulations previously adopted by their respective departments to identify any impediments to the cooperative efforts envisioned by this bill.

The committee amendments provide that the program should be available to all able students.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1986 session pending technical review. As amended, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
