BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

7 1. Section 4 of P.L.2001, c.246 (C.App.A:9-67) is amended to8 read as follows:

9 4. a. There is established in, but not of, the Department of Law 10 and Public Safety the Domestic Security Preparedness Task Force, 11 which shall provide Statewide coordination and supervision of all 12 activities related to domestic preparedness for a terrorist attack. 13 The task force shall be composed of [nine] 10 members: the 14 Superintendent of State Police or his designee, the Attorney General or his designee, the Adjutant General of Military and Veterans' 15 16 Affairs or his designee, the Commissioner of Transportation or his 17 designee, the Commissioner of Health and Senior Services or his 18 designee, the Coordinator of the Office of Recovery and Victim 19 Assistance, the Commissioner of Banking and Insurance, all of whom shall serve ex officio, and three public members appointed 20 21 by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate. One of 22 the public members shall have, by education or expertise, 23 experience in chemical or biological agents that may be used in acts 24 of terrorism. The public members shall serve for terms of three 25 years and shall be subject to such security screening as may be necessary or appropriate. Of the public members first appointed, 26 27 one shall be appointed for a term of one year, one shall be 28 appointed for a term of two years, and one shall be appointed for a 29 term of three years. The Governor shall appoint a chairperson from 30 among the members of the task force, who shall serve in that 31 position at the pleasure of the Governor. The chairperson shall act 32 as the State's liaison with the federal Homeland Security Council. 33 In the event the Governor shall appoint a public member as 34 chairperson, that appointee shall be accorded cabinet status for the 35 purposes of effectuating the purposes of this act.
