AN ACT concerning the reorganization meeting of county
 committees of political parties and amending R.S.19:5-3.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. R.S.19:5-3 is amended to read as follows:

8 19:5-3. The members of the county committees of political 9 parties shall be elected at the primary for the general election in the 10 manner provided in this Title for the selection of party candidates to 11 be voted for at the general election by voters of a municipality at 12 such intervals as shall be provided in the bylaws of the county 13 committee. The county committee shall consist of one male and 14 one female member from each unit of representation in the county. 15 The male receiving the highest number of votes among the male 16 candidates and the female receiving the highest number of votes 17 among the female candidates shall be declared elected. Members of 18 the county committee shall actually reside in the districts or units 19 which they respectively represent. The county committee shall 20 determine by its bylaws the units into which the county shall be 21 divided for purpose of representation in the county committee.

22 The members of the county committee of each of the political 23 parties shall take office on the first Saturday following their 24 election, on which day the terms of all members of such committees 25 theretofore elected shall terminate. The annual meeting of each 26 county committee shall be held on the first Tuesday following the 27 primary election, except that when such meeting day falls on a legal 28 holiday then the said meeting shall be held on the day following, 29 and when such meeting day falls on the day of a municipal runoff 30 election within the county then said meeting may be held on the day 31 following, at an hour and place to be designated in a notice in 32 writing to be mailed by the chairperson to each member and 33 member-elect. If the annual meeting coincides with a period of religious observance, the meeting ¹[shall] may¹ be held on another 34 35 date, and under no circumstances shall that date occur later than the 36 third Tuesday following the primary election. The members of such 37 committee shall elect some suitable person as chairperson who 38 shall be a resident of such county to hold office until a successor is 39 elected. The chairperson of the outgoing county committee shall 40 transmit, with the notice of the annual meeting, a copy of the 41 constitution and bylaws to any newly elected committee member.

The members shall also elect a vice-chairperson of the opposite sex 1 2 of the chairperson to hold office for 1 year or until a successor is 3 elected and the vice-chairperson shall perform all duties required 4 by law and the constitution and bylaws of such committee. Any 5 person elected or appointed to membership on the county committee pursuant to R.S.19:5-2 may request, in writing and by certified mail 6 7 to the county chairperson, such constitution or bylaws currently in 8 effect. The committee member requesting the constitution or 9 bylaws shall receive the constitution or bylaws within 48 hours of 10 the receipt of the request by the chairperson. The chairperson shall 11 preside at all meetings of the committee and shall perform all duties 12 required by law and the constitution and bylaws of such committee. 13 When a member of a county committee ceases to be a resident of 14 the district or unit from which elected, a vacancy on the county 15 committee shall exist. A member of a county committee of any 16 political party may resign his or her office to the committee of 17 which he or she is a member, and upon acceptance thereof by the 18 committee, a vacancy shall exist. A vacancy in the office of a 19 member of the county committee of any political party, caused by 20 death, resignation, failure to elect, or removal for cause, shall be 21 filled for the unexpired term by the municipal committee of the 22 municipality wherein the vacancy occurs, if there is such 23 committee, and if not, by the remaining members of the county 24 committee of such political party representing the territory in the 25 county in which such vacancy occurs. The chairperson of the 26 outgoing county committee shall provide a copy of the constitution 27 and bylaws to any committee member appointed pursuant to 28 R.S.19:5-2 to fill a vacancy within three business days of the 29 committee member's selection.

The chairperson of the county committee of the several political parties shall, before April 1 in a year in which county committee members are to be elected, certify to the clerk of each municipality in the county the unit of representation in such municipality, together with the enumeration of the election district or districts embraced within such unit.
