**AN ACT** concerning certain fees for civil service examinations and appeals and amending P.L.1992, c.197.

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. Section 1 of P.L.1992, c.197 (C.11A:4-1.1) is amended to read as follows:
- 1. a Except as provided in subsection b. of this section concerning law enforcement officer and firefighter examinations, the commission shall establish a [\$15] \$25 fee for each application for an open competitive or promotional examination and a \$15 fee for each application for an open competitive or promotional examination by a veteran. Persons receiving public assistance benefits pursuant to P.L.1947, c.156 (C.44:8-107 et seq.), P.L.1973, c.256 (C.44:7-85 et seq.), or P.L.1997, c.38 (C.44:10-55 et seq.) shall not be required to pay this fee if they apply for an open competitive examination. Receipts derived from application fees established by this subsection shall be appropriated to the On or after July 1, 2015, and every five years commission. thereafter, the chairperson of the commission shall review the \$25 fee established by this subsection and may modify the fee, provided, however, that the fee, along with the \$15 fee, shall not exceed the cost of developing, procuring, and administering the examination.
  - b. The commission shall establish a fee for each application for an open competitive or promotional examination for a law enforcement officer or firefighter title. The fee shall not exceed the cost of developing, procuring and administering the examination [, including the processing of any appeals or reviews associated with the examination]. Persons receiving public assistance benefits pursuant to P.L.1947, c.156 (C.44:8-107 et seq.), P.L.1973, c.256 (C.44:7-85 et seq.), or P.L.1997, c.38 (C.44:10-55 et seq.) shall not be required to pay this fee if they apply for an open competitive examination. Receipts derived from application fees established by this subsection shall be appropriated to the commission for use in developing, procuring and administering law enforcement officer and firefighter examinations [, including the processing of any appeals or reviews associated with those examinations].
  - c. In addition to the fees established in subsections a. and b. of this section, the commission shall establish a \$15 fee for each application for an open competitive or promotional examination for a position in State service. Persons receiving public assistance

- benefits pursuant to P.L.1947, c.156 (C.44:8-107 et seq.), P.L.1973, c.256 (C.44:7-85 et seq.), or P.L.1997, c.38 (C.44:10-55 et seq.) shall not be required to pay this fee if they apply for an open competitive examination. Receipts derived from the application fee established pursuant to this subsection shall be appropriated annually to the commission for the costs of the displaced workers pool program. The Assembly Budget Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 3010.

The bill increases the fee for each application for a civil service open competitive and promotional examination from \$15 to \$25, with the exception of law enforcement officer and firefighter examinations. The fee for veterans will remain at \$15. Persons receiving public assistance benefits are not required to pay the fee. In addition, this bill requires that the \$25 examination fee for non-public safety examinations be reviewed every five years beginning July 1, 2015 and permits modification of the fee as long as the \$25 fee, along with the \$15 fee for veterans, does not exceed the costs of developing, procuring, and administering the examinations. This bill establishes a separate \$20 fee for each appeal filed concerning discipline or termination actions, adverse actions relating to the examination and appointment process, and lay-offs and demotions. Persons who are receiving public assistance or persons who are veterans would not be required to pay the fee.

## **FISCAL IMPACT**:

According to the Executive Branch, the increase in examination fees from \$15 to \$25 will provide additional revenues of \$360,000 to fund the program and the establishment of a separate appeal fee of \$20 will provide additional revenues of \$80,000 to process appeals.

Without knowing the total cost of the program, the number of applications and appeals filed, and the number of applications and appeals that are filed by persons receiving public assistance, the Office of Legislative Services (OLS) is not able to substantiate the savings estimated to be generated by the bill.

- The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) can **neither concur nor disagree** with the Executive fiscal estimate, given that the Executive Branch has not elaborated on the method and data underlying the assumptions of its projection. Without knowing what assumptions were made with regard to the total current program costs, the number of applications, the number of appeals, and the various fees associated with those applications and appeals, the OLS cannot substantiate the Executive's estimate.
- This bill increases the fee for each application for a civil service open competitive and promotional examination from \$15 to \$25, with the exception of law enforcement officer and firefighter examinations. The bill retains a \$15 fee for each application for an open competitive or promotional exam by a veteran. Persons receiving public assistance benefits are not required to pay the fee.
- According to the Executive Branch, the increase in examination application fees from \$15 to \$25 and the retention of a \$15 examination application fee for veterans will increase by \$360,000 revenues from application fees to offset the cost to develop, procure, and administer civil service examinations. In addition, the Executive Branch estimates that the establishment of a separate appeal fee of \$20 will provide \$80,000 in fee revenue to offset the cost of processing appeals in FY 2011.

## **BILL DESCRIPTION**

Assembly Bill No. 3010 of 2010 increases the fee for each application for a civil service open competitive and promotional examination from \$15 to \$25, with the exception of law enforcement officer and firefighter examinations. In addition, the bill retains a \$15 fee for each application for an open competitive or promotional examination by a veteran. Persons receiving public assistance benefits are not required to pay the fee. This bill requires that the examination fee for non-public safety examinations be reviewed every five years beginning July 1, 2015 and permits modification of the fee as long as the fee does not exceed the costs of developing, procuring, and administering the examinations. This bill establishes a separate \$20 fee for each appeal filed concerning discipline or termination actions, adverse actions relating to the examination and appointment process, and lay-offs and demotions. Veterans and persons who are receiving public assistance are not required to pay the appeal fee.

## **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### EXECUTIVE BRANCH

According to the Executive Branch, the increase in examination fees from \$15 to \$25 and the retention of a \$15 fee for veterans will increase application fee revenue to develop, procure, and administer civil service examinations by \$360,000. In addition, the Executive Branch estimates that the establishment of a separate appeal fee of \$20 will increase fee revenue to process appeals by \$80,000, in FY 2011.

### OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The OLS can neither concur nor disagree with the Executive Branch's fiscal estimate, given that the Executive Branch has not elaborated on the method and data underlying the assumptions of its projection. While basic application and appeals statistics are provided in the Governor's proposed FY 2011 budget, it is not clear if the increase in fees merely reduces the cost of administering examinations or if the increase in fees provides additional revenues to cover the cost of administering examinations. In addition, budget program data does not breakout how many applications and appeals are filed by non-public safety, public safety applicants, veterans, and by persons receiving public assistance. Each of these applicant types pays a different fee. Furthermore, establishing a separate fee for appeals affects the cost of administering the program under current law as compared to administering the program under this bill. Thus, without knowing what assumptions were made with regard to the total current program costs, the number of applications, the number of appeals, and the fees associated with those applications and appeals, the OLS cannot substantiate the Executive's fiscal estimate.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 2140 with committee amendments.

Senate Bill No. 2140 increases the fee for each application for a civil service open competitive and promotional examination from \$15 to \$25, with the exception of law enforcement officer and firefighter examinations. The fee for veterans will remain at \$15. Persons receiving public assistance benefits are not required to pay the fee. In addition, this bill requires that the \$25 examination fee for non-public safety examinations be reviewed every five years beginning July 1, 2015 and permits modification of the fee as long as the \$25 fee, along with the \$15 fee for veterans, does not exceed the costs of developing, procuring, and administering the examinations. This bill establishes a separate \$20 fee for each appeal filed concerning discipline or termination actions, adverse actions relating to the examination and appointment process, and lay-offs and demotions. Persons who are receiving public assistance or persons who are veterans would not be required to pay the fee.

## **COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:**

The committee amendments exempt veterans who apply for competitive or promotional civil service examinations or who file certain appeals from the fee increases imposed by the bill.

## **FISCAL IMPACT**:

This bill increases the fee for each application for a civil service open competitive and promotional examination from \$15 to \$25, with the exception of public safety examinations and requires a review of the examination fee every five years. In addition, this bill establishes a separate \$20 fee for each appeal filed. Persons receiving public assistance are not required to pay the fee. According to the Executive Branch, the increase in examination fees from \$15 to \$25 will provide additional revenues of \$360,000 to fund the program and the establishment of a separate appeal fee of \$20 will provide additional revenues of \$80,000 to process appeals.

The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) notes that the Executive Branch did not provide information regarding the total cost of the program to administer civil service examinations and appeals, therefore, it is not clear if the increase in fees merely reduces the cost of administering the program or if the increase in fees provides additional revenues to cover the cost of the program. Under current law, exam fees may not exceed the cost of administering the program. In addition, the OLS notes that this bill establishes a separate appeals fee of \$20. Current exam fees include all costs to administer examinations, including the cost of appeals. Without knowing the total cost of the program, the number of applications and appeals filed, and the number of applications and appeals that are filed by persons receiving public assistance, the OLS is not able to substantiate the savings estimated to be generated by the bill.
