The Assembly Senior Issues and Community Services Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1983.

This bill would amend the schedule of fees the Secretary of State is authorized to collect pursuant to N.J.S.A. 22A:4-1a. Specifically, the bill would reduce the \$25.00 fee charged by the Secretary for the issuance of certificates for proving a document outside the United States, known as an apostille, to \$5.00 when the certificates are being obtained in connection with an adoption of a child. The fee required to be paid for all other apostilles would remain at \$25.00.

The establishment of this two-tier apostille structure to offer a reduced fee in cases of adoption is particularly necessary in cases of international adoptions because prospective adoptive parents may be required to submit a variety of properly authenticated documents, the costs of which can exceed \$1,000 for a single international adoption.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1983 (1R).

This bill would reduce the fee charged for certain official signature certifications issued in connection with the adoption of a foreign child.

The bill amends the law (N.J.S.A.22A:4-1a) establishing the schedule of fees that the State Treasurer is authorized to collect for various services. One such service is providing certification of any signature on file, including an apostille. An "apostille" is a certificate used for proving a document in certain foreign jurisdictions. The bill would reduce the \$25 fee charged by the State Treasurer for the issuance of these certificates to \$5 when the certificates are being obtained in connection with the adoption of a child. The fee required to be paid for all other apostilles would remain \$25.

The bill includes language redesignating the official authorized to collect the fees for the services enumerated in N.J.S.A.22A:4-1a. This change is needed to reflect in statutory law the changes made by the Governor's Reorganization Plan No. 004-1998, which transferred the duties performed under that section from the Secretary of State to the State Treasurer.

The provisions of this bill are identical to those of Senate Bill No. 651 (1R), which the committee also reports this day.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

As information on the total number of foreign adoptions in the State is not available, the Office of Legislative Services is unable to estimate the potential loss of revenue to the State by reducing the fee for an apostille from \$25.00 to \$5.00 in cases of adoption. The OLS notes, however, that a single international adoption can require the issuance of an apostille for each of several documents.
