An Acr concerning tolls on certain bridges operated by the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission and supplementing Title 32 of the Revised Statutes.

STATEMENT

This bill would allow the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission to fix, charge and collect fees, rentals and tolls on existing bridges under its jurisdiction and control on which tolls were not charged or collected in 1984 and which were financed in part with federal funds *only* if authorized to do so by substantially similar laws being enacted in New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

Governor Thomas H. Kean has signed the following bills:

<u>S-2096</u>, sponsored by State Senator Wayne Dumont, Jr., R-Warren, which authorizes the Governor to enter into a new bi-state agreement with Pennsylvania amending the present enabling compact of the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission.

The amended compact would allow the Commission to operate and maintain the proposed Interstate-78 bridge between Phillipsburg and Easton, Pennsylvania, as a toll facility and to continue to operate and maintain the current I-80 bridge as a toll facility.

A-3730, sponsored by Assemblyman John S. Watson, D-Mercer, which clarifies S-2096 to require that the Commission may only initiate tolls on any of its 13 free bridges if authorized to do so by substantially similar laws enacted in New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

A-955, sponsored by Assemblyman William P. Schuber, R-Bergen, which permits a board of education providing transportation for handicapped students to solicit bids on a per pupil, per vehicle or per mile basis, whichever is least costly. Current law provides only for per mile and per vehicle bids.
