AN ACT concerning monorail transportation, amending P. L. 1983, c. 295, supplementing P. L. 1966, c. 301 (C. 27:1A-1 et seq.), and making an appropriation.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 1 of New Jersey: 2

*1. Section 1 of P. L. 1983, c. 295 is amended to read as follows: 1

1. The Legislature finds and determines that:

a. New Jersey is one of the most densely populated states in the 3 4 nation:

b. New Jersey's highways are overburdened with traffic; and 5

c. The establishment and development of [a Statewide] mono-6

7 rail [system] systems in the State can make a significant contribu-

tion to public transportation and ease highway congestion[; and 8

d. It may be appropriate to establish an authority to fund and 9

10 operate such a system].

EXPLANATION-Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law. Matter printed in italics thus is new matter.

Matter enclosed in asterisks or stars has been adopted as follows:

1 *[1.]* *2.* Section 2 of P. L. 1983, c. 295 is amended to read as 2 follows:

3 2. There is created a commission to be known as the New Jersey Monorail *[Authority Study]* *Legislative* Commission. The 4 commission shall consist of [eight] 13 members, four to be ap-5 pointed from the membership of the Senate by the President 6 thereof for the member's term of office, not more than two of whom 7 shall be from the same political party [, and]; four to be appointed 8 from the membership of the General Assembly by the Speaker 9 thereof for the member's term of office, not more than two of whom 10shall be from the same political party; the Commissioner of Trans-11 portation ex officio, or his designee; the Executive Director of the 12New Jersey Transit Corporation ex officio, or his designee; the 13 Executive Director of the Port Authority of New York and New 14 Jersey ex officio, or his designee; the "[Executive Director]" 15 *President* of the Delaware River Port Authority ex officio, or his 16 designee; and the Executive Directors of the *New Jersey* Turn-17 18 pike, Highway, and Expressway Authorities ex officio or their designees who shall serve one-year rotating terms in the following 19 20order: New Jersey Turnpike Authority, New Jersey Highway Authority, and New Jersey Expressway Authority. *The toll-road 21authorities not represented in a particular year by having a mem-2223 ber on the commission shall be kept apprised of the commission's activities, and shall have the opportunity for input.* 24

*3. Section 3 of P. L. 1983, c. 295 is amended to read as follows:
3. The commission shall organize as soon as may be practicable
after the appointment of its members and shall select a chairman
from among its *legislative* members and a secretary who need not
be a member of the commission.*-

[2.] *4.* Section 4 of P. L. 1983, c. 295 is amended to read as
 follows:

 $2_{\rm A}$ 4. It shall be the duty of the commission to study "[and evaluate 3 the practicability and feasibility of establishing a New Jersey 4 Monorail Authority to own and operate a Statewide monorail system]* *the various means by which monorail systems may be 5 developed in the State*, to work with the Department of Trans-6 portation and other public agencies to maximize the benefits of 7 monorail technology, and to *[exercise oversight for]* *monitor* 8 all monorail projects. 9

1 *[3.]* *5.* Section 6 of P. L. 1983, c. 295 is amended to read as 1A follows:

STATEMENT

This bill amends P. L. 1983, c. 295 which established the New Jersey Monorail Authority Study Commission, and assigns exclusive responsibility for the development of monorail systems to the Department of Transportation.

Membership of the commission is expanded to include representatives of public agencies with transportation interests. The bill provides that the commission will work with the Department of Transportation in promoting monorail technology. It also includes a definition of "monorail" and makes an additional appropriation to the commission.

Within the Department of Transportation, the Assistant Commissioner for Transportation Services and Planning, at the direction of the Commissioner of Transportation and in cooperation with other State agencies and interested private parties, shall be the exclusive coordinator of plans and policies for the utilization of monorail systems. Any authorized monorail system will be exempt from local zoning and planning ordinances, and the commission will exercise oversight for all monorail projects.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: DECEMBER 5, 1985

This bill, as amended by the committee, amends P. L. 1983, c. 295 which created the New Jersey Monorail Authority Study Commission. The name of the commission is changed to the New Jersey Monorail Legislative Commission and its membership is expanded from eight to 13 members. The members added are the Commissioner of Transportation, the Executive Directors of the New Jersey Transit Corporation and the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, and the President of the Delaware River Port Authority. The Executive Directors of the New Jersey Turnpike, Highway and Expressway Authorities are also added and are to serve one-year rotating terms. These various officials may also designate persons to represent them. The toll-road authorities not represented in a particular year by having a member on the commission shall be kept apprised of the commission's activities, and shall have the opportunity for input. The chairman of the commission shall be a legislative member.

The expanded commission, limited to a life of five years, is authorized to study the various means by which monorail systems may be developed in the State, to work with the Department of Transportation and other public agencies to maximize the benefits of monorail technology, and to monitor all monorail projects.

The Department of Transportation is assigned the exclusive responsibility for assisting in the development of monorail systems except where otherwise provided by law. The Commissioner of Transportation shall be the exclusive coordinator of plans and policies for the utilization of monorail systems under the jurisdiction of the department. Except as otherwise provided by law, as in the case of New Jersey Transit and the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, the commissioner shall approve monorail projects, set fares and establish safety standards.

The bill appropriates \$25,000.00 to the commission to effectuate the purposes of the bill.

The committee deleted the provisions of the bill providing for (1) oversight power by the commission, (2) assisting monorail developers, (3) exemptions from local zoning and planning ordinances, and (4) granting independent powers to the Assistant Commissioner for Transportation Services and Planning. In addition, the committee reduced the amount of the appropriations from \$30,000.00 to \$25,000.00 and provided for the expiration of the commission in five years, unless extended by law.

This bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 3250, as amended by the committee.
