This bill concerns Korean and Vietnam war veterans who are being tested for, or appointed or elected to, any office or position in State government or a political subdivision thereof which has a maximum age requirement. It allows the veteran to subtract the period of military service from his actual age to meet any age requirement.

Governor Thomas H. Kean yesterday signed legislation to enable veterans of the Korean Conflict and the Vietnam War to qualify for public office and meet the maximum age limit on the same conditions as veterans of World War I and II.

The bill, S-1040, was sponsored by Senator Joseph Bubba, R-Passaic.

The bill would permit veterans of the conflicts in Korea and Vietnam, when qualifying for any public office which includes a maximum age limit, to meet that requirement if their actual age, less their period of service, would meet the requirement.

Prior to signing the legislation, only veterans of World War I and II could take advantage of the provision.

The Governor also signed the following bills:

#

AJR-50, sponsored by Assemblywoman Marlene Ford, D-Ocean, which designated May 25, 1984 as "Missing Children's Day." The resolution notes that more than 1.8 million children in the United States are missing for a period of at least 24 hours each year, and that some 50,000 are still missing at the end of each year. It cites the need to increase public awareness on the problem and improve law enforcement techniques in meeting the problem.

S-1427, sponsored by State Senator Thomas F. Cowan, D-Hudson, which authorizes the Department of Higher Education to receive additional Federal of \$1,379,800. The money comes through supplemental funds Administrative Cost Allowance for the Federal Guaranty Student Loan Program.
