INTRODUCED DECEMBER 6, 1984

A SUPPLEMENT to "An act to place limits on expenditures by counties and municipalities and supplementing Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes," approved August 18, 1976 (P. L. 1976, c. 68; C. 40A:4-45.1 et seq.).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Whenever a municipality determines to provide garbage col-  
2 lection for its residents in the local budget year immediately suc-  
3 ceeding the year in which the State ordered the closure of its  
4 municipal landfill which theretofore had been available to its resi-  
5 dents for garbage disposal and the amount of monies required in  
6 the municipal budget to fund the garbage collection services ex-  
7 ceeds the budget appropriation made for the landfill operation, in  
8 the last year of its operation, the municipality shall add the dif-  
9 ference between the amount required to fund the garbage collection  
10 services in the first year in which they are provided and the amount  
11 last appropriated for the municipal landfill operation to the final  
12 appropriations for the current budget year upon which its permis-  
13 sible expenditures are calculated.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall apply to the  
2 1984 local budget year and each local budget year thereafter.

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STATEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to provide a "cap" adjustment for municipalities which, in response to an ordered closing of an existing municipal landfill, decide to provide garbage collection services for their residents.

BILLS SIGNED  
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DECEMBER 31, 1984

A-2370, sponsored by Assemblyman Jimmy Zangari, D-Essex, which permits police officers to wear, without local department authorization, medals awarded by a service organization.

The bill was conditionally vetoed by the Governor to apply only to medals awarded by police-oriented service organizations.

A-815, sponsored by Assemblyman Thomas W. Long, D-Union, which provides counties with a first year budget cap exemption for increased costs associated with the addition of new beds to a county nursing home. The bill permits the county to expend the funds necessary for new beds for the year in which they first occur.

A-2491, sponsored by Assemblyman Garabed Haytaian, R-Warren, which extends until December 31, 1986, an exemption to the cap law for money expended as matching funds for any State or Federal aid program, and any amounts they receive from State, Federal or other sources as reimbursement of a local expense.

A-2893, sponsored by Assemblyman Joseph D. Patero, D-Somerset, which provides a one-year cap adjustment for municipalities that begin providing garbage collection service for residents in response to a State-ordered closure of their municipal landfill.

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
