2. This act shall take effect January 1, 1983.

STATEMENT

With the adoption of the "Uniform Nonpartisan Elections Law," P. L. 1981, c. 379 (C. 40:45-5 et seq.), the commissioners elected to office under the "commission form of government law," or "Walsh Act" (R. S. 40:70-1 et seq.) are to begin their terms of office July 1, 3 weeks after their election.

The purpose of this bill is to amend R. S. 40:75–2 in order to provide that the commissioners begin their terms of office 1 week after their election.

Senate Bill No. 1441 OCR amends R. S. 40:75–1, R. S. 40:75–2, and section 13 of P. L. 1981, c. 379 to provide that the commissioners elected to the governing body of a municipality which has adopted a "commission form of government" pursuant to the provisions of the "Walsh Act" (R. S. 40:75–1 et seq.) shall begin their terms of office on the third Tuesday in May.

Under current law (P. L. 1981, c. 379; C. 40:45-5 et seq.), the commissioners begin their terms of office on July 1.

Senate Bill No. 1441 would provide that commissioners elected to office under the "commission form of government law" (Walsh Act) (R. S. 40:70-1 et seq.) shall take office on the third Tuesday in May, unlike governing body members in all other nonpartisan forms of government who take office on July 1 under the "Uniform Nonpartisan Elections Law," P. L. 1981, c. 379 (C. 40:45-5 et seq.).

The Senate committee amendments amend two additional sections of law to conform them with the provisions of the bill. R. S. 40:75–1 relates to commissioners first elected in a municipality having adopted the commission form of government. Section 13 of P. L. 1981, c. 379 (C. 40:45–18) is the provision of the "Uniform Nonpartisan Elections Law," to which the bill provides an exception.
