INTRODUCED NOVEMBER 15, 1982

By Assemblymen FELICE, LITTELL, KERN and HAYTAIAN

An Act to amend the "Carnival-Amusements Rides Safety Act," approved May 29, 1975 (P. L. 1975, c. 105).

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 2 of P. L. 1975, c. 105 (C. 5:3-32) is amended to 2 read as follows:

3 2. As used in this act, except where a different meaning is clearly4 implied by the context:

a. "Carnival" or "amusement ride" means any mechanical device 5 or devices including water slides exceeding 15 feet in height which 6 carry or convey passengers along, around, or over a fixed or re-7 stricted route or course for the purpose of giving its passengers 8 amusement, pleasure, thrills or excitement; and any passenger or 9 gravity propelled ride when located in an amusement area or park 10in which there are other rides covered by P. L. 1975, c. 105 11(C. 5:3-31 et seq.); provided, however, that this shall not include 12locomotives weighing more than seven tons, operating on a track 1314the length of which is one-half mile or greater, the gauge of which is three feet or greater, and the weight of which is at least 60 15pounds per yard. Any facility exempted pursuant to this subsec-16tion shall be under the jurisdiction of the Department of Trans-17portation for the purpose of safety inspection. 18

b. "Owner" means a person who owns, leases, controls, or manages the operations of a carnival or amusement ride, including the
State or any of its subdivisions;

in or directly controlling the operations of a carnival or amusement

d. "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Labor [and In-dustry]; and

e. "Department" means the State Department of Labor [and28 Industry]; and

f. "Advisory board" means the Advisory Board on Carnival-30 Amusement Ride Safety.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

### DATED: JANUARY 31, 1983

This bill amends the "Carnival-Amusements Rides Safety Act," including within the definition of carnival or amusement ride any water slide exceeding 15 feet in height and any passenger or gravity propelled ride when the ride is located in an amusement area or park which contains other rides subject to the act.

This bill is intended to clarify the jurisdiction of the Division of Workplace Standards in the Department of Labor over amusement rides which are not properly defined as "mechanical devices," but which are operated by other means.

When the "Carnival-Amusements Rides Safety Act" was passed in 1975, it defined rides subject to the act (and thus subject to inspection) as those rides which were mechanically operated—i.e., utilizing an outside power source. The Department of Labor, however, assumed jurisdiction over amusement park rides which were gravity propelled or operated by means which were other than mechanical; they promulgated regulations covering these other types of rides and have consistently inspected them. A recent accident involving one of these non-mechanically driven rides has called into question the department's actual jurisdiction over this type of ride. This bill, by amending the definition of "carnival or amusement ride," clarifies the department's jurisdiction.

# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### DATED: MARCH 7, 1983

This bill amends the definition of "carnival" or "amusement ride" in the "Carnival-Amusements Rides Safety Act to include any water slide exceeding 15 feet in height and any passenger or gravity propelled ride when the ride is located in an amusement area or park which has other rides subject to the act.

The act currently defines a carnival or amusement ride as a ride which is mechanically operated with an outside power source.

However, the Department of Labor has assumed jurisdiction over amusement park rides which are gravity propelled or operated by means which are other than mechanical; has promulgated regulations covering these types of ride; and has annually inspected such rides.

A recent accident involving a nonmechanical, water ride raised a question as to the department's jurisdiction over this type of ride. This bill clarifies the department's jurisdiction in this regard.

Governor Thomas H. Kean has signed legislation creating the Hackensack Meadowlands Food Distribution Center Commission. The bill, <u>S-1908</u>, was sponsored by State Senator Frank X. Graves, D-Passaic, and was the subject of a conditional veto by the Governor.

Under amendments proposed by the Governor, authority to undertake constuction and operation of a regional food distribution center is placed in the hands of the commission, which will consist of representatives from the Hackensack Meadowlands Development Commission, the municipalities in which the food center would be located, members of the public, and members of the Governor's cabinet.

The Governor has also signed the following bills:

<u>A-2072</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman Nicholas Felice, R-Bergen, which authorizes the Department of Labor to bring water slide rides and passenger-propelled rides over a fixed water course under the provisions of the Carnival-Amusement Rides Safety Act.

<u>S-1563</u>, sponsored by State Senator Edward T. O'Connor Jr., D-Hudson, which requires towing services contracted to a public or private entity such as State, local or county government and certain private authorities and commissions, to remove debris when towing vehicles from the road. The bill does not require the tow operator to remove toxic or hazardous materials which he is not equipped to handle.

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
