# ASSEMBLY, No. 3916 STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED SEPTEMBER 6, 1983

By Assemblymen VAN WAGNER and VILLANE

AN ACT concerning lobsters and amending R. S. 23:5-9 and P. L. 1941, c. 211.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. R. S. 23:5-9 is amended to read as follows:

2 23:5-9.a. No person shall take from the salt waters of this State by any means, import, export, have in his possession, buy, sell or 3 offer to buy or sell, any lobster of the genus Homarus americanus, 4 which [in length shall be less than three and one-eighth inches] 5 when measured from the rear end of the eye socket along a line 6 parallel to the center line of the body shell to the rear end of the 7 body shell, or any spawning lobster] is less than: two and three-8 quarters inches in length, from the effective date of this amendatory 9 act through December 31, 1983; two and seven-eighths inches in 10 length, from January 1, 1984 through December 31, 1984; three 11 inches in length, from January 1, 1985 through December 31, 1985; 12three and one-eighth inches in length, from January 1, 1986 through 1314December 31, 1986; three and three-sixteenths inches in length, from January 1, 1987 and every year thereafter. 15b. No person shall take from the salt waters of this State by any 16

means, import, export, have in his possession, buy, sell or offer to
buy or sell, any lobster of the genus Homarus americanus, which
is damaged or mutilated to the extent that its length cannot be
determined under subsection a. of this section; except that this
subsection shall not apply to: (1) any detached lobster claws, if
these are together with detached lobster tails of the type exempted
EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

23under subparagraph (2) of this subsection and the number of these  $\mathbf{24}$ detached lobster claws does not exceed twice the number of these 25detached lobster tails; or (2) any detached lobster tail which is 26composed of six abdominal segments and the fan of the tail, if the 27sixth abdominal segment, when measured along its dorsal center line with the tail flexed, is no less than: seven-eighths inch in 28length, from the effective date of this act through December 31, 2930 1983; twenty-nine-thirty-seconds inch in length, from January 1, 1984 through December 31, 1984; fifteen-sixteenths inch in length, 31from January 1, 1985 through December 31, 1985; one inch in 3233 length, from January 1, 1986 through December 31, 1986; one and one-sixteenths inches in length, from January 1, 1987 and every 3435year thereafter.

c. No person shall take from the salt waters of this State by any
means, import, export, have in his possession, buy, sell or offer to
buy or sell, any lobster of the genus Homarus americanus, with
eggs attached, or from which the eggs have been removed.

d. This section shall not apply to the taking or possession of
lobsters bearing a tag that has been issued or affixed by the Department of Environmental Protection or by any other state or
federal agency with which the department cooperates in a research
project.

1 2. Section 2 of P. L. 1941, c. 211 (C. 23:5-24.2) is amended to 2 read as follows:

2. A person intending to take fish with a net in the waters afore-3 said shall, except as hereinafter provided, apply to the commis-4 sioner for a license therefor, and the commissioner upon receipt  $\mathbf{5}$ of the application and the fee hereinafter prescribed may in his 6 7 descretion issue licenses for the taking of fish with nets as follows: (a) Haul seines, the mesh of which shall not be smaller than two 8 and three-quarter inches stretched, and not to exceed 70 fathoms 9 10in length, whether singly or attached, for all species, except those

11 specifically protected. November 1 to April 30. Fee, \$25.00.

(b) Fykes, the length of which including leaders, shall not exceed 30 fathoms and no part of net or leaders to be larger than
three inches stretched mesh, for all species, except those specifically
protected. November 1 to April 30. Fee, \$30.00.

(c) Special fyke for flounder only, the length of the net not to
exceed 30 fathoms and the mesh of which shall not be less than
four inches stretched. October 1 to April 30. Fee, \$4.00.

(d) Miniature fykes or pots for the taking of catfish, suckers
and eels, the same not to exceed 16 inches in diameter in the marine
waters of this State except the Delaware bay. March 15 to December 15. Fee, \$1.00 per pot or fyke.

(e) Run around net the smallest mesh of which shall be two and
three-quarter inches stretched and the length of which net shall
not exceed 200 fathoms, for all species, except those specifically
protected. March 15 to December 15. Fee, \$20.00. This net shall
be used in the Atlantic ocean and the Delaware bay and its tributaries only. The limit shall be one run around net per boat.

(f) Shad nets, either drifting, staked or anchored, the smallest mesh of which shall be five inches stretched, for all species, except those specifically protected. February 1 to May 15. Fee, \$20.00. These nets shall be used in the Atlantic ocean and the Delaware bay and its tributaries. Staked or anchored nets may be used in Raritan bay and Sandy Hook bay.

(g) Bait seines, over 50 feet long and not exceeding 150 feet.Fee, \$3.00.

(h) Bait seines, not more than 50 feet long and cast nets, not more
than 20 feet in diameter, may be used without application for or
granting of license.

40 (i) Dip nets, not to exceed 24 inches in diameter, may be used
41 for the taking of herring for live bait without application for or
42 granting of license.

43(j) Drifting gill net, the smallest mesh of which shall be two and three-quarter inches stretched and the length of which net shall 44 not exceed 200 fathoms and staked and anchored gill nets, the 4546 smallest mesh of which shall be two and three-quarter inches stretched and the length of which shall not exceed 30 fathoms, for 47 all species, except shad and those specifically protected. Fee, 48 \$20.00 for the drifting gill net and \$3.00 for the staked or anchored 49 50 gill net. These nets shall be used in the Atlantic ocean and the Delaware bay and its tributaries only. March 1 to December 15 51for the Atlantic ocean and Delaware bay. March 1 to May 15 and 52July 15 to December 15 for the tributaries of the Delaware bay. 53

(k) Pound net, the smallest mesh of which shall be two inches
stretched for all species except those specifically protected. February 15 to May 15. Fee, \$100.00. These nets shall be used in the
Delaware bay only, except as otherwise provided by law.

(1) Wire pound net which does not extend into the Delaware
bay more than 300 feet from the mean low water mark or 300 feet
from the outside of the flats which fall bare at low water, which
may be set and used in the Delaware bay only. March 1 to December 31. Fee, \$25.00.

63 (m) Parallel nets, the mesh of which shall not be smaller than64 three and one-half inches stretched. September 1 to May 31.

65 (n) Lobster or fish pots, for the taking of all species except

66 those specifically protected, shall be used in the Atlantic ocean,

67 Delaware bay, Raritan bay and Sandy Hook bay only and shall be

68 marked for identification in the manner prescribed by the com-

69 missioner. The commissioner may require that lobster or fish pots

70 shall be designed to include escape vents.

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### DATED: SEPTEMBER 15, 1983

Senate Bill No. 3572 imposes restrictions on taking, importing, buying or selling of lobsters in New Jersey. Specifically, this bill provides that between 1983 and 1987 the minimum size for taking lobsters shall be increased from  $2\frac{3}{4}$  inches to  $3\frac{3}{16}$  inches. This bill would also provide that damaged lobsters may not be taken if their length cannot be determined, with certain exceptions. This bill also prohibits the taking of lobsters with eggs attached, and further provides that lobster pots shall be used only in the Atlantic ocean, Delaware bay, Raritan bay, and Sandy Hook bay.
