#### STATEMENT

This bill amends N. J. S. 18A:39-3 to allow a board of education to enter into a contract for the transportation of pupils to and from school without public bidding if the contract cost is \$4,500.00 or less. The current law requires that a contract in excess of \$2,500.00 be subject to formal bidding requirements. The bill would also allow a board of education to extend an existing contract, if the contract cost of the extended contract does not exceed the contract cost of the last contract by more than 30%. In addition, the bill amends N. J. S. 18A:39-2 to provide that multiyear transportation contracts may provide for an increase not to exceed 71/2% annually of the original yearly contract cost beginning with the second year of the contract. The current law provides that the contract cost of an extended contract may not exceed 20% of the original contract cost and that multiyear contracts may provide for an annual increase of 5% of the original yearly contract beginning with the second year of the contract.

The \$4,500.00 limit is consistent with recent amendments to the "Local Public Contracts Law" (C. 40A:11-1 et seq.) and the "Public Schools Contracts Law" (C. 18A:18A-1 et seq.) which allow counties, municipalities and school districts to enter contracts without formal bidding, if the contract cost is \$4,500.00 or less.

The Assembly Education Committee favorably reports this bill and endorses the Statement of the Senate Education Committee which is as follows:

#### Provisions:

 $B \rightarrow 1$ 

This bill would allow a board of education to enter into a contract for pupil transportation without public bidding if the cost of the contract is \$4,500.00 or less. It also allows a board of education to extend an existing contract if the cost of the extension is not more than 30% greater than that contract. Further, it provides that a multiyear contract may not increase more than  $7\frac{1}{2}\%$  annually.

#### BACKGROUND:

Under current law, a contract extension may not exceed 20% of the original contract cost, and multiyear contracts may provide for an annual increase of 5% of the original contract.

Also, the current law requires that a contract in excess of \$2,500.00 must be subject to formal bidding requirements.

The \$4,500.00 limit is consistent with recent amendments to the "Local Public Contracts Law" (C. 40A:11-1 et seq.) and the "Public Schools Contracts Law" (C. 18A:18A-1 et seq.) which allow counties, municipalities and school districts to enter contracts without formal bidding, if the contract cost is \$4,500.00 or less.

#### COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

The committee has amended this bill to provide that when a new student is assigned to a bus route, the district can add that student even if this would result in an increase of more than 30%. This represents an emergency situation and would be for one year only. After that the contract would have to be rebid. The county superintendent of schools would have to approve the arrangement.
