1 **AN ACT** concerning emergency evacuation, supplementing chapter 9 of Appendix A, and amending P.L.1964, c.64.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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1. (New section) a. For the purposes of this act:

"Domestic companion animal" means ²[a dog, cat, bird, fish or]² any animal commonly referred to as a pet ²[¹which does not constitute a health or safety hazard and ¹]² that ¹[has been] was ¹ bought, bred, raised or otherwise acquired, in accordance with local ordinances and State and federal law ¹, ¹ for the primary purpose of providing companionship ²to the owner ², rather than for ²[an] business or ² agricultural ²[purpose] purposes. b. In the event that a state of emergency has been declared and an evacuation of any region of the State is in progress, the owner of a domestic companion animal shall be permitted to board any public transportation or public transportation service with the domestic companion animal so long as that animal is under the owner's control by use of a leash or tether, or is properly confined in an appropriate container or by other suitable means ², provided that such boarding is authorized by and consistent with the provisions of the State Emergency Operations Plan developed pursuant to paragraph (1) of subsection a. of section 18 of P.L.1989, c.222 (C.App.A.:9-43.1) pertaining to the needs of animals and individuals with an animal under their care². The provisions of this act shall only apply to the owners of domestic companion animals who are evacuating from a region of the State affected by the emergency or local disaster emergency as defined in section 3 of P.L.1953, c. 438 (C.App.A:9-33.1). ²A domestic companion animal

- (6) [No] Except as provided under section 1 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill), no person shall enter any car or other rolling stock, area, building or appurtenance of the Hudson Tubes or Hudson Tubes extensions with any animal, except an animal properly confined in an appropriate container or a guide dog properly harnessed and muzzled, accompanying a blind person carrying a certificate of identification issued by a guide dog school.
- (7) No person shall get on any car or other rolling stock of the Hudson Tubes or Hudson Tubes extensions while it is in motion for the purpose of obtaining transportation thereon as a passenger nor shall any person willfully obstruct, hinder or delay the passage of any such car or rolling stock. No person not authorized by PATH shall walk upon or along any right-of-way or related trackage of the Hudson Tubes or Hudson Tubes extensions.

The Assembly Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 3445.

This bill, as amended, allows pet owners to board public transportation with any pet in the event that a state of emergency has been declared and an evacuation is in progress. The bill, as amended, characterizes the term "pet" as a "domestic companion animal" which:

- 1) is defined as a dog, cat, bird, fish or any animal commonly referred to as a pet that has been bought, bred, raised or otherwise acquired for the primary purpose of providing companionship, rather than for agricultural purposes; and
 - 2) does not constitute a health or safety hazard.

The bill, as amended, permits the pet owner and the pet to board public transportation so long as the animal is under the owner's control by use of a leash or tether or is properly confined in an appropriate container or by other suitable means. The bill, as amended, requires all passengers to be provided seating before a domestic companion animal is placed in a seat. Finally, the bill, as amended, provides that section 2 of the bill would not take effect until the State of New York enacts substantially similar legislation.

The bill, as amended, is identical to Senate Bill No. 1804 (1R) as it was reported from the Senate Law and Public Safety Committee on November 19, 2012, with amendments.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee amendments:

- 1) specify that the domestic companion animal must not constitute a health or safety hazard;
- 2) require all passengers to be provided seating before a domestic companion animal is placed in a seat;

- 3) revise the effective date of section 2 of the bill to reflect the need for the State of New York to enact substantially similar legislation; and
 - 4) make a technical corrections.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 3445 (First Reprint)

To the General Assembly:

Pursuant to Article V, Section I, Paragraph 14 of the New Jersey Constitution, I am returning Assembly Bill No. 3445 (First Reprint) with my recommendations for reconsideration.

This bill provides that a pet owner may board public transportation with their pet when a state of emergency has been declared and an evacuation is in progress, provided that the pet does not constitute a health or safety hazard. The bill requires that the animal be under the owner's control by use of a leash or tether, or properly confined in an appropriate container or by other suitable means.

Pets are important to many families, and protecting pets during a state of emergency is a laudable goal. Current State and local emergency evacuation plans, however, already are required to address the needs of animals and, therefore, the evacuation of pets via public transportation should be consistent with those plans. Also, although the bill indicates that an animal should not be permitted to board public transportation if the animal causes a health or safety hazard, the bill does not establish a standard for refusing boarding. Finally, the bill should make clear that passengers with service animals shall be given priority seating in accordance with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990.

Therefore, I herewith return Assembly Bill No. 3445 (First Reprint) and recommend that it be amended as follows:

Page 2, Section 1, Lines 9-10: Delete "which does not constitute a health or safety

hazard"

Page 2, Section 1, Line 13:

Delete "an" and insert "business or"

Page 2, Section 1, Line 13:

Delete "purpose" and insert "purposes. Domestic companion animal does not include livestock as defined in N.J.A.C. 2:2-1.1"

Page 2, Section 1, Line 24:

After "means" insert ", provided that such boarding is authorized by and consistent with the provisions of the State of Emergency Operation Plans developed pursuant to paragraph (1) of subsection a. of section 18 of P.L.1989, c.222 (C.App.A.:9-43.1) pertaining to the needs of animals and individuals with an animal under their care"

Page 2, Section 1, Line 28:

After "(C.App.A:9-33.1)." insert "A domestic companion animal may be refused permission to board any public transportation or public transportation or public transportation service, even if the animal is under the owner's control or properly confined in accordance with this subsection if there is reasonable cause to believe that, due to attendant circumstances, permitting the animal to board would pose a health or safety hazard.

c. All passengers with service animals shall be given priority seating on all means of transportation regulated by this act in accordance with the federal "Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990" (42 U.S.C. s.12101 et seq.). For the purposes of this act, service animal shall have the same meaning as set forth in the federal "Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990" (42 U.S.C. s.12101 et seq.) and any regulations under the act."

The Senate Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 1804.

As amended and reported by the committee, this bill allows pet owners to board public transportation with a pet in the event that a state of emergency has been declared and an evacuation is in progress.

The bill characterizes the term "pet" as a "domestic companion animal" which is defined as a dog, cat, bird, fish, or any animal commonly referred to as a pet that has been bought, bred, raised, or otherwise acquired for the primary purpose of providing companionship, rather than for agricultural purposes.

Under the provisions of this bill a pet owner is permitted to board public transportation with a pet as long as the animal is under the owner's control by use of a leash or tether, or is properly confined in an appropriate container, or by other suitable means.

The committee amended this bill to change the definition of a "domestic companion animal" to include the requirement that the animal does not constitute a health or safety hazard. The bill was also amended by the committee to clarify that passengers on public transportation must be provided seating before a domestic companion animal may be placed in a seat.

Finally, the committee amended the bill to make a technical correction to reflect the correct name of the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey and to make a technical correction to the operative date of the section concerning the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey.
