AN ACT concerning special Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates and supplementing chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes.

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**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

The Assembly Transportation and Independent Authorities Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 1993.

As amended and reported, this bill authorizes an Alpha Kappa Alpha license plate. The design of the license plate would be chosen by the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission in consultation with the North Atlantic Region Alpha Kappa Alpha Chapter.

In addition to all fees otherwise required by law for the registration of a motor vehicle there is an application fee of \$50 and an annual renewal fee of \$10 for these special plates. The additional fees, after the deduction of the cost of producing and publicizing the plates, will be deposited into a special non-lapsing fund known as the "Alpha Kappa Alpha License Plate Fund." The proceeds of the fund are to be annually appropriated to the Alpha Kappa Alpha Educational Advancement Foundation, Inc.

The chief administrator is required to annually certify the average cost per license plate in producing, issuing, and publicizing the Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates. If the average cost exceeds \$50 for two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the license plate program.

As amended, the bill provides that no State or other public funds may be used by the commission for the initial cost of producing issuing, and publicizing the availability of Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates or any computer programming changes which may be necessary to implement the Alpha Kappa Alpha license plate program.

The bill also requires that the North Atlantic Region Alpha Kappa Alpha Chapter or other individual or entity designated by the chapter, contribute monies in an amount to be determined by the chief administrator, not to exceed a total of \$25,000, to be used to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission for producing issuing, and publicizing the availability of Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates, and any computer programming which may be necessary to implement the program.

The bill prohibits the commission from designing, producing, issuing, or publicizing the availability of Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates, or making any necessary programming changes, until: (1) the North Atlantic Region Alpha Kappa Alpha Chapter, or its designee, has provided the commission with the money necessary to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission in establishing the Alpha Kappa Alpha license plate program; and (2) the North Atlantic Region Alpha Kappa Alpha Chapter, or its designee, has provided the commission with a minimum of 500 completed applications for Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates, upon the availability for purchase of those plates.

The chief administrator is responsible for publicizing the availability of the license plates on the commission's website. The North Atlantic Region Alpha Kappa Alpha Chapter or any individual or entity designated by the chapter, may also publicize the availability of Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates in any manner the board deems appropriate.

The provisions of the bill remain inoperative until the appropriate applications and fees required to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission are provided by the North Atlantic Region Alpha Kappa Alpha Chapter, and the bill expires after 12 months if sufficient applications and fees to offset the initial costs are not received.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2014-2015 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.

#### **COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS**

The committee amended the bill to clearly establish the Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates as dedicated cause plates rather than specialty plates and to prohibit any State or other public funds from being used by the commission for the initial cost of producing, issuing, and publicizing the availability of Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates, or any computer programming changes which may be necessary to implement the Alpha Kappa Alpha license plate program.

The changes made to effectuate this purpose include additional fees to be remitted to the commission, the requirement that 500 completed applications be collected by the board before the launch of the program, the establishment of a fund for the Alpha Kappa Alpha license plate application and renewal fees in excess of commission costs, and the inclusion of language that allows the bill's provisions to expire if the funds to offset commission costs are not received within 12 months.

- Alpha Kappa Alpha is required to provide to MVC up to \$25,000 and 500 applicants before
  plates begin production to ensure that the MVC experiences no costs in the design and initial
  production of plates. The MVC is also permitted to discontinue the program if the average
  cost of a plate exceeds the \$50 per plate application fee once the program has begun,
  guaranteeing that the State will experience no costs.
- The Chief Administrator of the MVC is permitted to set the initial fee at any amount up to \$25,000. Therefore, the initial fee should equal the initial cost to MVC, resulting in no initial fiscal impact.
- While the MVC is able to terminate the program if costs exceed \$50 per plate, the MVC could realize profits in future years if the MVC experiences costs below \$50 per plate.

#### **BILL DESCRIPTION**

Assembly Bill No. 1993 (1R) of 2014 authorizes a special Alpha Kappa Alpha license plate. The design of the license plate is to be chosen by the chief administrator of the MVC in consultation with the North Atlantic Region Alpha Kappa Alpha Chapter.



In addition to all other fees otherwise required by law for the registration of a motor vehicle, there is an application fee of \$50 for these plates. The chief administrator is required to annually certify the average cost per license plate in producing, issuing, and publicizing the Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates. If the average cost exceeds \$50 for two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the license plate program.

The bill provides that no State or other public funds may be used by the MVC for the initial cost of producing, issuing, and publicizing the availability of Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates or any computer programming changes which may be necessary to implement the Alpha Kappa Alpha license plate program.

The bill also requires that Alpha Kappa Alpha, or other individual or entity designated by Alpha Kappa Alpha, contribute monies in an amount to be determined by the chief administrator, not to exceed \$25,000, to be used to offset the initial costs incurred by the MVC for producing, issuing, and publicizing the availability of Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates, and any computer programming which may be necessary to implement the program.

The bill prohibits the MVC from designing, producing, issuing, or publicizing the availability of Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates, or making any necessary programming changes, until: (1) Alpha Kappa Alpha, or its designee, has provided the MVC with the money necessary to offset the initial costs incurred by the MVC in establishing the Alpha Kappa Alpha license plate program; and (2) Alpha Kappa Alpha, or its designee, has provided the MVC with a minimum of 500 completed applications for Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates.

The chief administrator is responsible for publicizing the availability of the license plates on the MVC's website. Alpha Kappa Alpha, or any individual or entity designated by Alpha Kappa Alpha, may also publicize the availability of Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates in any manner Alpha Kappa Alpha deems appropriate.

The provisions of the bill remain inoperative until the appropriate applications and fees required to offset the initial costs incurred by the MVC are provided by Alpha Kappa Alpha, and the bill expires after 12 months if sufficient applications and fees are not received.

## FISCAL ANALYSIS

### **EXECUTIVE BRANCH**

None received.

## OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The Office of Legislative Services finds that Assembly Bill No. 1993 (1R) of 2014 will have no net fiscal impact on the State of New Jersey. Before the MVC begins designing and producing the plates, Alpha Kappa Alpha is required to provide up to \$25,000 in funds as determined by the chief administrator and to pre-register 500 applicants for the plates. This requirement ensures that the MVC will be able to recover its initial costs in producing the plates, and if enough funds are not provided, the MVC will not be required to produce the plates.

If these requirements are met and production of the plates begins, the MVC may still discontinue the program if the cost of plate production exceeds \$50 per plate, which is the initial fee that the MVC collects for each plate. This ensures that the MVC will not experience any net costs in the administration of this license plate program, and if the MVC is able to produce the

plates at a cost below \$50 per plate, it is possible that the MVC could realize positive net revenues.

The overall impact of this legislation is likely cost-neutral to the MVC, realizing no net costs or revenues. The chief administrator is likely to set the initial fee at an amount equal to the expected initial costs resulting in no initial fiscal impact. In later years, the special Alpha Kappa Alpha fund receives any revenues from the \$50 fee in excess of MVC costs. If the costs exceed \$50 per plate the chief administrator may cancel the program.

As reported, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 2280, which also was reported by the committee on this same date.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**:

In the Legislative Fiscal Estimate prepared by the Office of Legislative Services (OLS) for this bill, the OLS notes that the bill will have no net fiscal impact on the State of New Jersey. Before the MVC begins designing and producing the plates, Alpha Kappa Alpha is required to provide up to \$25,000 in funds as determined by the chief administrator and to pre-register 500 applicants for the plates. This requirement ensures that the MVC will be able to recover its initial costs in producing the plates, and if enough funds are not provided, the MVC will not be required to produce the plates.

If these requirements are met and production of the plates begins, the MVC may still discontinue the program if the cost of plate production exceeds \$50 per plate, which is the initial fee that the MVC collects for each plate. This ensures that the MVC will not experience any net costs in the administration of this license plate program, and if the MVC is able to produce the plates at a cost below \$50 per plate, it is possible that the MVC could realize positive net revenues.

The overall impact of this legislation is likely cost-neutral to the MVC, realizing no net costs or revenues. The chief administrator is likely to set the initial fee at an amount equal to the expected initial costs resulting in no initial fiscal impact. In later years, the special Alpha Kappa Alpha fund receives any revenues from the \$50 fee in excess of MVC costs. If the costs exceed \$50 per plate the chief administrator may cancel the program.

Before the MVC begins designing and producing the plates, Alpha Kappa Alpha is required to provide up to \$25,000 in funds as determined by the chief administrator and to pre-register 500 applicants for the plates. This requirement ensures that the MVC will be able to recover its initial costs in producing the plates, and if enough funds are not provided, the MVC will not be required to produce the plates.

If these requirements are met and production of the plates begins, the MVC may still discontinue the program if the cost of plate production exceeds \$50 per plate, which is the initial fee that the MVC collects for each plate. This ensures that the MVC will not experience any net costs in the administration of this license plate program, and if the MVC is able to produce the plates at a cost below \$50 per plate, it is possible that the MVC could realize positive net revenues.

The overall impact of this legislation is likely cost-neutral to the MVC, realizing no net costs or revenues. The chief administrator is likely to set the initial fee at an amount equal to the expected initial costs resulting in no initial fiscal impact. In later years, the special Alpha Kappa Alpha fund receives any revenues from the \$50 fee in excess of MVC costs. If the costs exceed \$50 per plate the chief administrator may cancel the program.

- Alpha Kappa Alpha is required to provide to MVC up to \$25,000 and 500 applicants before
  plates begin production to ensure that the MVC experiences no costs in the design and initial
  production of plates. The MVC is also permitted to discontinue the program if the average
  cost of a plate exceeds the \$50 per plate application fee once the program has begun,
  guaranteeing that the State will experience no net costs.
- The Chief Administrator of the MVC is permitted to set the initial contribution at any amount up to \$25,000. Therefore, the initial contribution should equal the initial cost to MVC, resulting in no initial fiscal impact.
- While the MVC is able to terminate the program if costs exceed \$50 per plate, the MVC could realize profits in future years if the MVC experiences costs below \$50 per plate.

#### **BILL DESCRIPTION**

Senate Bill No. 2280 of 2014 authorizes a special Alpha Kappa Alpha license plate. The design of the license plate is to be chosen by the chief administrator of the MVC in consultation with the North Atlantic Region Alpha Kappa Alpha Chapter.

In addition to all other fees otherwise required by law for the registration of a motor vehicle, there is an application fee of \$50 for these plates, and an annual post-issuance fee of \$10. The



chief administrator is required to annually certify the average cost per license plate in producing, issuing, and publicizing the Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates. If the average cost exceeds \$50 for two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the license plate program.

The bill provides that no State or other public funds may be used by the MVC for the initial cost of producing, issuing, and publicizing the availability of Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates or any computer programming changes which may be necessary to implement the Alpha Kappa Alpha license plate program.

The bill also requires that Alpha Kappa Alpha, or other individual or entity designated by Alpha Kappa Alpha, contribute monies in an amount to be determined by the chief administrator, not to exceed \$25,000, to be used to offset the initial costs incurred by the MVC for producing, issuing, and publicizing the availability of Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates, and any computer programming which may be necessary to implement the program.

The bill prohibits the MVC from designing, producing, issuing, or publicizing the availability of Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates, or making any necessary programming changes, until: (1) Alpha Kappa Alpha, or its designee, has provided the MVC with the money necessary to offset the initial costs incurred by the MVC in establishing the Alpha Kappa Alpha license plate program; and (2) Alpha Kappa Alpha, or its designee, has provided the MVC with a minimum of 500 completed applications for Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates.

The chief administrator is responsible for publicizing the availability of the license plates on the MVC's website. Alpha Kappa Alpha, or any individual or entity designated by Alpha Kappa Alpha, may also publicize the availability of Alpha Kappa Alpha license plates in any manner Alpha Kappa Alpha deems appropriate.

The provisions of the bill remain inoperative until the appropriate applications and fees required to offset the initial costs incurred by the MVC are provided by Alpha Kappa Alpha, and the bill expires after 12 months if sufficient applications and fees are not received.
