An Act to amend "An act concerning the production, handling and distribution of milk, cream and milk products, supplementing Title 24 of the Revised Statutes and repealing sections 24:10-1 to 24:10-57, inclusive, and 24:10-89 to 24:10-103, inclusive, of the Revised Statutes and chapter 195 of the laws of 1938", approved May 18, 1964 (P. L. 1964, c. 62).

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. Section 23 of P. L. 1964, c. 62 (C. 24:10-57.23) is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 3 23. Containers of milk, certified milk, Vitamin D milk, [and]
- 4 homogenized milk, low fat milk, protein fortified low fat milk, skim
- 5 milk, protein fortified skim milk, nonfat milk, protein fortified
- 6 nonfat milk, flavored milks and dairy drinks, buttermilk, cultured
- 7 buttermilk, yogurt, eggnog, creams, half-and-half and all other
- 8 fluid milk products *designated by the department* shall be
- 9 marked with the name and address of the processor or the
- 10 pasteurizing plant number as assigned by the department or
- 11 the state of origin and the name and address of the distributor.
- 12 [The] All containers of fluid milk products, including those
- 12A mentioned above, intended for sale to consumers, (except for
- 13 those products which are sterilized and packaged in hermetically
- 14 sealed containers), shall be marked with [the] a legend "NOT TO
- 15 BE SOLD AFTER", or "SELL BY", or any other clearly under-
- 16 standable legend approved by the department, [(insert in a clear

21 shall be no later than 5 days following the date of pasteurization. 22a date established in regulation by the department following the date of pasteurization. The date shall be based on consideration of 23wholesomeness and consumer palatability of the product. The date 24 of pasteurization shall be that of 6 a.m. at the end of the 24-hour 2526 period during which pasteurization took place. If two letters are used the letters MR shall mean MARCH and MY shall mean MAY; 27 JN shall mean JUNE and JL shall mean JULY [)].[''] No fluid 28milk product listed in this section shall be sold or offered for sale 29 after 11:59 p.m. of the date appearing on the containers so marked. 30 *The *Based upon differences in manufacturing procedures 31 and evidence relating to keeping quality of the product, the 3233 department may determine that the "shelf-life expiration date" applicable to some fluid milk products other than milk be 34 determined by the processor. When any processor is authorized 35 by the department to establish a "shelf-life expiration date" for 36 37 a fluid milk product other than milk, the* processor, prior to determining the date beyond which any *such* *[of his]* fluid 38 milk *[products] * *product * may not be sold or offered for sale, 39 shall notify the department of the intended "shelf-life expiration 40 date" selected by him for "[each of the] * such * fluid milk 41 *[products] * *product* intended for sale. All data and material **4**2 used by the processor or manufacturer in his determination of this 42B date shall be made available to the commissioner upon request. If 42c the data and material submitted does not, in the opinion of the 42D commissioner, justify the "shelf-life expiration date", the com-42E missioner shall prohibit the sale of the product until such time as 42F satisfactory data is supplied or until a new "shelf-life expiration 42g date" consistent with the data is applied to the product. The department shall periodically review the keeping quality of 43 milk and milk products by scientific shelf-life tests, recognizing the 44 different methods of pasteurization, processing and packaging, to 45 determine that shelf-life expiration dates stated on the containers 46 assure the consumer of acceptable quality milk and milk products 47 when kept under normal storage conditions. Samples for shelf-life 48 evaluation will be obtained at the processing plant, from delivery **4**9 trucks or from retail outlets. The temperature of the sample at the 50time of collection shall be officially recorded by the collector. Noth-51ing herein contained shall be construed to prohibit the department 52from taking special samples for analysis and making special tests 53 in order to assure all milk and milk products comply with the 54 minimum standards of freshness, quality and palatability. In the

event the department determines a processor's or a manufacturer's 5657 shelf-life for a given product is improper, the department shall immediately take such samples as are necessary for full and complete 58 recheck of the shelf-life of the product. If the full and complete 59 60 recheck confirms that the shelf-life of the product is improper, the department shall serve written notice on the processor or manu-61 facturer and the processor or manufacturer immediately upon re-6263 ceipt of such notice shall alter the shelf-life expiration date of the product to comply with the department findings. Compliance shall 64 be with the next processing of the product after receipt of such 6566 department notice. This rule does not apply to containers of fluid milk products which are not to be sold in the State of New Jersey. 67

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

Currently, the only statutory protection offered consumers for the freshness of milk and milk products applies to whole white milk. This is through a "pull date" law enacted in 1972. Also, the Department of Health has the authority, by regulation, to establish pull dates for other milk products. The Department has established such dates for most products.

This legislation, more comprehensive than existing law, would require the Department to establish such pull dates for all fluid milk products. It recognizes that the "shelf life" differs among these products and, therefore, authorizes the Department to establish varying pull dates for the different products.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: DECEMBER 4, 1978

This bill requires the Department of Health to establish expiration dates for all fluid milk products. It further requires that the container of such products be marked with appropriate expiration dates.

The committee amended the bill to clarify the role of the processors of fluid milk products in determining expiration dates. As amended the bill indicates that the department may determine that a "shelf-life expiration date" applicable to some fluid milk products other than milk may be established by the processor.

This bill requires the Department of Health to establish expiration dates for all fluid milk products. It further requires that the container of such products be marked with appropriate dates.

The bill also authorizes the department to permit fluid milk products processors to establish the "shelf-life expiration date" that would be applicable to some fluid milk products other than milk.
