P.L. 2018, CHAPTER 109, approved August 24, 2018 Assembly, No. 2401 (First Reprint)

1 AN ACT authorizing the issuance of Delta Sigma Theta license 2 plates and supplementing chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised 3 Statutes.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. a. Upon proper application, the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission shall issue Delta Sigma Theta license plates for any motor vehicle owned or leased and registered in this State. In addition to the registration number and other markings or identification otherwise prescribed by law, the license plates shall display appropriate words or a slogan and emblem honoring ¹the ¹ Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. The chief administrator shall, in consultation with the Eastern Regional Director of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., select the design and color scheme of the Delta Sigma Theta license plates. The Delta Sigma Theta license plates shall be subject to the provisions of chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes, except as hereinafter otherwise specifically provided.
- b. Application for issuance of Delta Sigma Theta license plates shall be made to the chief administrator on forms and in a manner prescribed by the chief administrator. In order to be deemed complete, an application shall be accompanied by a fee of \$50, payable to the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, which shall be in addition to the fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of a motor vehicle. The chief administrator shall collect annually, subsequent to the year of issuance of the Delta Sigma Theta license plates, a \$10 fee for the license plates in addition to the fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of a motor vehicle. The additional fees required by this subsection shall be deposited in the "Delta Sigma Theta License Plate Fund" created pursuant to subsection c. of this section.
- c. There is created in the Department of the Treasury a special non-lapsing fund to be known as the "Delta Sigma Theta License Plate Fund." There shall be deposited in the fund the amount collected from all license plate fees collected pursuant to subsection b. of this section, less the amounts necessary to reimburse the

commission for administrative costs pursuant to subsection d. of this section. Monies deposited in the fund shall be appropriated annually to the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. to be used to support the organization's mission and programs, which include educational development programs for youth and economic development, social action, and health initiatives for disadvantaged Monies deposited in the fund shall be held in communities. interest-bearing accounts in public depositories as defined pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1970, c.236 (C.17:9-41), and may be invested or reinvested in securities approved by the State Treasurer. Interest or other income earned on monies deposited into the fund, and any monies which may be appropriated or otherwise become available for the purposes of the fund, shall be credited to and deposited in the fund for use as set forth in P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill).

d. Prior to the deposit of the additional fees collected pursuant to subsection b. of this section into the "Delta Sigma Theta License Plate Fund," amounts thereof as are necessary shall be used to reimburse the commission for all costs reasonably and actually incurred, as stipulated by the chief administrator, for:

- (1) designing, producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of the Delta Sigma Theta license plates; and
- (2) any computer programming changes that may be initially necessary to implement the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program in an amount not to exceed \$150,000.

The chief administrator shall annually certify to the State Treasurer the average cost per license plate incurred in the immediately preceding year by the commission in producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of the Delta Sigma Theta license plates. The annual certification of the average cost per license plate shall be approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, or its successor.

In the event that the average cost per license plate as certified by the chief administrator and approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, or its successor, is greater than the \$50 application fee established in subsection b. of this section in two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the issuance of Delta Sigma Theta license plates.

STATEMENT

This bill authorizes the Chief Administrator (chief administrator) of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (commission) to issue special Delta Sigma Theta license plates.

Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. was founded on January 13, 1913 by 22 collegiate women at Howard University to promote academic excellence and provide assistance to those in need. Currently, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. is an organization of college educated women committed to the constructive development of its members and to public service, whose purpose is to provide assistance and support through established programs in local communities throughout the world.

The bill provides that the design of the Delta Sigma Theta license plate is to display appropriate words or a slogan and an emblem honoring Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.. The chief administrator is to, in consultation with the Eastern Regional Director of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, select the design and color scheme of the Delta Sigma Theta license plates.

In addition to all fees otherwise required by law for the registration of a motor vehicle, there is an application fee of \$50 and an annual renewal fee of \$10 for the Delta Sigma Theta license plates. After the deduction of the cost of designing, producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the plates and of any computer programming changes that are necessary to implement the license plate program, in an amount not to exceed \$150,000, the additional fees will be deposited into a special non-lapsing fund known as the "Delta Sigma Theta License Plate Fund." The proceeds of the fund are to be annually appropriated to the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., to be used to support the organization's mission and programs, which include educational development programs for youth and economic development, social action, and health initiatives for disadvantaged communities.

The chief administrator is required to annually certify the average cost of producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of the specialty license plates. If the average cost per plate exceeds \$50 in two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program. The bill also requires that the Eastern Regional Director of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. appoint a liaison to represent the Eastern Region of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. (Eastern Region) in all communications with the commission regarding the Delta Sigma Theta license plates.

The bill provides that State or other public funds are not to be used by the commission for the initial cost to implement the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program. The bill requires the Eastern Region or an individual or entity designated by the Eastern Region to contribute non-public monies, not to exceed \$25,000, to offset the initial costs to design, produce, issue, and publicize the license plates and for computer programming changes which may be necessary to implement the program. The bill authorizes the Eastern Region to receive funds from private sources to be used to offset the initial costs.

The chief administrator is not required to design, produce, issue, or publicize the availability of the Delta Sigma Theta license plates, until: (1) the Eastern Region or the individual or entity designated by the Eastern Region has provided the commission with the money necessary to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission in establishing the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program; and (2) the Eastern Region liaison has provided the commission with a minimum of 500 completed applications for the Delta Sigma Theta license plates.

The provisions of the bill will remain inoperative until the first day of the seventh month after the appropriate applications and fees required to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission are provided by the Eastern Region liaison. The bill expires on the last day of the 12th month if sufficient applications and fees to offset the initial costs are not received by that date.

The Assembly Transportation and Independent Authorities Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 2401.

As amended and reported, this bill authorizes the Chief Administrator (chief administrator) of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (commission) to issue special Delta Sigma Theta license plates.

The bill provides that the design of the Delta Sigma Theta license plate is to display appropriate words or a slogan and an emblem honoring the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. (Delta Sigma Theta). The chief administrator is to, in consultation with the Eastern Regional Director of Delta Sigma Theta, select the design and color scheme of the Delta Sigma Theta license plates.

In addition to all fees otherwise required by law for the registration of a motor vehicle, there is an application fee of \$50 and an annual renewal fee of \$10 for the Delta Sigma Theta license plates. After the deduction of the cost of designing, producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the plates and of any computer programming changes that are necessary to implement the license plate program, in an amount not to exceed \$150,000, the additional fees will be deposited into a special non-lapsing fund known as the "Delta Sigma Theta License Plate Fund." The proceeds of the fund are to be annually appropriated to Delta Sigma Theta to be used to support the organization's mission and programs.

The chief administrator is required to annually certify the average cost of producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of the specialty license plates. If the average cost per plate exceeds \$50 in two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program. The bill also requires that the Eastern Regional Director of Delta Sigma Theta appoint a liaison to represent the Eastern Region of Delta Sigma Theta (Eastern Region) in all communications with the commission regarding the Delta Sigma Theta license plates.

The chief administrator is responsible for publicizing the availability of the license plates on the website of the commission. The Eastern Region, or an individual or entity designated by the Eastern Region, may also publicize the availability of the license plates in any manner the Eastern Region deems appropriate.

The bill provides that State or other public funds are not to be used by the commission for the initial cost to implement the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program. The bill requires the Eastern Region or an individual or entity designated by the Eastern Region to contribute non-public monies, not to exceed \$25,000, to offset the initial costs to design, produce, issue, and publicize the license plates and for computer programming changes which may be necessary to implement the program. The bill authorizes the Eastern Region to receive funds from private sources to be used to offset the initial costs.

The chief administrator is not required to design, produce, issue, or publicize the availability of the Delta Sigma Theta license plates or make any necessary programming changes, until: (1) the Eastern Region or the individual or entity designated by the Eastern Region has provided the commission with the money necessary to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission in establishing the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program; and (2) the Eastern Region liaison has provided the commission with a minimum of 500 completed applications for the Delta Sigma Theta license plates.

The Assembly Budget Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2401.

This bill authorizes the Chief Administrator (chief administrator) of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (commission) to issue special Delta Sigma Theta license plates.

The bill provides that the design of the Delta Sigma Theta license plate is to display appropriate words or a slogan and an emblem honoring the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. (Delta Sigma Theta). The chief administrator is to, in consultation with the Eastern Regional Director of Delta Sigma Theta, select the design and color scheme of the Delta Sigma Theta license plates.

In addition to all fees otherwise required by law for the registration of a motor vehicle, there is an application fee of \$50 and an annual renewal fee of \$10 for the Delta Sigma Theta license plates. After the deduction of the cost of designing, producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the plates and of any computer programming changes that are necessary to implement the license plate program, in an amount not to exceed \$150,000, the additional fees will be deposited into a special non-lapsing fund known as the "Delta Sigma Theta License Plate Fund." The proceeds of the fund are to be annually appropriated to Delta Sigma Theta to be used to support the organization's mission and programs.

The chief administrator is required to annually certify the average cost of producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of the specialty license plates. If the average cost per plate exceeds \$50 in two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program. The bill also requires that the Eastern Regional Director of Delta Sigma Theta appoint a liaison to represent the Eastern Region of Delta Sigma Theta (Eastern Region) in all communications with the commission regarding the Delta Sigma Theta license plates.

The chief administrator is responsible for publicizing the availability of the license plates on the website of the commission. The Eastern Region, or an individual or entity designated by the Eastern Region, may also publicize the availability of the license plates in any manner the Eastern Region deems appropriate.

The bill provides that State or other public funds are not to be used by the commission for the initial cost to implement the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program. The bill requires the Eastern Region or an individual or entity designated by the Eastern Region to contribute non-public monies in an amount to be determined by the chief administrator, not to exceed \$25,000, to offset the initial costs to design, produce, issue, and publicize the license plates and for computer programming changes which may be necessary to implement the program. The bill authorizes the Eastern Region to receive funds from private sources to be used to offset the initial costs.

The chief administrator is not required to design, produce, issue, or publicize the availability of the Delta Sigma Theta license plates or make any necessary programming changes, until: (1) the Eastern Region or the individual or entity designated by the Eastern Region has provided the commission with the money necessary to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission in establishing the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program; and (2) the Eastern Region liaison has provided the commission with a minimum of 500 completed applications for the Delta Sigma Theta license plates.

BILL DESCRIPTION

This bill authorizes the MVC to issue special Delta Sigma Theta license plates.

In addition to all fees otherwise required by law for the registration of a motor vehicle, there is an application fee of \$50 and an annual renewal fee of \$10 for the Delta Sigma Theta license plates. After the deduction of the MVC's cost of designing, producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the plates and of any computer programming changes that are necessary to implement the license plate program, in an amount not to exceed \$150,000, the additional fees will be deposited into a special non-lapsing fund known as the "Delta Sigma Theta License Plate Fund." Fund proceeds are to be annually appropriated to the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.

State or other public funds are not to be used for the initial cost to establish the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program. Accordingly, the MVC is not required to implement the program if the following conditions are not met in the first 12 months following the date of enactment: (1) an individual or entity designated by the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. has contributed non-public moneys, not to exceed \$25,000, to offset the MVC's initial cost to establish the program; and (2) the MVC has received a minimum of 500 completed applications for the specialty license plates. Once the two conditions are met, the MVC has six months to implement the program.

Upon program implementation the MVC is required to annually certify the average cost of producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of the specialty license plates. If the average cost per plate exceeds \$50 in two consecutive fiscal years, the MVC may discontinue the program.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

EXECUTIVE BRANCH

The Executive has not submitted a formal, written fiscal note for this bill. However, in response to an OLS Discussion Point in the FY 2017-2018 Department of Transportation and Motor Vehicle Commission Budget Analysis, the MVC indicated that its upfront cost was \$65,700 to set up a license plate program, which includes computer changes and the initial print run of 550 plates.

OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The OLS finds that the bill will produce annual State revenue and expenditure increases that will largely offset one another. The OLS cannot quantify the annual increases because it is unclear how many applications for the new specialty license plate the MVC will receive.

The bill establishes the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program in such a manner that the MVC may fully recover the expenses it incurs in administering the program. But the MVC may also, at its discretion, operate the program at a net cost. If the number of license plate applications is below 500 in the first 12 months following the effective date, the bill will expire without the creation of the license plate program. Conversely, if the number of applications is

equal to or greater than 500, the MVC will be able to recover its costs within no more than three years of the creation of the program.

Before the MVC begins designing and producing the license plates, the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. is required to provide up to \$25,000 and pre-register 500 applicants for the license plates. This requirement ensures that the MVC will be able to recover its initial costs in producing the license plates, and if enough funds are not provided, the MVC will not be required to produce the license plates. The payment of up to \$25,000 is required to come from private sources so the amount is not expected to be a State or local cost.

Upon production of the license plates, the MVC may still discontinue the program if the production cost exceeds \$50 per license plate, which is the initial fee that the MVC will collect for each plate. This ensures that the MVC will not experience any net costs in the administration of this license plate program. The current cost per plate to the MVC is \$6.60 so it is unlikely that the MVC will experience any net cost in the administration of the program.

The MVC indicated in response to an FY 2017-2018 OLS Discussion Point that it faced an upfront cost of \$65,700 to set up a license plate program, which includes computer changes and the initial print run of 550 license plates. The requirements of the bill would provide the MVC with the first \$50,000 of those costs through the initial \$25,000 payment and the first 500 license plate sales. The remaining \$15,700 would either be recovered through the sale of additional Delta Sigma Theta Sorority license plates or by retaining collections from the \$10 annual fee. The first 500 plate sales will generate \$5,000 per year from the \$10 annual renewal fee. So in the event that no other plates were purchased under the program, the MVC would largely recover the remaining costs after three years of collecting the annual fee.

The bill prevents the MVC from realizing net revenues in administering the program because the bill requires the MVC to deposit all program fees into a special fund to be appropriated to the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. once the MVC has subtracted its costs in administering the program. The combination of guaranteed fee collection for the MVC and the limit on retaining any fees greater than its cost creates a scenario where there is likely to be no net fiscal impact to the MVC in the administration of this license plate program.

Monies deposited in the fund shall be appropriated annually to the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. to be used to support the organization's mission and programs, which include educational development programs for youth and economic development, social action, and health initiatives for disadvantaged communities. Monies deposited in the fund shall be held in interest-bearing accounts in public depositories as defined pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1970, c.236 (C.17:9-41), and may be invested or reinvested in securities approved by the State Treasurer. Interest or

other income earned on monies deposited into the fund, and any monies which may be appropriated or otherwise become available for the purposes of the fund, shall be credited to and deposited in the fund for use as set forth in P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill).

- d. Prior to the deposit of the additional fees collected pursuant to subsection b. of this section into the "Delta Sigma Theta License Plate Fund," amounts thereof as are necessary shall be used to reimburse the commission for all costs reasonably and actually incurred, as stipulated by the chief administrator, for:
- (1) designing, producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of the Delta Sigma Theta license plates; and
- (2) any computer programming changes that may be initially necessary to implement the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program in an amount not to exceed \$150,000.

The chief administrator shall annually certify to the State Treasurer the average cost per license plate incurred in the immediately preceding year by the commission in producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of the Delta Sigma Theta license plates. The annual certification of the average cost per license plate shall be approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, or its successor.

In the event that the average cost per license plate as certified by the chief administrator and approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, or its successor, is greater than the \$50 application fee established in subsection b. of this section in two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the issuance of Delta Sigma Theta license plates.

The chief administrator shall notify eligible motorists of the opportunity to obtain Delta Sigma Theta license plates by publicizing the availability of the license plates on the commission's website. Eastern Region, may also publicize the availability of the license plates in any manner the Eastern Region deems appropriate.

The bill provides that State or other public funds are not to be used by the commission for the initial cost to implement the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program. The bill requires the Eastern Region or an individual or entity designated by the Eastern Region to contribute non-public monies, not to exceed \$25,000, to offset the initial costs to design, produce, issue, and publicize the license plates and for computer programming changes which may be necessary to implement the program. The bill authorizes the Eastern Region to receive funds from private sources to be used to offset the initial costs.

The chief administrator is not required to design, produce, issue, or publicize the availability of the Delta Sigma Theta license plates or make any necessary programming changes, until: (1) the Eastern Region or the individual or entity designated by the Eastern Region has provided the commission with the money necessary to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission in establishing the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program; and (2) the Eastern Region liaison has provided the commission with a minimum of 500 completed applications for the Delta Sigma Theta license plates.

The provisions of the bill will remain inoperative until the first day of the seventh month after the appropriate applications and fees required to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission are provided by the Eastern Region liaison. The bill expires on the last day of the 12th month if sufficient applications and fees to offset the initial costs are not received by that date.

The committee amended the bill to make grammatical corrections.

SUMMARY

- The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) finds that the bill will produce annual State revenue and expenditure increases that will largely offset one another. The OLS cannot quantify the annual increases because it is unclear how many applications for the new specialty license plate the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) will receive. The OLS notes, however, that the implementation of the bill is conditioned upon the receipt by the MVC of a minimum of 500 applications for the new specialty license plate.
- The bill establishes the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program in such a manner that the MVC may fully recover the expenses incurred in administering the program. The MVC has identified its initial cost of designing and establishing a new license plate series as \$62,000, which is largely attributable to computer system changes, and the per plate cost of an initial 550 plate run at \$6.60 per license plate, for a total cost of \$65,700.
- The MVC will receive a \$50 Delta Sigma Theta license plate application fee in addition to a \$10 annual renewal fee. Initial fee collections will reimburse the MVC for the expenses it incurs in administering the program. In addition, the MVC will have to receive an initial payment of up to \$25,000 and a minimum of 500 license plate applications for a total of \$50,000 to offset initial costs before license plate production begins. The MVC will then be permitted to retain additional fee amounts until its costs are fully reimbursed.



 After the MVC's cost recovery, indeterminate excess application and renewal fee collections will be appropriated to the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.

BILL DESCRIPTION

This bill authorizes the MVC to issue special Delta Sigma Theta license plates.

In addition to all fees otherwise required by law for the registration of a motor vehicle, there is an application fee of \$50 and an annual renewal fee of \$10 for the Delta Sigma Theta license plates. After the deduction of the MVC's cost of designing, producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the plates and of any computer programming changes that are necessary to implement the license plate program, in an amount not to exceed \$150,000, the additional fees will be deposited into a special non-lapsing fund known as the "Delta Sigma Theta License Plate Fund." Fund proceeds are to be annually appropriated to the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.

State or other public funds are not to be used for the initial cost to establish the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program. Accordingly, the MVC is not required to implement the program if the following conditions are not met in the first 12 months following the date of enactment: (1) an individual or entity designated by the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. has contributed non-public moneys, not to exceed \$25,000, to offset the MVC's initial cost to establish the program; and (2) the MVC has received a minimum of 500 completed applications for the specialty license plates. Once the two conditions are met, the MVC has six months to implement the program.

Upon program implementation the MVC is required to annually certify the average cost of producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of the specialty license plates. If the average cost per plate exceeds \$50 in two consecutive fiscal years, the MVC may discontinue the program.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

EXECUTIVE BRANCH

The Executive has not submitted a formal, written fiscal note for this bill. However, in response to an OLS Discussion Point in the FY 2017-2018 Department of Transportation and Motor Vehicle Commission Budget Analysis, the MVC indicated that its upfront cost was \$65,700 to set up a license plate program, which includes computer changes and the initial print run of 550 plates.

OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The OLS finds that the bill will produce annual State revenue and expenditure increases that will largely offset one another. The OLS cannot quantify the annual increases because it is unclear how many applications for the new specialty license plate the MVC will receive.

The bill establishes the Delta Sigma Theta license plate program in such a manner that the MVC may fully recover the expenses it incurs in administering the program. But the MVC may also, at its discretion, operate the program at a net cost. If the number of license plate applications is below 500 in the first 12 months following the effective date, the bill will expire without the creation of the license plate program. Conversely, if the number of applications is

equal to or greater than 500, the MVC will be able to recover its costs within no more than three years of the creation of the program.

Before the MVC begins designing and producing the license plates, the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. is required to provide up to \$25,000 and pre-register 500 applicants for the license plates. This requirement ensures that the MVC will be able to recover its initial costs in producing the license plates, and if enough funds are not provided, the MVC will not be required to produce the license plates. The payment of up to \$25,000 is required to come from private sources so the amount is not expected to be a State or local cost.

Upon production of the license plates, the MVC may still discontinue the program if the production cost exceeds \$50 per license plate, which is the initial fee that the MVC will collect for each plate. This ensures that the MVC will not experience any net costs in the administration of this license plate program. The current cost per plate to the MVC is \$6.60 so it is unlikely that the MVC will experience any net cost in the administration of the program.

The MVC indicated in response to an FY 2017-2018 OLS Discussion Point that it faced an upfront cost of \$65,700 to set up a license plate program, which includes computer changes and the initial print run of 550 license plates. The requirements of the bill would provide the MVC with the first \$50,000 of those costs through the initial \$25,000 payment and the first 500 license plate sales. The remaining \$15,700 would either be recovered through the sale of additional Delta Sigma Theta Sorority license plates or by retaining collections from the \$10 annual fee. The first 500 plate sales will generate \$5,000 per year from the \$10 annual renewal fee. So in the event that no other plates were purchased under the program, the MVC would largely recover the remaining costs after three years of collecting the annual fee.

The bill prevents the MVC from realizing net revenues in administering the program because the bill requires the MVC to deposit all program fees into a special fund to be appropriated to the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. once the MVC has subtracted its costs in administering the program. The combination of guaranteed fee collection for the MVC and the limit on retaining any fees greater than its cost creates a scenario where there is likely to be no net fiscal impact to the MVC in the administration of this license plate program.
