The Assembly State Government Committee reports without recommendation Senate, No. 987 (2R).

The bill clarifies that this provision applies only to single bids on the overall contract.

The bill also (1) makes permissive the current requirement that if a single overall contract is awarded, the public entity must pay the subcontractors directly; (2) requires that payments to a subcontractor for work and materials supplied in connection with a contract are to be made within 10 calendar days of the receipt of payment for that work or the delivery of those materials by the subcontractor in accordance with the provisions of P.L.1991, c.133 (C.2A:30A-1 et seq.) and its regulations; and (3) eliminates an existing requirement, applicable only to school board building projects, that in the case of a single bid, the subcontractors must provide evidence of performance security.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports without recommendation Senate Bill No. 987, with committee amendments.

This bill makes several revisions in the bid solicitation procedures applicable to contracts awarded by the State, the New Jersey Building Authority, and school boards on projects for the construction, renovation, alteration, or repair of public buildings.

- (1) Under present law, the affected public entities are required, when undertaking these projects, to seek separate bids on each of five categories of work: plumbing and gas fitting; heating and ventilating systems and equipment; electrical work; structural steel and ornamental iron work; and general construction work (comprising all work not included in the four other categories). They must also seek single bids on an overall contract for all the work and materials required. Under the bill, these entities could, as at present, solicit both types of bids on the project, or they could solicit separate bids only, or single bids only.
- (2) Current law contains a provision that bids on construction work for the affected public entities shall identify the names of all subcontractors to whom the bidder will subcontract work included in any of the four "specialized" categories. The bill clarifies that this provision is to apply only to single bids on the overall contract.
- (3) Under current law, if a single overall contract for the project is awarded, the public entity must pay the subcontractors directly upon certification of the general contractor of the amount due to the subcontractor. Under the bill, such direct payments to a subcontractor under an overall contract would be allowed, but not required. Any payments to a subcontractor under such a contract are to be made within 10 days of the completion of work or delivery of materials by the subcontractor.
- (4) The bill eliminates an existing requirement, applicable only to school board building projects, that in the case of a single bid, the subcontractors must provide evidence of performance security.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee adopted amendments to the bill to:

- (1) Incorporate the requirement that subcontractors under a single overall contract be paid within 10 days of their completion of work or delivery of materials; and
- (2) Delete a provision that a bidder who is awarded a single overall contract would not be obligated to enter into a contract with a subcontractor listed in the bid unless (a) the subcontract is for the same price as the subcontractor's pre-bid price and binds the subcontractor, to the extent not inconsistent with the terms of the subcontract or requirements established by the public entity, to the same terms as those to which the general contractor is bound in the overall contract, and (b) upon the general contractor's transmission of a written subcontract to the subcontractor by certified mail, return receipt requested, the subcontractor signs and returns the subcontract within five days of receiving it.

SYNOPSIS

Permits certain public entities to solicit separate bids on five categories of work or a single bid on all work or both with regard to contracts for construction work on public buildings.

- (4) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (2) of this subsection, a bidder who is awarded a single overall contract shall not be obligated to enter into a subcontract with a listed subcontractor unless: (a) the subcontract is for the same price as the subcontractor's pre-bid price and binds the subcontractor, to the extent not inconsistent with the terms and conditions of the subcontract or requirements established by the authority, to the same terms and conditions to which the bidder as general contractor is bound in the overall contract with the authority; and (b) upon transmission by the bidder to the subcontractor by certified mail, return receipt requested, of a written subcontract, the subcontractor signs and returns the subcontract within five days of receipt of the subcontract.
 - (5) All construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation or improvement undertaken by the authority pursuant to this act shall be subject during such undertaking to the supervision of the Division of Building and Construction to the same extent as any project undertaken by the State.
 - c. With respect to the lease or sale of any project or portion thereof to any person, firm, partnership or corporation, for subsequent lease to or purchase by a State agency, no agreement for that lease or sale shall be entered into, unless the authority shall first publicly advertise for bids therefor. The authority shall employ a person, firm, partnership or corporation, independent from any other aspect or component of the financing of or any ownership or leasehold interest in that project, to assist in the bid procedure and evaluation.

3. R.S.52:32-2 is amended to read as follows:

52:32-2. <u>a.</u> When the entire cost of the erection, construction, alteration or repair by the State of any public buildings in this State will exceed \$2,000.00, the person preparing the plans and specifications for such work [shall] <u>may</u> prepare separate plans and specifications for: (1) the plumbing and gas fitting and all work kindred thereto[,]; (2) the steam and hot water heating and ventilating apparatus, steam power plants and all work kindred thereto[, and]; (3) electrical work[,]; (4) structural steel and ornamental iron work[,]; and (5) general construction, which shall include all other work and materials required for the completion of the project.

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1 **b.** The board, body or person authorized by law to award contracts 2 for such work shall advertise for, in the manner provided by law, and receive [(a)] (1) separate bids for each of [said] the branches of 3 4 [the] work [and (b)] specified in subsection a. of this section; or (2) 5 bids for all the work and materials required to complete the project to 6 be included in a single over-all contract, in which case there shall be 7 set forth in the bid the name or names of all subcontractors to whom 8 the bidder will subcontract for the furnishing of any of the work and 9 materials specified in [(a) above] branches (1) through (4) in 10 subsection a. of this section, each of which subcontractors shall be 11 qualified in accordance with chapter 35 of Title 52 of the Revised 12 Statutes: or (3) both.

In every case in which a contract is awarded under **[**(b) above**]** paragraph (2) or (3) of subsection b. of this section, all payments required to be made by the board, body or person awarding the contract under such contract for work and materials supplied by a subcontractor **[**shall**]** may, upon the certification of the contractor of the amount due to the subcontractor, be paid directly to the subcontractor.

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d. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection b. of this section, a bidder who is awarded a single overall contract shall not be obligated to enter into a subcontract with a listed subcontractor unless: (1) the subcontract is for the same price as the subcontractor's pre-bid price and binds the subcontractor, to the extent not inconsistent with the terms and conditions of the subcontract or requirements established by the board, body, or person authorized by law to award the contract, to the same terms and conditions to which the bidder as general contractor is bound in the overall contract with the board, body, or person authorized by law to award the contract; and (2) upon transmission by the bidder to the subcontractor by certified mail,

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return receipt requested, of a written subcontract, the subcontractor signs and returns the subcontract within five days of receipt of the subcontract.

4. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill concerns public contracts for the construction, renovation, alteration, or repair of public buildings by the State, the New Jersey Building Authority and school boards. The provisions of the bill are as follows:

- (1) The bill eliminates the current requirement that school boards, the State, and the New Jersey Building Authority must seek both separate bids on five categories of work (plumbing and gas fitting work, heating and ventilating systems and equipment, electrical work, structural steel and ornamental iron work, and general construction work which shall include the remaining work and materials required for completion of a project) and single bids on all the work and materials required, and instead provides that those entities may solicit separate bids, single bids, or both.
- (2) The bill frees a bidder who is awarded a single overall contract from the obligation to enter into a contract with a subcontractor listed in the bid unless: (a) the subcontract is for the same price as the subcontractor's pre-bid price and binds the subcontractor, to the extent not inconsistent with the terms and conditions of the subcontract or requirements established by the public entity, to the same terms and conditions to which the bidder as general contractor is bound in the overall contract with the public entity; and (b) upon transmission by the bidder to the subcontractor by certified mail, return receipt requested, of a written subcontract, the subcontractor signs and returns the subcontract within five days of receipt of the subcontract.
- (3) The bill makes permissive the current requirement that if a single overall contract is awarded, the public entity must pay the subcontractors directly.
- (4) The bill clarifies and makes uniform the requirement that, in the case of a single bid, the bidder must list the subcontractors for all the specified categories of work except for the general construction category. This reflects the current mode of operation.
- (5) The bill eliminates the current requirement that, in the case of a single bid, the subcontractors must provide evidence of performance security. In practice, the single bidder provides evidence of performance security.

GOVERNOR SIGNS LEGISLATION GRANTING SCHOOL BOARDS MORE FLEXIBILITY IN AWARDING CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS

Gov. Christie Whitman today signed legislation, which gives schools boards and the state more flexibility with regard to bidding and awarding contracts for construction work on public buildings.

"This legislation will give school boards and state officials additional tools to use in the bidding process to help lower construction costs and save taxpayer dollars," the Governor said. "This system is similar to the bidding process already available to municipalities, counties and the federal government."

The bill provides schools boards and state entities with the authority to choose whether to use single prime bidding, multiple bidding or both methods when awarding construction contracts.

Under previous law, school boards, the State and the State Building Authority, were required to bid each contract using both the single and multiple methods, and were locked into the lowest price without being able to consider other factors, such as the likelihood of construction delays and cost overruns or the overall management of the contract.

The flexibility in this bill had been long sought by school boards and school business administrators as a way to save taxpayer dollars.

The legislation, S-987, was sponsored by Senators Joseph M. Kyrillos, Jr. (R-Middlesex/Monmouth) and Edward T. O'Connor, Jr. (D-Hudson) and Assembly Members Alex DeCroce (R-Essex/Morris/Passaic) and Joseph V. Doria, Jr. (D-Hudson).
