AN ACT concerning motor vehicles, and amending section 39:4-77 of the Revised Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New
2 Jersey:

1 1. Section 39:4-77 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

2 39:4-77. No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be so loaded or
3 operate a vehicle so loaded that the contents or any part thereof [shall]
4 may be scattered in any street. *Whenever the load of any vehicle is of ma-*
5 *terial other than farm products susceptible to scattering on a street and such*
6 *load extends above the height of the sides or tail gate or rear of the body of*
7 *the vehicle, such load shall be securely covered by a tarpaulin or other cover.*

8 The director, where public safety so warrants, shall, after a public hearing,
9 prescribe by rule or regulation minimum safety standards for fastening
10 loads on and fix loading procedures for any commercial type flat bed motor
11 vehicle or motor-drawn vehicle. Any rule or regulation so promulgated by
12 the director shall be filed in the Secretary of State's office and copies thereof
13 shall be available, upon request, in the director's office.

14 The owner, lessee, bailee, or operator of any vehicle described above
15 found on a highway in violation of any such safety standard or procedure
16 that may be prescribed by the director shall be fined not more than \$500.00
17 for each violation.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
