1 AN ACT concerning the requirements for public works manager 2 examination and certification for certain persons and amending 3 P.L.1991, c.258.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. Section 1 of P.L.1991, c.258 (C.40A:9-154.6a) is amended to read as follows:
 - 1. As used in this act:
- a. "Director" means the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs.
- b. "Management responsibility" means the supervisory responsibility for planning, scheduling, directing, controlling and coordinating the daily and long term [activities] operations of [a municipal or county] public works [department or subdivision] activities, as applicable, including the utilization of manpower, equipment, materials [and], funds [appropriated to the public works department], and other available resources [available to the department].
- c. "Public Works Advisory Board" means that board appointed by the director to [assist the Division of Local Government Services in the examination and certification process and as may be required for the general administration of this act] review the examination, assist in evaluating qualifications for granting certificates, review of municipal applications for exemption, and review of continuing education programs and other duties as the director may from time to time assign. The board shall meet at least one time each year.
- d. "Public works [department] <u>activity</u>" means [a local agency which has the responsibility for the care and] maintenance of streets, [roads, avenues] <u>drainage</u>, public buildings and places, water and waste water, solid waste, motor vehicles, or similar items related to the physical plant and infrastructure of [the jurisdiction] <u>a municipality</u>. For the purposes of this act, [neither an agency of county government nor] a municipal utilities authority shall <u>not</u> be considered a public works [department] <u>activity</u>.
- e. "[Public] <u>Principal public</u> works manager" means a [person] certified public works manager ¹who performs administrative and supervisory duties relating to installation, maintenance and repair of public works facilities, or assists in planning, organizing and directing all programs relating to a public works activity, or a

- g. "Certified public works manager" means a public works manager who meets any one of the following criteria:
- i. completes the requirements of section 2 of P.L.1991, c.258 (C.40A:9-154.6b);
 - ii. has a bachelor or greater degree in civil or related public works engineering, and is a licensed professional engineer in New Jersey;
 - iii. has served in one or more municipalities continuously for the five years prior to January 1, 1997, except that certification shall be limited to the municipality where the public works manager is employed at the time he applies for the certificate pursuant to section 3 of P.L.1991, c.258 (C.40A:9-154.6c);
- iv. graduated as a certified public works manager from Rutgers, the State University prior to August 13, ¹[1993] 1994¹. (cf: P.L.1991, c.258, s.1)
- 2. Section 2 of P.L.1991, c.258 (C.40A:9-154.6b) is amended to read as follows:
- 2. a. The director shall appoint [five] nine persons who shall 41 constitute the Public Works Advisory Board as follows: one 42 43 designee from the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs, who shall serve as chair; one 44 from Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey, [Department 45 46 of] Center for Government [Services] Service; two public works 47 managers who [have] hold certified public works manager certificates and are members of the Public Works Association of 48 49 New Jersey; [and] one public works manager who has a certified public works manager certificate and a degree in engineering 50 51 from a four-year institution of higher education, and is a member of the Public Works Association of New_Jersey; one public works 52 53 manager who has a certified public works manager certificate

Advisory Board may be reappointed to succeed himself. The director may dismiss any member of the Public Works Advisory
Board for cause and then make another appointment to serve for

the remainder of that term.

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- b. The director, with the advice of the Public Works Advisory Board, shall develop and hold examinations semi-annually, [and] or at such times as he may determine appropriate, qualification as a certified public works manager. An applicant for examination shall present to the director a written application on a form provided by the Division of Local Government Services, showing that the applicant is not less than 21 years of age, is a citizen of the United States, is of good moral character, has obtained a certificate or diploma issued after at least four years of study in an approved secondary school or has received an academic education considered and accepted by the Commissioner of Education of this State as fully equivalent, and has graduated as a [certified] public works manager from Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey[, or a program certified as its equivalent by the Division of Local Government Services]. An applicant shall have a minimum of five years' experience [in] as a public works [operations in a position requiring the exercise of management skills] manager. (cf: P.L.1991, c.258, s.2)
- 3. Section 3 of P.L.1991, c.258 (C.40A:9-154.6c) is amended to read as follows:

[Notwithstanding the examination requirements in section 2 of this act, the] The director shall issue, upon [receipt of an application within one year after the effective date of this act and] the payment of a fee ¹[of \$25 to the order of the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey]¹, a public works manager certificate to any applicant who meets the definition of a certified public works manager or a public works manager who has successfully completed a certified public works manager program described in section 2 of this act, is not less than 21 years of age, is a citizen of the United States, is of good moral character, and has obtained a high school diploma as described in section 2 of this act [, and has at least 10 years of experience in public works operations, and has served in a position of management responsibility for any local unit of government for five consecutive years prior to the date of application for certification].

If a governing body or mayor fail or refuses to comply with this subsection, and has received an order from the director to do so, the members of a governing body or mayor who willfully fail or refuse to comply shall each be subject to a personal penalty of \$25 for each day after the date fixed for final action that failure or refusal to comply continues. The amount for the penalty may be recovered by the director in the name of the State as a personal debt of the member of the governing body or mayor, and shall be paid, upon receipt, into the State Treasury.

Each renewal shall be for a period of three years. The renewal date shall be 30 days prior to the expiration date.
- b. All public works manager certificates subject to renewal pursuant to this section that were issued prior to January 1, 1995 shall have an expiration date of December 31, [1998] ¹[1997] 1998¹. All public works manager certificates issued on or after January 1, 1995 shall have an expiration date of either June 30 or December 31, whichever is sooner, of the third year following the year in which the certificates were originally issued, provided that no certificate shall expire sooner than [three years from the date of original issue] December 31, ¹[1997] 1998¹.

Each applicant for renewal of a public works manager certificate shall, on a form prescribed by the director, furnish proof of having earned at least two continuing education units in fields of study related to public works <u>activity</u>. For the purposes of this section, one continuing education unit equals 10 contact hours. Upon verification of this requirement, and upon payment of a fee ¹[of \$10 to the order of the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey]¹, the director shall renew the public works manager certificate.
- d. If the holder of a public works manager certificate has allowed the certificate to lapse by failing to renew the certificate, a new application and certificate shall be required. If application is made within six months of the expiration of the lapsed certificate, then application may be made in the same

The director may dismiss any member of the Public Works Advisory Board for cause and then make another appointment to serve for the remainder of that term.
- b. The director, with the advice of the Public Works Advisory Board, shall develop and hold examinations semi-annually, and at such times as he may determine appropriate, for qualification as a certified public works manager. - 1 skills, except that an applicant who has served as a temporary 2 principal public works manager pursuant to section 7 of P.L.1991, 3 c.258 (C.40A:9-154.6g), and who has a minimum of five years of 4 experience in the private sector requiring the exercise of management skills, deemed acceptable by the Public Works 5 Advisory Board, shall be credited for up to three years' 6 7 experience in public works operations if that applicant passes the 8 first certified public works manager examination held by the 9 board following that applicant's termination of employment as a 10 temporary principal public works manager.
- c. Notwithstanding the requirements of subsection b. of this 11 section, an applicant for examination prior to January 1, 1995, 12 who has at least 15 years of experience in public works operations 13 and, prior to the date of application for the examination, has 14 served for the last five consecutive years in the position of 15 principal public works manager, shall not be required to complete 16 17 a public works manager program as described in subsection b. of 18 this section, except that any such applicant who fails to pass the examination for a certified public works manager shall 19 20 successfully complete a certified public works manager program, 21 as established under subsection b. of this section, prior to being 22 eligible for reexamination. 23

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- 2. Section 3 of P.L.1991, c.258 (C.40A:9-154.6c) is amended to read as follows:
- 3. a. Notwithstanding the examination requirements in section 2 of this act, the director shall issue, upon receipt of an application within one year after the effective date of this act and the payment of a fee of \$25 to the order of the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey, a public works manager certificate to any applicant who has successfully completed a certified public works manager program described in section 2 of this act, is not less than 21 years of age, is a citizen of the United States, is of good moral character, has obtained a high school diploma as described in section 2 of this act, and has at least 10 years of experience in public works operations, and has served in a position of management responsibility for any local unit of government for five consecutive years prior to the date of application for certification.
- b. A professional engineer licensed pursuant to P.L.1938, c.342 (C.45:8-27 et seq.) who is employed on a full time basis by a county or municipal engineering or public works department in this State for five years in a position of management <u>certification</u> responsibility shall be exempt from the requirements of P.L.1991, c.258 (C.40A:9-154.6a et seq.), and the director shall issue or reissue a public works manager certificate to that professional engineer upon receipt of an application, which shall include proof of these experience requirements and a current professional engineer license issued pursuant to P.L.1938, c.342 (C.45:8-27 et seq.).
- 51 c. A professional engineer licensed pursuant to P.L.1938, c.342 (C.45:8-27 et seq.) who has at least five years of public works experience in this State, requiring the exercise of management responsibility for the activities of a public works department or

any subdivision thereof in the 10 years immediately preceding application for examination, shall not be required to complete a public works manager program as described in subsection b. of section 2 of P.L.1991, c.258 (C.40A:9-154.6b), except that any such applicant who fails to pass the examination for a certified public works manager shall successfully complete a certified public works manager program prior to being eligible for reexamination.

(cf: P.L.1991, c.258, s.3)

3. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill would exempt an applicant for a public works manager certificate who has at least 15 years of experience in public works operations and who has served in the position of principal public works manager for five consecutive years prior to the date of application for the examination, from a certification requirement of P.L.1991, c.258 (C.40A:9-154.6a et seq.) which requires that an applicant graduate from a public works manager program from Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey, or a program certified as its equivalent by the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs. However, if the applicant fails to pass the examination for a certified public works manager the bill requires that the applicant successfully complete a certified public works manager program, prior to being eligible for reexamination.

The bill further provides that a licensed engineer is eligible for a public works manager certificate upon submission of a written request and application to the Director of Local Government Services. The application shall include proof of the applicant's current professional engineers license and the experience requirements. These applicants will also be subject to the fee requirements established under section 8 of P.L.1991, c.258 (C.40A:9-154.6h) for initial licensure and annual renewals.

The bill also provides that a professional engineer licensed pursuant to P.L.1938, c.342 (C.45:8-27 et seq.), with at least five years of public works experience in the State of New Jersey, who applies for the examination shall also be exempt from the requirement that they complete a public works manager program. However, if the applicant fails to pass the examination for a certified public works manager, the bill requires that the applicant successfully complete a certified public works manager program, prior to being eligible for reexamination.

Exempts certain persons from education requirements and licensed professional engineers from education, testing and fee requirements for public works manager certification.

The Assembly Commerce and Regulated Professions Committee reports favorably Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 307.

This committee substitute amends P.L.1991, c.258 (C.40A:9-154.6a et seq.), which concerns the certification of public works managers.

The committee substitute amends the definition section of P.L.1991, c.258 in the following manner: "public works manager" is amended so that it applies to a person who in at least 5 of the last 10 years, has served in a position of public or private public works, construction management or civil management position where fifty percent of the person's work time was directly spent in daily, direct supervision of public works activities; a new definition is established for a "certified public works manager;" and a "principal public works manager" is a certified public works manager who, in regard to public works activities conducted by the municipality advises municipal elected officials and employees in proper compliance and administration of the various technical practices, laws, regulations, operations management techniques. In addition "public works department" is replaced by "public works activity" and maintenance of drainage is added as part of this definition.

The duties of the Public Works Advisory Board is also revised to denote its role in reviewing the certification examination, assisting in evaluating qualifications for granting certificates, reviewing municipal applications for exemption from the provisions of P.L.1991, c.258, and reviewing continuing education programs.

The committee substitute changes the membership of the Public Works Advisory Board by increasing its membership from five persons to nine persons. It specifies that the designee from the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs shall serve as chair of the board. It states that the public works manager appointees to the board shall hold certified public works manager certificates. The additional members who are public works managers holding public works manager certificates are to be members of the New Jersey Society of Municipal Engineers, the New Jersey chapter of the American Public Works Association and the Public Works Association of New Jersey. Also, two members are to be representatives from the New Jersey State League of Municipalities.

The committee substitute also provides that the governing body or chief executive officer of each municipality, as appropriate, shall appoint a principal public works manager for that municipality commencing January 1, 1997. This changes current law, which specifies that commencing January 1, 1995, no person shall be appointed or reappointed or serve as a principal public works manager unless he holds a public works manager certificate issued pursuant to the provisions of P.L.1991, c.258. In addition, the committee substitute establishes criteria by which a municipality that conducts minimal or no public works activity may apply to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services for an exemption from this provision regarding the appointment of a principal public works manager. Additionally, penalty provisions are established for the members of a governing body or a mayor who refuses to comply with the aforementioned requirements after having received an order from the director to do so.

The Senate Community Affairs Committee reports favorably Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly, No. 307.

The substitute amends P.L.1991, c.258 (C.40A:9-154.6a et seq.), which concerns the certification of public works managers. The substitute amends definitions contained in section 1 of P.L.1991, c.258 (C.40A:9-154.6a) in the following manner:

"public works manager" would mean a person who in at least 5 of the last 10 years. has served in a position of public or private public works, construction management or civil engineering in which fifty percent of the person's work time was directly spent in daily, direct supervision of public works activities;

"principal public works manager" would mean a certified public works manager who, in regard to public works activities conducted by the municipality advises municipal elected officials and employees in proper compliance and administration of the various laws, regulations, technical practices, operations and management techniques;

a new definition would be established for "certified public works manager" which would mean a public works manager who has either:

completed the requirements of section 2 of P.L.1991, c.258 (C.40A:9-154.6b);

graduated with a bachelor or greater degree in civil or related public works engineering, and is a licensed professional engineer in New Jersey;

served in one or more municipalities continuously for the five years prior to January 1, 1997, except that certification for such a person would be limited to the municipality in which the public works manager is employed at the time the application for certification pursuant to section 3 of P.L.1991, c.258 (C.40A:9-154.6c) is submitted; or

graduated as a certified public works manager from Rutgers, the State University prior to August 13, 1993.

Additionally, the term "public works department" would be replaced by the term "public works activity" and maintenance of drainage would be added as part of the definition.

The substitute revises the duties of the Public Works Advisory Board to denote its role in reviewing the certification examination, assisting in evaluating qualifications for granting certificates, reviewing municipal applications for exemption from the provisions of P.L.1991, c.258, and reviewing continuing education programs. The board would be required to meet at least one time each year.

The substitute would increase the membership of the Public Works Advisory Board from five persons to nine persons and specify criteria for board membership. The board member who is the designee from the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs would serve as chair of the board. The public works manager appointees to the board would be required to hold certified public works manager certificates.

The substitute requires the governing body or chief executive officer of each municipality, as appropriate, to appoint a principal public works manager for that municipality commencing January 1, 1997. Current law provides that commencing January 1, 1995, no person shall be appointed or reappointed or serve as a principal public works manager unless that person holds a public works manager certificate issued pursuant to the provisions of P.L.1991, c.258. Under the substitute, penalty provisions would be established for a member of a governing body or a mayor who refuses to comply with the appointment requirement after having received an order from the director to appoint a principal public works manager. Finally, the bill would establish criteria by which a municipality that conducts minimal or no public works activity may apply to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services for an exemption from this provision regarding the appointment of a principal public works manager.

Although the substitute indicates that a municipal governing body or chief executive officer must "appoint" a principal public works manager and may "appoint" a temporary principal public works manager, it is the committee's understanding that the job function of principal public works manager would not be a position or title, as those terms are utilized by the Department of Personnel, but would rather be an advisory role.

ASSEMBLY COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 307

To the General Assembly:

Pursuant to Article V, Section I, Paragraph 14 of the New Jersey Constitution, I am returning the Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 307 with my recommendations for reconsideration.

A. Summary of Bill

This bill would revise the 1991 law which established the Public Works Advisory Board, the purpose of which was to assist the Department of Community Affairs with public works issues and licensing. The intent of the bill is to clarify the 1991 law and to facilitate compliance with and enforcement of the requirements of the 1991 law concerning public works managers.

B. Recommended Action

While I agree with the goal of this bill, I have been advised by certain State departments that some of the bill's provisions conflict with the Civil Service Act or current practice regarding the fees associated with the administration of examinations as well as with initial and renewed certification. I also have been made aware of concerns that certain dates in the bill should be revised in the interest of fairness to applicants.

For these reasons, I herewith return the Assembly Committee

Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 307 and recommend that it be amended as follows:
