INTRODUCED JANUARY 18, 1915.

By Mr. SCUDDER.

Referred to Committee on Miscellaneous Business.

AN ACT to regulate the preparation of plans and specifications and the awarding of contracts for the erection, construction and alteration of public buildings in this State.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:*

1 1. Hereafter in the preparation of plans and specifications for the erection,  
2 construction, alteration or repair of any public buildings in this State, whether the  
3 same is to be erected, altered or repaired by the State or any political subdivision  
4 thereof, when the entire cost of such work will exceed one thousand dollars in amount,  
5 it shall be the duty of the architect, engineer or other person preparing such plans  
6 and specifications, to prepare separate plans and specifications for the plumbing and  
7 gas fitting, and all work kindred thereto, and of the steam and hot-water heating  
8 and ventilating apparatus, steam power plants and work kindred thereto, and elec-  
9 trical work; and it shall be the further duty of the board or body, person or per-  
10 sons authorized by law to award contracts for the erection, construction, alteration  
11 or repair of any such public building, to advertise for, in the manner provided by  
12 law, and to receive separate bids for each of said branches of work, and to award  
13 contracts for the same to the lowest responsible bidder for each of such branches  
14 respectively.

1 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, and this  
2 act shall take effect immediately.

## STATEMENT.

The object of this bill is to make it mandatory, in preparing plans and specifications for construction, alteration or repair of public buildings, where same is to cost more than one thousand dollars, to prepare separate plans and specifications for plumbing and gas fitting and kindred work; steam and hot-water heating and ventilating apparatus, steam power plants and kindred work, and electrical work, and to advertise for separate bids on such work. This conforms to existing laws in a number of other States, including New York and Pennsylvania.

AN ACT to amend the title and also the body of an act entitled "An act to protect persons performing labor or furnishing materials for the construction, alteration or repair of public works," approved February sixteenth, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1 1. The title of the act mentioned in the title of this act is hereby amended to  
2 read as follows:

3 An Act to protect persons performing labor or employed by contractors upon  
4 public works, and to secure claims of persons who furnish [furnishing] materials,  
5 supplies, teams, implements or machinery used or consumed by such contractors in  
6 and about the performance of such [for the construction, alteration or repair of pub-  
7 lic] works.

1 2. Section one of the act mentioned in the title hereof is hereby amended so as  
2 to read as follows:

3 1. When public buildings or other public works or improvements are about to be  
4 constructed, erected, altered or repaired under contract, at the expense of the State or  
5 any county, city, town, township, village, borough, municipality governed by a board  
6 of commissioners, or improvement commission, or school district thereof, it shall be  
7 the duty of the board, officer or agent, contracting on behalf of the State or any  
8 county, city, town, township, village, borough, municipality governed by a board of  
9 commissioners, or improvement commission, or school district, to require the usual

10 bond, as provided for in the statute, with good and sufficient sureties, with an addi-  
 11 tional obligation for the payment by the contractor, and by all subcontractors, for all  
 12 labor performed or materials [furnished], provisions, provender or other supplies,  
 13 teams, fuel, oils, implements or machinery used or consumed in, upon, for or about  
 14 the construction, erection, alteration, or repair of such building, works or improve-  
 15 ments.

1 3. Section two of the act mentioned in the title hereof is hereby amended so as  
 2 to read as follows :

3 2. Such bond shall be executed by such contractor with such sureties as shall be  
 4 approved by the board, officer or agent acting on behalf of the State or any county,  
 5 city, town, township, village, borough, municipality governed by a board of commis-  
 6 sioners, or improvement commission, or school district aforesaid, in an amount equal  
 7 to at least one hundred per centum (100%) of the contract price, and conditioned for  
 8 the payment by the contractor, and by all subcontractors, or his or its subcontractor,  
 9 of all indebtedness which may accrue to any person, firm or corporation, in an amount  
 10 not exceeding the sum specified in the bond, on account of any labor performed or  
 11 materials [furnished], provisions, provender or other supplies, or teams, fuel, oils,  
 12 implements or machinery used or consumed in, upon for or about [in] the con-  
 13 struction, erection, alteration or repair to such building, works or improvements.  
 14 Such bond shall be deposited with, and held by, such board, officer or agent for the  
 15 use of any party interested therein.

1 4. Section three of the act mentioned in the title hereof is hereby amended so as  
 2 to read as follows :

3 3. Any person, firm or corporation to whom any money shall be due on account  
 4 of having performed any labor, or furnished any [material] materials, provisions,  
 5 provender or other supplies, teams, fuel, oils, implements or machinery in, upon,  
 6 for or about the construction, erection, alteration or repair of any such building, work  
 7 or improvement, within eighty (80) days after the acceptance thereof by the duly au-  
 8 thorized board or officer, shall furnish the sureties on said bond a statement of the  
 9 amount due to any such person, firm, or corporation. No suit shall be brought against  
 10 said sureties on said bond until the expiration of sixty (60) days after the furnishing

11 of said statement. If said indebtedness shall not be paid in full at the expiration of  
12 said sixty days, said person, firm or corporation may bring an action in his or its own  
13 name upon such bond, said action to be commenced within one year from the date  
14 of the acceptance of said building, work or improvement. And upon the trial of any  
15 such action, the court shall award to the prevailing party a reasonable attorney's fee,  
16 to be taxed as costs, and to be included in the judgment therein rendered.

1 5. Section four of the act mentioned in the title hereof is hereby amended so as  
2 to read as follows:

3 4. The bond hereinbefore provided for shall be substantially the following form,  
4 and recovery of any claimant thereunder shall be subject to the conditions and pro-  
5 visions of this act to the same extent as if such conditions and provisions were fully  
6 incorporated in said bond form.

7 Know all men by these presents, that we, the undersigned.....  
8 ..... as principal and.....as sureties, are hereby  
9 held and firmly bound unto.....in the penal sum of  
10 ..... dollars, for the payment of which well and truly  
11 to be made, we hereby jointly and severally bind ourselves, our heirs, executors, ad-  
12 ministrators, successors and assigns.

24 oils, implements or machinery furnished, used or consumed in the carrying forward,  
25 performing or completing of said contract, we agreeing and assenting that this under-

26 taking shall be for the benefit of any subcontractor, materialman, [or] laborer, per-  
27 son, firm or corporation having a just claim, as well as for the obligee herein; then  
28 this obligation shall be void; otherwise the same shall remain in full force and effect;  
29 it being expressly understood and agreed that the liability of the surety for any and  
30 all claims hereunder shall in no event exceed the penal amount of this obligation as  
31 herein stated.

32 The said surety hereby stipulates and agrees that no modifications, omissions or  
33 additions in or to the terms of the said contract or in or to the plans or specifica-  
34 tions therefor shall in any wise affect the obligation of said surety on its bond.

35 6. [This act shall take effect immediately.] All acts or parts of acts inconsistent  
36 herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

37 7. This act shall take effect immediately.

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#### STATEMENT

The purpose of this act is to broaden the scope of protection of bonds to those who supply labor, materials, provisions, provender or other supplies including teams, fuel, oils, implements or machinery used or consumed in the furtherance or completion of contracts concerning public works in line with similar statutes in other States so that all suppliers should be so protected.

Introduced as Assembly 113 by Mr. Scudder on January 18, 1915. This was passed as originally introduced and had the following statement:

The object of this is to make mandatory, in preparing plans and specifications for construction alteration or repair of public buildings, where same is to cost more than one thousand dollars, to prepare separate plans and specifications for plumbing and gas fitting and kindred work; steam and hot-water heating and ventilating apparatus, steam power plants and kindred work, and electrical work, and to advertise for separate bids on such work. This conforms to existing laws in a number of other states, including New York and Pennsylvania.

L. 1931, Chapter 18

Introduced as Senate 141 by Mr. Yates, on February 2, 1931. The original bill intended to change the 1915 bill by adding the word "all" in the first sentence after "steam power plants and" and adding the phrase "structural steel and ornamental iron work" after the words "electrical work". Later Mr. Yates offered an amendment which struck out the word "all" which he added in the original bill and struck out the phrase "This act shall take effect immediately".

Unanimous consent was given both these amendments. Then Mr. Yates offered another amendment changing "\$1,000" to "\$50,000". This bill became law March 23, 1931. However, this provision was changed almost immediately.

L. 1931, Chapter 364

Introduced as Assembly 119 by Mr. Siracusa, January 26, 1931. The original A-119 was a completely different bill from the one which was later passed and amended a different act. It had a statement of purpose but since its subject matter is not related to the bills which we are dealing with here, it is of no help. The Committee Substitute for A-119, which was adopted April 20, 1931, makes two changes in the previous bill. It changes the amount of "\$50,000" back to "\$1,000", and adds the word "all" in "steam power plants and all work kindred thereto...".
