STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED FEBRUARY 16, 1948

AN ACT concerning the State Department of Institutions and Agencies, and amending sections 30:1-7, 30:4-136 and 30:4-146 of the Revised Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. Section 30:1-7 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

2 30:1-7. Within the limitations imposed by general legislation applicable
3 to all agencies of the State, the State Board is hereby granted complete and
4 exclusive jurisdiction, supreme and final authority, and the requisite power
5 to accomplish its aims and purposes in and upon the institutions, boards,
6 commissions and other agencies, hereinafter in this section named, and des-
7 ignated as charitable, hospital, relief, training institutions and correctional
8 institutions of this State, to the end that they shall be humanely, scientifi-
9 cally, efficiently and economically operated. Any particular grant of power
10 hereinafter in this Title contained shall be in specification but not in lim-
11 itation of this general grant of power.

12 The charitable, hospital, relief and training institutions and noninstitu-
13 tional agencies of this State, within the meaning of this Title, shall include
14 the following, and, as well, any institution established hereafter for any
15 similar purpose, as now established and as the same are to be hereafter
16 maintained and operated pursuant to law:

17 New Jersey State Hospital at Trenton,
18 New Jersey State Hospital at Greystone Park,

19 New Jersey State Hospital at Marlboro,
 20 New Jersey State Village for Epileptics at Skillman,
 21 New Jersey Sanatorium for Tuberculous Diseases at Glen Gardner,
 22 North Jersey Training School at Totowa,
 23 State Colony for Feeble-Minded Males at New Lisbon,
 24 State Colony for Feeble-Minded Males at Woodbine,
 25 Vineland State School at Vineland,
 26 New Jersey Memorial Home for Disabled Soldiers at Menlo Park,
 27 New Jersey Memorial Home for Disabled Soldiers, Sailors, Marines
 28 and their Wives and Widows at Vineland,
 29 Diagnostic Center at Menlo Park,
 30 Arthur Brisbane Child Treatment Center at Allaire,
 31 State Board of Child Welfare [children's guardians] at Trenton,
 32 Commission for the amelioration of the condition of the blind at Newark.
 33 The correctional institutions of this State, within the meaning of this
 34 Title, shall include the following, and as well, any institution established
 35 hereafter for any similar purpose, as now established and as the same are
 36 to be hereafter maintained and operated pursuant to law:
 37 New Jersey State Prison at Trenton,
 38 New Jersey State Prison Farm at Rahway [Bordentown],
 39 New Jersey State Prison Farm at Leesburg,
 40 New Jersey Reformatory at Bordentown [Rahway],
 41 New Jersey Reformatory for Women at Clinton,
 42 New Jersey Reformatory at Annandale,
 43 State Home for Boys at Jamesburg,
 44 State Home for Girls at Trenton.

1 2. Section 30:4-136 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as
 2 follows:

3 30:4-136. The State Prison shall include the existing prison in Tren-
 4 ton or wherever it may hereafter be located, and all institutions, farms,

5 camps, quarries or grounds designated by the State Board where convicts
6 sentenced to the State Prison may from time to time be kept, housed or
7 employed.

1 3. Section 30:4-146 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as
2 follows:

3 30:4-146. The New Jersey Reformatory shall include the existing re-
4 formatory near Bordentown [Rahway] and all farms, camps, quarries or
5 grounds designated by the State Board, where persons sentenced to the
6 reformatory may, from time to time, be kept, housed or employed.

1 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to include the newly authorized and established Diagnostic Center at Menlo Park and the Arthur Brisbane Child Treatment Center at Allaire within those institutions designated in section 30:1-7, Revised Statutes, and under the jurisdiction of the State Board of Control of Institutions and Agencies. A further amendment is made to this section to properly identify the State Board of Child Welfare, formerly the State Board of Children's Guardians, pursuant to the provisions of chapter 257, P. L. 1947, authorizing this change in name.

This bill is further designed to arrange for the admission into the existing facilities at Rahway of persons committed to the State Prison and to permit admission in the existing facilities at Bordentown of persons confined on indeterminate sentences at Rahway Reformatory.

This change is made necessary by the fact that the circumstances which existed at the time of the erection of the facilities at Bordentown have become so materially changed that it is desirable for the welfare of all inmates concerned to direct the commitments in the manner provided for in this bill. The change will result in vastly improved administration of the penal and correctional system in the State, will relieve existing overcrowding and create an improved service to the inmates and to society.

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
