AN ACT validating elections in school districts sanctioning the increase in membership of the Board of Education from five members to nine members.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:*

1 1. In all school districts in this State where an election has been held for the
2 purpose of increasing the membership of the Board of Education from five to nine
3 members, and such increase was sanctioned by the qualified voters of the school
4 district at an election held for that purpose, and such appointments have been made
5 in accordance with the referendum held, such election and such appointments are
6 hereby validated and confirmed notwithstanding the population or the number of
7 inhabitants in such school district did not amount to forty-five thousands or up-
8 wards.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

In Irvington an election was held to increase the school board from five to nine members. The 1930 statute provides that the 1920 Federal census should control; Irvington at the time of the election had more than 45,000 inhabitants and the legal voters authorized this increase. The design of this bill is to overcome the obstacle created by the 1930 statute.
