Introduced February 10 by Senator Stout.

Statement on bill:

"The purpose of the bill is to clarify the
Unemployment Compensation Law by the express
exclusion therefrom of home-to-home salespersons
and in-the-home demonstrators whose remuneration
consists wholly of commissions or commissions
and bonuses, as such individuals are independent
contractors not subject to the Federal Social
Security Act, and such commissions and bonuses
can form no practical basis for the ultimate
payment of benefits."
