AN ACT to fix the work-week for the State service and to provide for compensatory time off or compensation for overtime services.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. The work-week for basic annual salary for employees in the State
2 service, in so far as practicable and except as provided in section two of
3 this act, shall not be more than forty hours; and, notwithstanding any
4 inconsistent provisions of law, any employee in the State service who is
5 authorized or required to work in any week more than the hours of work
6 established as the regular and normal work-week for that class or agency
7 shall be eligible to receive either compensatory time off or compensation
8 for the hours worked in excess of the established work-week for that class
9 or agency at a rate representing a proration of the annual salary rate of the
10 individual employee in accordance with the following formula:

- 11 a. Hourly rate to be equivalent to 1/2000th of the annual rate.
12 b. Per diem rate to be equivalent to 1/250th of the annual rate.
13 c. Weekly rate to be equivalent to 1/50th of the annual rate.

1 2. The State Treasurer, the President of the Civil Service Commission,
2 the Director of Budget and Accounting in the Department of the Treasury,
3 the chairman of the appropriations committee of the Senate and the chair-
4 man of the appropriations committee of the House of Assembly shall have

5 authority to designate the classes of positions or individual positions to
 6 which the provisions of this act shall apply and may exclude from such
 7 designations any class of positions or individual positions where the condi-
 8 tions of employment and the nature of the duties performed or the difficulty
 9 of maintaining adequate time controls make it impracticable to establish a
 10 specific work-week and to apply to such classes of positions or individual
 11 positions the provisions of this act; shall determine the eligibility of any
 12 employee or any class of employees in the State service to receive com-
 13 pensatory time off or overtime compensation, in accordance with the provi-
 14 sions of this act; and shall promulgate such rules and regulations as, in
 15 their discretion, appear to be necessary in order to achieve an equitable
 16 application of the provisions of this act.

1 3. This act shall take effect July first, one thousand nine hundred and
 2 fifty-one.

STATEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to fix the work-week for the State service and to
 establish procedures providing for compensatory time off or compensation for
 overtime services.

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
