A SUPPLEMENT to the "Department of Law and Public Safety Act of 1948," approved October 15, 1948 (P. L. 1948, c. 439) and repealing section 8 of chapter 20 of the laws of 1944.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. Assistant deputy Attorneys General in the Division of Law in the De-
2 partment of Law and Public Safety not exceeding 6 in number at any one
3 time may be appointed by the Attorney General to permanent positions in
4 the classified service without competitive examination from among those
5 assistant Attorneys General and deputy Attorneys General who have served
6 at least 5 years in the aggregate in such capacities. Assistant deputy At-
7 torneys General shall devote their entire time to the performance of their
8 duties in the Division of Law and shall not be removed from such positions
9 except in the manner provided under the provisions of Title 11 of the Re-
10 vised Statutes relating to permanent employees in the classified service.

1 2. Nothing in this act shall be construed to deprive any person of any
2 tenure rights or of any other right or protection provided him under any
3 other law.

1 3. Section 8 of "An act to establish a Department of Law in the State
2 Government," approved March 7, 1944, is repealed.

1 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

STATEMENT

This bill revises the provisions of existing law as to the manner of appointment to career legal positions in the Division of Law and establishes a nucleus of able, career attorneys on a permanent basis in the Attorney General's office. The bill implements a proposal contained in the Report of the Governor's Committee on Efficiency and Economy in State Government.
