## CHAPTER 21

AN ACT concerning the mandatory retirement age of police chiefs and fire department chiefs and amending P.L.2022, c.9.

**BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:*

1. Section 1 of P.L.2022, c.9 (C.43:16A-5.3) is amended to read as follows:

C.43:16A-5.3 Certain PFRS members may remain within system until specified deadline.

1. a. A member of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System, established pursuant to P.L.1944, c.255 (C.43:16A-1 et seq.), who:

is serving as a police chief of a law enforcement agency or a chief of a fire department on the effective date of P.L.2022, c.9; and

will attain the age of 65 years during the period commencing on the effective date of P.L.2022, c.9 and ending on the last day of the 60th calendar month following that effective date,

may remain a member of the system, notwithstanding the mandatory retirement provision of section 5 of P.L.1944, c.255 (C.43:16A-5), until the end of the calendar year in which the member attains the age of 67 years if the appointing authority approves, in writing, the retention and continued service after the age of 65 years of the police or fire chief as the chief.

b. Within 30 days after the last day of the 60th calendar month following the effective date of P.L.2022, c.9, the Board of Trustees of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System shall submit a report to the Governor, and the Legislature pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), on the effect of this section on the retirement system. The report shall include the number of members who were retained and continued to serve as the police or fire chief, the length of that service after the age of 65 years, and the impact of that extended service on the retirement system.

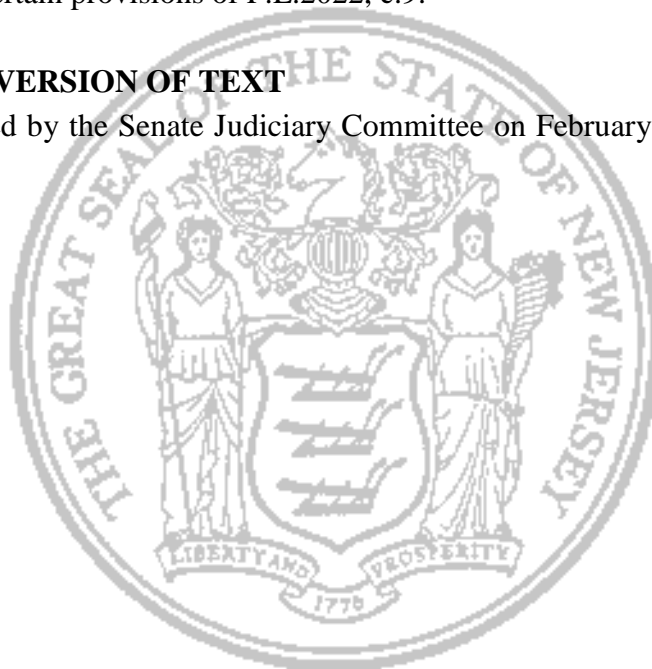

# **STATE OF NEW JERSEY**

DATED: FEBRUARY 20, 2025

The Senate Judiciary Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 3735.

Under current law, a member of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System (PFRS) hired on or after January 1, 1987 is required to retire upon reaching the age of 65 years, however P.L.2022, c.9, which took effect April 12, 2022, permitted a member who is a police chief or fire department chief to remain in PFRS and serve until the end of the calendar year in which the chief reaches the age of 67 years under the following circumstances:

- the member was serving as a chief on the enactment's effective date of April 12, 2022; and
- the member attained the age of 65 years during a period commencing on that effective date and ending on the last day of the 24th month next following (April 30, 2024), and the appointing authority approved, in writing, the member's retention and continued service as chief after the age of 65 years.

This bill amends P.L.2022, c.9 to reestablish and extend the period of time within which an eligible chief may be able to remain in PFRS based upon when that chief attains the age of 65 years. Under the bill, this period would now be measured from the original effective date of April 12, 2022 and end on the last day of the 60th month following that effective date (April 30, 2027).

The requirement that the PFRS Board of Trustees submit a report to the Governor and Legislature regarding the effects on the retirement system by the membership extension for chiefs would be changed to also be just after 60 months following the original law's effective date to reflect the eligibility of additional chiefs to extend their membership in accordance with the bill.

The committee amendments to the bill:

- extend the period of time, by an additional year, during which an eligible police or fire department chief may be able to remain in PFRS and continue service as a chief based upon when that chief attains the otherwise required retirement age of 65 years.

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 4904.

As amended and reported, this bill extends certain provisions of P.L.2022, c.9. Under current law, a member of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System (PFRS) is required to retire upon reaching age 65. However, a member of PFRS who: is serving as a police chief of a law enforcement agency or a chief of a fire department on the effective date of P.L.2022, c.9 (April 12, 2022); and will attain the age of 65 years during the period commencing on that effective date and ending on the last day of the 24th calendar month following that effective date (in the year 2024), may remain a member of the system, notwithstanding the mandatory retirement age, until the end of the calendar year in which the member attains the age of 67 years if the appointing authority approves, in writing, the retention and continued service after the age of 65 years of the police or fire chief as the chief. Additionally, PFRS members hired prior to January 1, 1987 may remain a member of the system until the member attains 68 years of age or 25 years of creditable service, whichever comes first.

As amended by the committee, the bill extends by three additional years the ability of a member of PFRS who is serving as a police or fire chief on the effective date of P.L.2022, c.9 and will attain the mandatory retirement age of 65 years within the period commencing on that effective date and ending on the last day of the 24th calendar month following that effective date. This bill extends the 24th calendar month date by three years, to be the 60th calendar month after the enactment of P.L.2022, c.9.

#### COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

The committee amended the bill to delete the reference to the 48th calendar month, and to replace it with a reference to the 60th calendar month after the enactment of P.L.2022, c.9.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

This bill is not certified as requiring a fiscal note.

# Acting Governor Way Takes Action on Legislation

02/28/2025

**TRENTON** – Today, Acting Governor Way signed the following bills into law:

**S4136/A5343 (Sarlo, Bucco/Atkins, McCann Stamato)** - Authorizes public bodies to continue using newspapers for required public notices and legal advertisements until certain specified date regardless of format; requires submission of certain subscription and other data.
