INTRODUCED JANUARY 31, 1966

AN ACT concerning certain pensioners, and amending section 43:3-5 of the Revised Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*  
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. Section 43:3-5 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:  
2 43:3-5. The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to any appoint-  
3 ment of a temporary nature made or created by any rule or order of pro-  
4 cedure of any court of this State, so as to interfere with any rule or order of  
5 procedure in such courts for the proper administration of justice therein;  
6 nor shall the provisions of this chapter apply to any person appointed to the  
7 office of court crier in any court where the term of such office is indefinite, or  
8 to any person who is appointed to the office of magistrate of any municipal  
9 court in a municipality having a population of less than 5,000, where the sal-  
10 ary paid to such municipal magistrate is less than the amount of his pension;  
11 nor to the appointment and employment of any pensioned former municipal  
12 manager or licensed accountant as an engineer or consultant or member of  
13 any commission or board by any municipality, county or by the State, or as  
14 a teacher or lecturer in any school or educational institution in the State; *nor*  
15 *to the appointment and employment of any pensioned law enforcement offi-*  
16 *cer as a teacher or lecturer in any university or college, including 2-year col-*  
17 *leges, in the State or in an educational program conducted by the Police*

18 *Training Commission of the Department of Law and Public Safety*; nor to  
19 the employment, by the State or by any county, municipality or school dis-  
20 trict in any position or employment, to the duties of which the holder  
21 thereof is not required to devote his full time, at a salary or compensation of  
22 not more than \$1,800.00 per calendar year, of any person who is receiving or  
23 who shall be entitled to receive any pension or subsidy from this or any other  
24 State or any county, municipality or school district of this or any other  
25 State; nor to any person who has or who may hereafter receive permanent  
26 disability in the performance of his duty while serving as a member of the  
27 Armed Forces of the United States, the New Jersey State Police, or the police  
28 department, or the fire department of any county or municipality in this  
29 State. The provisions of this section shall not authorize the employment as  
30 a policeman or fireman of any person who is receiving or shall be entitled to  
31 receive any pension or subsidy from this or any other State or any county,  
32 municipality, or school district of this or any other State as a result of serv-  
33 ices as a member of a police department or a fire department.

1        2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Assembly Bill No. 171, if enacted, would broaden the "Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund-Social Security Integration Act" to permit any member, as defined in section 14 thereof, who has been employed in a public school temporarily as a teacher, or substitute teacher, for a continuous period of one or more years prior to becoming a member of the Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund shall be permitted to make contributions covering such service in accordance with the rules and regulations of the board of trustees of the said Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund, and receive the same annuity and pension credits as if he had been a member during such service.

It is estimated that 10,000 of the eligible members will avail themselves of the benefits added by this bill, and the cost thereof to the State the first year will be \$6,655,600.00.

The cost to the State in each subsequent fiscal year will depend on how many members delay the purchase of such service.
