INTRODUCED FEBRUARY 21, 1928.

Referred to Committee on Revision and Amendment of the Laws.

AN ACT to prohibit false labels and misrepresentation in the sale of certain food products, and provide penalties for the violation thereof.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:*

1 1. On and after the passage of this act any one who shall sell or expose for  
2 sale in any restaurant or hotel, or other place where food products are sold, any  
3 article of food falsely represented as kosher, either by direct statements, orally or in  
4 writing, or by the display of the word "kosher" in English or Hebrew letters, or by  
5 the display of any sign or mark in simulation of such word, or by display of any  
6 insignia, six-pointed star, or any mark which might reasonably be calculated to de-  
7 ceive or lead a reasonable person to believe that a representation is being made that  
8 the food sold is kosher, or prepared in accordance with orthodox Hebrew religious  
9 requirements, or any person who, with intent to defraud, sells or exposes for sale any  
10 meat or meat preparation and falsely represents the same to be kosher, whether such  
11 meat or meat preparations be raw or prepared for human consumption, or as having  
12 been prepared under and of a product or products sanctioned by the orthodox He-  
13 brew religious requirements; or falsely represents any food product or the  
14 contents of any package or container to be so constituted and prepared, by having  
15 or permitting to be inscribed thereon the word kosher in any language; or sells or  
16 exposes for sale in the same place of business both kosher and nonkosher meat or  
17 meat preparations, either raw or prepared, for human consumption, who fails to  
18 indicate on his window signs and all display advertising, in block letters at least four  
19 inches in height, "Kosher and nonkosher meat sold here;" or who exposes for sale

20 in any show window or place of business both kosher and nonkosher meat or meat  
21 preparations, either raw or prepared, for human consumption, who fails to display  
22 over each kind of meat or meat preparations so exposed a sign in block letters at  
23 least four inches in height, reading "kosher meat" or "nonkosher meat," as the case  
24 may be, is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than five hun-  
25 dred dollars, or by imprisonment of not less than twenty days or not more than six  
26 months, at the discretion of the court.

1       2. All acts and parts of act inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby  
2 repealed, and this act shall take effect immediately.
