1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. Section 18:14-1 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as fol-
2 lows:

3 18:14-1. Public schools shall be free to all persons over five and under
4 twenty years of age, and to such persons over the age of twenty years as
5 the board of education of any school district may deem it wise to offer in-
6 struction who are residents of the school district. Nonresidents of a school
7 district, if otherwise competent, may be admitted to the schools of a dis-
8 trict with the consent of the board of education upon such terms as the board
9 may prescribe; except that any nonresident of the district shall be admitted
10 free to the schools provided for the pupils residing in the district if such
11 nonresident is a child placed in the home of a resident of said district by
12 order of a court of competent jurisdiction in this State or by any society,
13 agency or institution incorporated and located in this State having for its
14 object the care and welfare of indigents neglected or abandoned children,
15 whether or not such resident is compensated for keeping such nonresident
16 child; but no district shall be required to take an unreasonable number of
17 nonresidents under this section without payment of tuition. Apportionment

18 for such pupils shall be made annually in accordance with the provisions of
19 section 18:10-24 and 18:23-14 of the Revised Statutes. Appeal from the
20 decision of the board of education of the district on any application under
21 this section may be taken to the county superintendent of schools of the
22 county in which said district is located and from his decision appeal may be
23 taken to the Commissioner of Education.
