AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An act concerning municipalities," approved March twenty-seventh, one thousand nine hundred seventeen.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1 1. Section one of Article XV of the act to which this act is an amendment be
2 and the same is hereby amended.

3 1. The governing body of every municipality shall have power to make, en-
4 force, amend or repeal ordinances to license and regulate:

5 (a) Hacks, coupes, cars, omnibuses, stages, wheel chairs, and all other ve-
6 hicles used for the transportation of passengers, baggage, merchandise, and goods
7 and chattels of any kind, and the owners and drivers of all such vehicles; and the
8 place or places or premises in which or at which the different kinds of business or
9 occupation mentioned herein are carried on and conducted;

10 (b) Cartmen, expressmen, baggagemen, porters, auctioneers, common criers,
11 hawkers, peddlers, pawnbrokers, employment agencies, junk shop keepers, junk
12 dealers, street sprinklers, bill posters, bill takers, sweeps, scavengers, transient mer-
13 chants or itinerant vendors of merchandise, medicine and remedies, and the place
14 or places or premises in which or at which the different kinds of business or occupa-
15 tions mentioned herein are carried on or conducted;

16 (c) Automobile garages, bathhouses, swimming pools, restaurants, hotels,
17 boarding houses, lodging houses, or other places used for sleeping or lodging pur-
18 poses, and the keepers thereof;

19 (d) Lumber and coal yards, stores for the sale of meats, groceries and pro-
20 visions, dry goods and merchandise, and goods and chattels of every kind, and all
21 other kinds of business conducted in such city other than those herein mentioned, the
22 place or places of business or premises in which or at which the different kinds of
23 business or occupations are to be carried on or conducted; traveling or other shows,
24 circuses, plays, dances, exhibitions, concerts, theatrical performances, and all street
25 parades in connection therewith; and also theatres, show houses, opera houses, con-
26 cert halls, dance halls, pool or billiard parlors, exhibition grounds, and all other
27 places of public amusement;

28 (e) All signs or other objects projecting beyond the building line, into or over
29 any public street or highway; also all street stands for the sale or distribution of
30 merchandise or other articles.

STATEMENT.

The purpose of this act is to include transient merchants among the subjects which the governing body of a municipality is authorized to license and regulate by ordinance.

A companion bill repealing chapter 181 of the Laws of 1921, in conjunction with this bill, will enable the municipalities to pass such ordinances making such regulations of the business of transient merchants and itinerant vendors as may be deemed proper in a specific locality.
