INTRODUCED FEBRUARY 4, 1929

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An act to amend an act entitled 'An act concerning municipalities,' approved March twenty-seventh, one thousand nine hundred seventeen," approved March twenty-ninth, one thousand nine hundred twenty-seven."

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1 1. Section one of Article XV of the act to which this act is an amendment be
2 and the same is hereby amended.

3 1. The governing body of every municipality shall have power to make, enforce,
4 amend or repeal ordinances to license and regulate; *provided, however,* that nothing
5 in this act contained shall be construed to authorize or empower the governing
6 body of any municipality to license or regulate any person, firm, partnership, corpora-
7 tion or association, holding a license or certificate issued by any department, board,
8 commission or other agency of the State of New Jersey.

9 (a) Hacks, coupes, cars, omnibuses, stages, wheel chairs, and all other vehicles
10 used for the transportation of passengers, baggage, merchandise, and goods and
11 chattels of any kind, and the owners and drivers of all such vehicles; and the place
12 or places or premises in which or at which the different kinds of business or occupa-
13 tion mentioned herein are carried on and conducted; *provided,* nothing herein con-
14 tained shall be construed as modifying or repealing any of the provisions of an act
15 entitled "An act concerning auto buses and their operation," approved March seven-
16 teenth, one thousand nine hundred and ixteen, as amended;

17 (b) Cartmen, expressmen, baggagemen, porters, auctioneers, common criers,
18 hawkers, peddlers, pawnbrokers, employment agencies, junk shop keepers, junk deal-
19 ers, motor vehicle junk dealers, street sprinklers, bill posters, bill tackers, sweeps,
20 scavengers, transient merchants or itinerant vendors of merchandise, medicine and
21 remedies, and the place or places or premises in which or at which the different kinds
22 of business or occupations mentioned herein are carried on or conducted; *provided*,
23 nothing herein contained shall be construed as modifying or repealing any of the pro-
24 visions of an act entitled "An act to license and regulate the business of transient
25 merchants or itinerant vendors in this State," approved April seventh, one thousand
26 nine hundred and twenty-one; but shall confer additional powers upon the munici-
27 pality.

28 (c) Automobile garages, dealers in second-hand motor vehicles and parts there-
29 of, bathhouses, swimming pools, restaurants, hotels, boarding houses, lodging houses,
30 or other places used for sleeping or lodging purposes, and the keepers thereof;

31 (d) Lumber and coal yards, stores for the sale of meats, groceries and pro-
32 visions, dry goods and merchandise, and goods and chattels of every kind, and all
33 other kinds of business conducted in such city other than those herein mentioned,
34 the place or places of business or premises in which or at which the different kinds
35 of business or occupations are to be carried on or conducted; traveling or other
36 shows, circuses, plays, dances, exhibitions, concerts, theatrical performances, and all
37 street parades in connection therewith; and also theatres, show houses, opera houses,
38 concert halls, dance halls, pool or billiard parlors, exhibitions grounds, and all other
39 places of public amusement;

40 (e) All signs or other objects projecting beyond the building line, into or over
41 any public street or highway; also all street stands for the sale or distribution of
42 merchandise or other articles.

STATEMENT

The purpose of this amendment to the Walsh Act is to enable the police to regulate and control dealers in second-hand motor vehicles and in this way prevent the sale of stolen cars.
