INTRODUCED FEBRUARY 1, 1943

AN ACT concerning municipalities, and supplementing chapter forty-eight of
Title 40 of the Revised Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. The governing body of every municipality shall have power to make,
2 enforce, amend and repeal ordinances requiring the owner or tenant of
3 lands lying within the limits of such municipality, where it shall be neces-
4 sary and expedient for the preservation of the public health, safety, general
5 welfare or to eliminate a fire hazard, to remove from such lands brush,
6 weeds, dead and dying trees, stumps, roots, obnoxious growths, filth, gar-
7 bage, trash and debris within five days after notice to remove the same, and
8 to provide for the removal of the same by or under the direction of some
9 officer of the municipality in cases where the owner or tenant shall have
10 refused or neglected to remove same in the manner and within the time pro-
11 vided above, and to provide for the imposition of penalties for the violation
12 of any such ordinance.

1 2. In all cases where brush, weeds, dead and dying trees, stumps, roots,
2 obnoxious growths, filth, garbage, trash and debris are removed from any
3 lands under any such ordinance by or under the direction of an officer of
4 the municipality, such officer shall certify the cost thereof to the governing
5 body, which shall examine the certificate, and if found correct shall cause the

6 cost as shown thereon to be charged against said lands; the amount so
7 charged shall forthwith become a lien upon such lands and shall be added
8 to and become and form part of the taxes next to be assessed and levied
9 upon such lands, the same to bear interest at the same rate as taxes, and
10 shall be collected and enforced by the same officers and in the same manner
11 as taxes.

1 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

The purpose of this act is to authorize municipalities to abate nuisances and eliminate fire hazards.
