DATED: AUGUST 3, 1976

This bill would provide that the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Protection, the Commissioner of the Department of Health, and the Secretary of Agriculture would be ex-officio members of the State Mosquito Control Commission.

The purpose of the bill is to recognize the interdepartmental nature of mosquito control problems and activities in the State. During past crisis situations in mosquito control, the three State departments have worked effectively to provide information and assistance to the various mosquito control agencies throughout the State. By providing for membership of these three State departments on the Mosquito Control Commission, the bill will facilitate the most effective utilization of the substantial State resources committed to mosquito control.

The Senate committee amendments provide that the board of freeholders shall include annually in the tax levy the amount of money which it believes is needed for mosquito control in the county rather than, as the existing law provides, the amount of money which the Director of the New Jersey State Agricultural Experiment Station at Rutgers believes is needed for mosquito control in each county. The purpose of the committee amendment is to facilitate the most effective utilization of the substantial county resources committed to mosquito control in a manner which integrates the work of the various county agencies concerned with protecting the environment and the public health.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

ADOPTED SEPTEMBER 23, 1976

Amend page 1, title, line 3, after “(P. L. 1956, c. 135)”, insert “and R. S. 26:9-23”.

Amend page 1, section 1, line 13, after line 13, add new section as follows:

“2. R. S. 26:9-23 is amended to read as follows:

26:9-23. The board of freeholders of the county or other body having control of the finances thereof, shall include annually in the tax levy the amount of money **[approved by the director]** *needed for mosquito control*; but in no year shall the amount so raised exceed the following amounts:

a. In counties where the assessed valuations are not more than **\$25,000,000.00**, a sum not greater than one mill on every dollar of assessed valuations.

b. In counties where the assessed valuations are not more than **\$50,000,000.00**, a sum not more than one-half of one mill on every dollar of assessed valuations.

c. In counties in which the assessed valuations are in excess of **\$50,000,000.00**, a sum of not more than one-quarter of one mill on every dollar of assessed valuations.”

Amend page 1, section 2, line 1, omit “2.”, insert “3.”
