AN ACT relating to the reorganization of the executive and administrative offices, departments, and instrumentalities of the State Government; constituting and concerning the State Department of Institutions and Agencies as a principal department in the executive branch of the State Government; amending sections 30:1-2, 30:1-8, 30:1-11, 30:7-1 and 30:7-2, and repealing sections 30:3-1 to 30:3-3, inclusive, of the Revised Statutes.

1 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. Section 30:1-2 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

2 30:1-2. The Department of Institutions and Agencies created by an act
3 entitled "An act concerning the charitable, hospital, relief, training, correc-
4 tional, reformatory and penal institutions, boards and commissions located
5 and conducted in this State, which are supported in whole or in part from
6 county, municipal or State funds," approved February 28, 1918 (L. 1918,
7 c. 147, p. 343, as amended by L. 1919, c. 97, p. 222), is continued and is
8 hereby constituted a principal department in the executive branch of the
9 State Government. Such department shall consist of the State Board of
10 Control of Institutions and Agencies, which shall be the head of the depart-
11 ment, and the Commissioner of Institutions and Agencies, who shall be the
12 principal executive officer of the department, with such divisions, bureaus,

13 branches, committees, officers and employees specifically referred to in said
14 act, or as may be constituted or employed by virtue of this Title.

1 2. Section 30:1-8 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

2 30:1-8. The State Board shall, subject to the approval of the Governor,
3 appoint a commissioner [, and fix his salary at an amount not exceeding ten
4 thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) per year unless otherwise provided by law].
5 The commissioner shall receive such salary as shall be provided by law. His
6 office shall be in the unclassified service list of the civil service. He shall
7 devote his entire time to the performance of his duties and shall, unless and
8 until removed by the Governor, hold office at the will of the State Board.
9 Appointment of a commissioner shall not be restricted to residents of the
10 State.

11 The commissioner may be removed from office by the Governor, upon
12 notice and opportunity to be heard.

1 3. Section 30:1-11 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

2 30:1-11. The commissioner shall be the [chief] principal executive and
3 administrative officer of the State Board and its official agent for all pur-
4 poses. Except as otherwise provided by law the commissioner shall be con-
5 sidered the "appointing authority" of the department [Within] within the
6 contemplation of the civil service laws [he shall be considered the "head"
7 of the department]. He shall likewise be the budget officer, and, unless some
8 other official be designated by the State Board for the purpose, he shall be
9 its fiscal officer. He shall have general charge and supervision of the work
10 of the department.

1 4. Section 30:7-1 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

2 30:7-1. The board of managers of the New Jersey Firemen's Home is
3 hereby constituted an agency within the State Department of Institutions and
4 Agencies and, notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the con-
5 trary, shall consist of the president of the New Jersey State Firemen's
6 Association, the Governor of the State, the State Commissioner of Banking

7 and Insurance and the State Comptroller and one member elected from each
8 county of the State and one additional member who shall be a fully paid fire-
9 man, elected from each of the counties of Essex and Hudson. The president
10 of such firemen's association, the Governor, the Commissioner of Banking and
11 Insurance and the State Comptroller, respectively, for the time being, shall be
12 ex-officio members of the board of managers.

13 The elected members shall be elected by the New Jersey State Firemen's
14 Association in annual convention assembled. They shall hold office for a
15 term of four years from the first day of October next succeeding their elec-
16 tion and until their successors are elected and qualify.

17 A vacancy occurring among the elected members other than by expira-
18 tion of a term shall be filled as follows: The president of the New Jersey
19 State Firemen's Association shall appoint from the county in which the
20 vacancy occurred a successor to serve until the first day of October next
21 succeeding the appointment and at the next annual meeting of the association
22 there shall be elected from the county in which the vacancy occurred a
23 member to serve for the balance of the unexpired term.

24 The members shall receive no compensation for their service but may be
25 reimbursed their actual expenses in connection with their duties as man-
26 agers from the funds of the home.

1 5. Section 30:7-2 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

2 30:7-2. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the contrary,
3 [The] the board of managers shall govern, manage and conduct the New
4 Jersey Firemen's Home, and, subject to the approval of the Governor, direct
5 and control its property and concerns, make by-laws, rules and regulations
6 and determine the compensation, duties and term of service of its officers and
7 employees.

1 6. Sections 30:3-1 to 30:3-3, inclusive, of the Revised Statutes are here-
2 by repealed.

1 7. This act shall take effect on the first day of July, one thousand nine
2 hundred and forty-eight, except that any appointment, and any confirmation
3 or approval of any appointment, permitted by this act may be made prior to
4 such date.

8 hereby constituted a principal department in the executive branch of the
9 State Government. Such department shall consist of the State Board of
10 Control of Institutions and Agencies, which shall be the head of the depart-
11 ment, and the Commissioner of Institutions and Agencies, who shall be the
12 principal executive officer of the department, with such divisions, bureaus,**

2 30:1-8. The State Board shall, subject to the approval of the Governor,

4 be provided by law. His office shall be in the unclassified service list of the
5 civil service. He shall devote his entire time to the performance of his
6 duties and shall, unless and until removed by the Governor, hold office at the
7 will of the State Board. Appointment of a commissioner shall not be re-
8 stricted to residents of the State.

9 The commissioner may be removed from office by the Governor, upon
10 notice and opportunity to be heard.

1 3. Section 30:1-11 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

2 30:1-11. The commissioner shall be the principal executive and admin-
3 istrative officer of the State Board and its official agent for all pur-
4 poses. Except as otherwise provided by law the commissioner shall be con-
5 sidered the "appointing authority" of the department within the contempla-
6 tion of the Civil Service laws. He shall likewise be the budget officer, and,
7 unless some other official be designated by the State Board for the purpose,
8 he shall be its fiscal officer. He shall have general charge and supervision
9 of the work of the department.

1 4. Section 30:7-1 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

2 30:7-1. The board of managers of the New Jersey Firemen's Home is
3 hereby constituted an agency within the State Department of Institutions and
4 Agencies and, notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the con-
5 trary, shall consist of the president of the New Jersey State Firemen's
6 Association, the Governor of the State, the State Commissioner of Banking

AN ACT relating to the reorganization of the executive and administrative offices, departments, and instrumentalities of the State Government: constituting and concerning the State Department of Education as a principal department in the executive branch of the State Government; amending sections 18:3-1 and 18:3-4 of the Revised Statutes and "An act to prevent and eliminate practices of discrimination in employment and otherwise against persons because of race, creed, color, national origin or ancestry; to create a division in the Department of Education to effect such prevention and elimination; and making an appropriation therefor," approved April sixteenth, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five (L. 1945, c. 169); and supplementing Title 18 of the Revised Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. The State Department of Education is hereby constituted a principal
2 department in the executive branch of the State Government.

3 The State Board of Education is hereby designated the head of such
4 principal department.

1 2. Section 18:3-1 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

2 18:3-1. [A] The Commissioner of Education shall be appointed by the
3 Governor, [by and] with the advice and consent of the Senate, [for a term
4 of five years, commencing July first, and until his successor is appointed]

5 and shall serve during the term of office of the Governor appointing him and
6 until the commissioner's successor is appointed and has qualified.

7 The commissioner shall be selected without regard to residence within
8 or without this State.

9 He shall receive [a] such salary [of fifteen thousand dollars per annum,
10 payable in equal semimonthly installments] as shall be provided by law.

1 3. Section 18:3-4 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

2 18:3-4. Except as otherwise provided by law the commissioner shall be
3 considered the [“head”] “appointing authority” of the department within
4 the contemplation of Title 11, Civil Service, and may employ such clerks
5 and other employees as he may deem necessary and fix their compensation
6 subject to the provisions of said Title [, except where otherwise provided by
7 statute]. The compensation of clerks and other employees employed as
8 authorized in this section shall be payable semimonthly on the certificate of
9 the commissioner, and shall not exceed in the aggregate the sum annually
10 appropriated therefor by the Legislature.

1 4. The Commissioner of Education or any member of the State Board
2 of Education may be removed from office by the Governor, for cause, upon
3 notice and opportunity to be heard.

1 5. The commission created pursuant to “An act creating a commission
2 to examine, enforce and recommend measures to improve the economic, cul-
3 tural, health and living conditions of the urban colored population of the
4 State and making an appropriation therefor,” passed June tenth, one thou-
5 sand nine hundred and forty-one (P. L. 1941, c. 192), is hereby abolished
6 and its functions, powers, duties, records and property are hereby trans-
7 ferred to and vested in the council of the division against discrimination
8 in the State Department of Education.

9 The terms of office of the members of the commission created pursuant
10 to said chapter one hundred ninety-two of the laws of one thousand nine
11 hundred and forty-one shall expire on the effective date of this act.

12 All appropriations available and to become available to the commission

13 created pursuant to said chapter one hundred ninety-two of the laws of one
14 thousand nine hundred and forty-one are hereby transferred to the State
15 Department of Education.

1 6. Section seven of chapter one hundred sixty-nine of the laws of one
2 thousand nine hundred and forty-five is amended to read as follows:

3 7. The said division shall consist of the Commissioner of Education and
4 a council. The council shall consist of [~~seven~~] nine members; each member
5 shall be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the
6 Senate, for a term of five years and until his successor is appointed and
7 qualified, except that of those first appointed, one shall be appointed for a
8 term of one year, one for a term of two years, [~~one~~] two for a term of three
9 years and two for a term of four years. Vacancies caused other than by
10 expiration of term shall be filled in the same manner as the original appoint-
11 ment but for the unexpired term only. Members of the council shall serve
12 without compensation but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses in-
13 curred in the performance of their duties. The first chairman of the council
14 shall be designated by the Governor, and thereafter the chairman shall be
15 elected by the members annually. Any member of the council may be removed
16 from office by the Governor, for cause, upon notice and opportunity to be
17 heard.

1 7. In addition to other powers and duties specifically conferred and
2 imposed upon it by law, the State Board of Education shall:

3 (a) Prescribe rules and regulations governing the granting, by any
4 authorized State department, board or other agency, of certificates of registra-
5 tion or licenses, and the renewal of either thereof, to operate or conduct

15 ment, board or other agency with respect thereto; and (2) complied with the
16 rules and regulations prescribed with respect thereto by the State Board of
17 Education.

1 9. Nothing in this act shall be construed to deprive any person of any
2 right or protection provided him by Title 11 of the Revised Statutes, Civil
3 Service, or under any pension law or retirement system.

1 10. This act shall be known as, and may be cited as, the "Department of
2 Education Act of 1948."

1 11. This act shall take effect on the first day of July, one thousand nine
2 hundred and forty-eight, except that any appointment, and any confirmation
3 or approval of any appointment, permitted by this act may be made prior to
4 such date.

1 3. Section 18:3-4 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

2 18:3-4. Except as otherwise provided by law the commissioner shall be
3 considered the "appointing authority" of the department within the
4 contemplation of Title 11, Civil Service, and may employ such clerks
5 and other employees as he may deem necessary and fix their compensation
6 subject to the provisions of said Title. The compensation of clerks and other
7 employees employed as authorized in this section shall be payable semi-
8 monthly on the certificate of the commissioner, and shall not exceed in the
9 aggregate the sum annually appropriated therefor by the Legislature.

1 4. The Commissioner of Education or any member of the State Board
2 of Education may be removed from office by the Governor, for cause, upon
3 notice and opportunity to be heard.

1 5. Section seven of chapter one hundred sixty-nine of the laws of one
2 thousand nine hundred and forty-five is amended to read as follows:

3 7. The said division shall consist of the Commissioner of Education and
4 a council. The council shall consist of seven members; each member
5 shall be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the
6 Senate, for a term of five years and until his successor is appointed and
7 qualified, except that of those first appointed, one shall be appointed for a
8 term of one year, one for a term of two years, one for a term of three
9 years and two for a term of four years. Vacancies caused other than by
10 expiration of term shall be filled in the same manner as the original appoint-
11 ment but for the unexpired term only. Members of the council shall serve
12 without compensation but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses in-
13 curred in the performance of their duties. The first chairman of the council

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An act authorizing a firemen's home for the aged, indigent and disabled firemen of this State, and providing for the regulation and government of such home," approved April second, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1 1. Section ten of the act of which this is amendatory be and the same is hereby
2 amended to read as follows:

3 10. When said commissioners shall report said home ready for occupation,
4 the Governor shall thereupon appoint from the active or exempt firemen of the State
5 [eight persons] one person from each congressional district of the State, who,
6 with the president of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association for the time be-
7 ing and the Commissioner of Banking and Insurance and Comptroller of the State
8 for the time being, shall be the board of managers of the New Jersey Firemen's
9 Home; the members of said board of managers from the congressional districts
10 shall serve for the term of four (4) years, and their successors shall be appointed
11 by the Governor from the active or exempt firemen of the State; the president of
12 the New Jersey State Firemen's Association for the time being and the Commis-
13 sioner of Banking and Insurance and Comptroller of the State for the time being

14 shall at all times be members of said board of managers; the said managers shall re-
15 ceive no compensation for their services, but may be reimbursed their actual ex-
16 penses out of the funds belonging to the home; any vacancy in said board of man-
17 agers shall be filled by the Governor from the active or exempt firemen of the con-
18 gressional district in which the vacancy happens; all appointments to fill such
19 vacancies shall be for the unexpired term only.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

499. Funds for erection of home; how acquired; duties of commissioner of banking and insurance.—Sec. 5. To raise and procure the said sum of seventy-five thousand (\$75,000.00) dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary to provide said home and furnish and equip the same ready for use and occupation as aforesaid, the commissioner of banking and insurance, instead of paying to the treasurer of the several firemen's relief associations of this state as now required by law, the moneys now in his hands, received or hereafter to be received by him from fire insurance companies on account of the license and tax of two per centum and of all payments in lieu of said tax as now are or hereafter may be required by law to be paid by said insurance companies, shall, from and after the passage of this act, hold and retain said moneys in his hands for the uses and purposes of this act, and none of said moneys shall hereafter be paid over to said relief associations until the demands and requirements made upon the same under this act as hereinafter provided, shall be met and satisfied. (P. L. 1898, p. 212.)

500. Payments from fund to establish home to commission.—Sec. 6. The commissioner of banking and insurance shall, after the passage of this act, from time to time, upon the demand and requisition of said commissioners, pay over to the treasurer of said commissioners, from and out of the moneys mentioned in section five (5), so much thereof, not exceeding the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000 00), as may be necessary and required to provide said home and furnish and equip the same ready for use and occupation; the said moneys so received the said commissioners shall use and disburse to provide, furnish and equip said home pursuant to this act. (P. L. 1898, p. 213.)

501. Contributions toward furnishing home by firemen's relief associations.—Sec. 7. Each of the several firemen's relief associations of the state are hereby authorized and empowered to pay or contribute out of any money or securities now on hand or that may be on hand belonging to said association before said home is completed and furnished and ready for occupancy as aforesaid, such part or portion thereof as any such relief association may see fit to pay or contribute towards providing, furnishing and equipping said home as aforesaid; the same to be paid to the treasurer of said commissioners and to be used and applied by said commissioners to provide, furnish and equip said home pursuant to this act; and the aggregate amount of such payments or contributions by said relief associations shall be considered as forming part and parcel of the said sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000.00) required to provide, furnish and equip said home as aforesaid. (P. L. 1898, p. 213.)

502. Report by commission to legislature of status of fund.—Sec. 8. Said commissioners shall report to the next legislature (and to succeeding legislatures, if their work be not sooner completed), a detailed statement of all gifts, moneys and securities received by them, from whom received and how the same have been appropriated, used, disbursed, applied or expended. (P. L. 1898, p. 213.)

503. Report by commission to governor as to completion of home and status of fund; disposition of balance of fund.—Sec. 9. When said home has been provided and furnished and equipped ready for use and occupation, pursuant to this act, the said commissioners shall so report to the governor; in addition to reporting the completion of their work, said report shall also contain the matters and things required by section eight (8) hereof; any balance of money remaining in the hands of said commission shall be paid over to the board of managers hereinafter provided for, and be by them used for the support and maintenance of said home. (P. L. 1898, p. 213.)

504. Board of managers of home; how constituted; terms of office; compensation; filling vacancies.—Sec. 10. When said commissioners

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shall report said home ready for occupation, the governor shall thereupon appoint from the active or exempt firemen of the state, eight persons, one from each congressional district of the state, who, with the president of the New Jersey state firemen's association for the time being and the commissioner of banking and insurance and comptroller of the state for the time being, shall be the board of managers of the New Jersey firemen's home; the members of said board of managers from the congressional districts shall serve for the term of four (4) years, and their successors shall be appointed by the governor from the active or exempt firemen of the state; the president of the New Jersey state firemen's association for the time being and the commissioner of banking and insurance and comptroller of the state for the time being shall at all times be members of said board of managers; the said managers shall receive no compensation for their services, but may be reimbursed their actual expenses out of the funds belonging to the home; any vacancy in said board of managers shall be filled by the governor from the active or exempt firemen of the congressional district in which the vacancy happens; all appointments to fill such vacancies shall be for the unexpired term only. (P. L. 1898, p. 214.)

505. Board of managers of home; powers and duties.—Sec. 11. From and after the appointment of such board of managers the government, management, care and conduct of said home shall devolve upon and be vested in said board of managers, who shall have the general direction and control of all the property and concerns of such home, and make by-laws, rules and regulations for the government, management, care and conduct thereof, and determine the compensation, duties and term of service of its officers and other persons employed therein, subject to the approval of the governor. (P. L. 1898, p. 214.)

506. Superintendent and other officers and employes of home; appointment; bonds; chairman, secretary, treasurer and other officers of board of managers; bond of treasurer.—Sec. 12. Said board of managers shall appoint, subject to the approval of the governor, a superintendent of said home and such other officers, assistants and attendants as may be necessary and proper; there shall be a chairman of said board of managers, a secretary and treasurer and such other officials as they may choose to appoint; the treasurer shall enter into bond to said board of managers for the faithful performance of the duties of his office, in such sum and with such sureties as said board of managers shall require and approve; said superintendent and all other officers of said home may also be required by said board of managers to enter into bond to said board in such sum and such sureties for the faithful performance of their respective duties as said managers may require and approve; the failure of such treasurer or other officer to give such bond as may be required of them as aforesaid shall vacate their respective offices. (P. L. 1898, p. 214.)

507. Superintendent of home; powers and duties.—Sec. 13. The superintendent of said home shall be the chief executive officer thereof and shall have the general management and care of the same and of the building and grounds, with their furniture, fixtures and stock, and the government, direction, care and treatment of the inmates and patients, and of the officers, attendants and assistants, subject to the general control of the board of managers and in pursuance of the by-laws, rules and regulations by them established, and he shall keep a correct and proper diary and record of all his official acts and transactions. (P. L. 1898, p. 215.)

508. Superintendent of home; powers and duties.—Sec. 14. The superintendent of said home shall be a competent accountant and the chief financial agent of said home; he shall purchase all necessary clothing, provisions, materials and other supplies for the said home, subject to the approval of the board of managers and their rules and regulations; he shall keep the accounts of the said home and of all

The board of managers of the New Jersey Firemen's Home shall hereafter consist of one (1) member from each county of the State, except the counties of Essex and Hudson, and two members from each of the counties of Essex and Hudson, one of whom from each such counties shall be a fully-paid fireman. The president of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association, the Governor of the State and the Commissioner of Banking and Insurance of the State and the Comptroller of the State, respectively, for the time being shall be members of the board of managers by virtue of their office. The elected members of said board shall be elected by said New Jersey State Firemen's Association in annual convention assembled for a term of four years from the first day of October next succeeding their election and until their successors are elected and qualify; provided, however, that at the first election of managers of said home after the approval of this act there shall be elected five (5) managers for a period of one year, six (6) managers for a period of two years, six (6) managers for a period of three years, six (6) managers for a period of four years, and thereafter each election shall be for a term of four years, except in case of an election to fill a vacancy as hereinafter provided. Any vacancy occurring among the elected members of said board shall be filled in the following manner: The president of the said New Jersey State Firemen's Association shall appoint from the county in which the vacancy shall occur a successor to serve until the first day of October next succeeding such appointment and at the next annual election of managers by the New Jersey State Firemen's Association there shall also be elected from the county in which said vacancy shall occur a member of said board to serve for the unexpired term of office so vacated. The said managers shall receive no compensation for their service but may be reimbursed their actual expenses in connection with their duties as managers out of the funds of the home. (L. 1898, p. 214, (C. S., p. 2459), as amended L. 1914, c. 11, p. 24, L. 1923, c. 127, p. 270.)

78-504a. Expiration of terms. 2. The terms of office of all members of the board of managers of the New Jersey Firemen's Home serv-
