1 30. Section 9 of chapter 254 of the laws of 1954 is repealed.

1 31. Section 10 of chapter 254 of the laws of 1954 is amended to read as
2 follows:

3 10. It shall be the duty of the Division of [Counsel to the Legislature]
4 *Bill Drafting and Legal Services of the Agency* to furnish to the presiding
5 officer of each House of the Legislature or to the committees, joint committees
6 and members of the Legislature, legal assistance, information and advice
7 when and in relation to such matters as the commission shall from time to
8 time determine, relating to—

9 a. The subject matter and legal effect of the statutes and of proposals
10 made for statutory enactment, and

11 b. Questions of parliamentary law and legislative procedure.

1 32. This act shall take effect immediately.

It merely corrects errors in certain statutes and revises sections of other statutes so as to bring their provisions into conformity with those of statutes subsequently enacted.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED JANUARY 29, 1962

AN ACT concerning the State Board of Child Welfare, or the instrumentality or agency of the State succeeding to its powers, in relation to the placement of children for adoption in certain cases.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. As used in this act "foster parent" shall mean any person with whom
2 a child in the care, custody or guardianship of the State Board of Child Wel-
3 fare, or of any instrumentality or agency of the State succeeding to its
4 powers, is placed for temporary or long-term care, but shall not include any
5 persons with whom a child is placed for the purpose of adoption.

1 2. Any husband and wife, who, as foster parents, have cared for a child
2 continuously for a period of 2 years or more, may apply to the State Board
3 of Child Welfare, or to the instrumentality or agency succeeding to its
4 powers, for the placement of said child with them for the purpose of adop-
5 tion and if said child is eligible for adoption, the board or said instrumen-
6 tality or agency shall give preference and first consideration to their applica-
7 tion over all other applications for adoption placements.

1 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
