AN ACT to amend "An act authorizing the board of chosen freeholders of any county in which a park commission shall not have been established to acquire land for use as a public golf course and other recreational facilities, and to improve, maintain, and operate the same," approved June 30, 1958 (P. L. 1958, c. 94).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*  
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. Section 1 of the act of which this act is amendatory is amended to  
2 read as follows:

3 1. The board of chosen freeholders of any county in which a park  
4 commission shall not have been established may lease, or may acquire, in  
5 fee or less estate, by gift, devise, grant **[or]**, purchase *or condemnation* any  
6 land or real estate and rights therein, improved or unimproved, within the  
7 county for use as a public golf course, and for such other recreational, play-  
8 ground, or public entertainment purposes and activities as it may determine  
9 to provide in connection therewith.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
