ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 100

To the General Assembly:

Pursuant to Article V, Section I, paragraph 14(b) of the Constitution, I am returning herewith Assembly Bill No. 100, with my objections, for reconsideration.

Assembly Bill No. 100 would require a natural gas utility which proposes to construct a gas pipeline intended to be subjected to pressure in excess of 125 pounds per square inch to file with the Board of Public Utility Commissioners, at least 30 days prior to construction, a report setting forth the specifications for such pipeline and a map showing the general location of the proposed route thereof. The bill further provides that the utility must notify the clerk of the municipalities through which the pipeline is to be constructed of the filing of such report and map with the Board of Public Utility Commissioners.

The proposal requiring such report, map and notification is a sound one. The Board of Public Utility Commissioners, by administrative regulation, presently requires filing of a report and specifications with it. The added provision requiring a map and notification to the municipality is of obvious advantage to local communities which will be affected by such construction.

Assembly Bill No. 100 deals only with original construction of pipelines. I feel that it is desirable that it also encompass, as does the Board's regulation, the major reconstruction of such gas pipelines.

I am, therefore, returning Assembly Bill No. 100 herewith for reconsideration and with the recommendation that the bill be amended as follows:
