AN ACT concerning railroads and supplementing chapter 12 of
Title 48 of the Revised Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

3 1. In order to permit the State and its political subdivisions to
4 receive notice of, and be afforded an opportunity to acquire, by
5 purchase or condemnation, railroad rights of way proposed to be
6 abandoned, any railroad company which makes application to the
7 Interstate Commerce Commission for authority to abandon any
8 part of its right of way shall, within 10 days of making such appli-
9 cation, serve notice thereof upon the State and upon each county
10 and municipality in which any part of the right of way proposed
11 for abandonment is located. No sale or conveyance of any part
12 of such right of way shall thereafter be made to any person other
13 than the State, a county or municipality for a period of 90 days
14 from the date of approval by the Interstate Commerce Com-
15 mission of the application for abandonment or from the date of
16 service of the notice in this section required, whichever occurs
17 later, unless prior thereto each governmental agency entitled to
18 such notice shall have filed with the railroad company written
19 disclaimer of interest in acquiring all or any part of said right of
20 way. Any sale or conveyance made in violation of this act shall
21 be void.

22 As used in this act "right of way" means the roadbed of a line
23 of railroad, not exceeding 100 feet in width, as measured horizon-
24 tally at the elevation of the base of the rail, including the full em-
25 bankment or excavated area, with slopes, slope ditches, retaining
26 walls or foundations necessary to provide a width not to exceed
27 100 feet at the base of rail, but not including tracks, appurtenances,
28 ballast nor any structures or buildings erected thereon.

1 2. Each notice, required to be served pursuant to this act, shall
2 contain a brief description sufficient to identify the right of way
3 intended to be abandoned and sold or otherwise disposed of to-
4 gether with a statement that the notice is given to afford the State
5 and each county and municipality in which the said right of way is
6 located an opportunity to acquire the right of way or such portion
7 thereof as may be required for public use.

8 3. Service of the said notice shall be made by certified mail,
9 return receipt requested, addressed to the Governor in cases of
10 service upon the State, to the director or clerk of the board of
11 chosen freeholders, in cases of service upon a county, and to the
12 mayor or municipal clerk, in cases of service upon a municipality.

13 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

Governor Richard J. Hughes yesterday signed into law the following bills:

Assembly Bill No. 112 - which requires that a railroad applying to the Interstate Commerce Commission for permission to abandon any right-of-way must notify the State and each county and municipality in which the property is located and may not convey the property until these governmental entities have had 90 days in which to acquire it. The bill is designed to preserve railroad right-of-way for possible future transportation uses.

Assembly Bill No. 669 - which authorizes blanket bonding of county and municipal employees, in lieu of individual bonds as now required.
