# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED FEBRUARY 5, 1962

By Assemblymen PANARO, FARRINGTON and SWEENEY

Referred to Committee on State County and Municipal Government

A SUPPLEMENT to "An act concerning civil service employees in the various counties, municipalities and school districts in the State, and supplementing subtitle 3, Title 11, of the Revised Statutes of New Jersey," approved July 18, 1939 (P. L. 1939, c. 232).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*  
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. Whenever any employee in the permanent classified service of a county,  
2 municipality or school district dies, subsequent to the enactment of this act,  
3 having to his credit any annual vacation leave properly accumulated in ac-  
4 cordance with the act to which this act is a supplement, there shall be calcu-  
5 lated and paid to his estate a sum of money equal to the compensation which  
6 would have been received by the employee during such period of vacation  
7 leave had the employee lived.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

## STATEMENT

The law as it presently reads has been interpreted as not authorizing payment to the estate of a deceased employee for vacation allowance accumulated and not used. It has been interpreted, however, to provide that where the employee dies while on vacation leave, payment is permitted for the period of vaca-

tion time not used prior to the employee's death. It is considered that this application of the law effects an injustice in that since the vacation allowance is considered as a right of the employee during his continued employment, compensation for unused vacation allowances should be considered as a vested right in his estate.
