6 c. Willfully alter, otherwise than is provided by article 6 of this chapter
7 (§ 26:8-48 et seq.), or willfully or knowingly falsify, any certificate or
8 record established by this chapter; or

9 d. Fail to fill out and transmit any certificate or record in the manner
10 required by this chapter; or

11 e. Being a local registrar, deputy registrar or subregistrar, shall fail to
12 perform his duty as required by this chapter and by the directions of the
13 State registrar thereunder; or

14 f. Violate any of the provisions of this chapter or fail to discharge any
15 duty required by this chapter—

16 Shall be subject to a penalty of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$50.00
17 for each first offense and not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00 for
18 each subsequent offense.

19 Such penalties shall be recovered in a civil action in the name of the State
20 department or local board in any court of competent jurisdiction.

21 *Every county or municipal court shall have jurisdiction over proceedings*
22 *to enforce and collect any such penalty, if the violation has occurred within*
23 *the territorial jurisdiction of the court. The proceedings shall be summary*

STATEMENT

FISCAL DATA

This Bill amends the laws concerning the disposal of dead bodies and vital statistics.

If enacted, it will increase the revenues to the State by \$43,700.00 and also will result in a savings of \$6,300.00 in the cost of operations of the State Bureau of Public Health Statistics, with a total net surplus of revenues to the State of \$50,000.00.
