**A 752 McGann**  
 May 17—Permits the Sandy Hook Reservation Authority to establish a State Aquarium.

May 17—Agric, Cons & Econ Dev Com.

**A 753 Keith**  
 May 17—Permits township fire districts to control the placing and erecting of fire hydrants, and the securing of water and payment therefor.

May 17—Co. & Mun. Gov't Com.

**A 754 Bateman, Gimson**  
 May 17—Resets a part of the boundary line between the counties of Hunterdon and Somerset.

May 17—Passed Assembly under emergency resolution.

May 24—Passed in Senate.

Mar. 7—Filed in State Library.

**A 755 Keith**  
 May 17—Grants the makers of a note on a mortgage the same protection in a deficiency suit that the obligors of a bond have.

May 17—Rev. & Amend. of Laws Com.

**A 756 Keith**  
 May 17—Permits any police officer receiving any pension to hold any public office and receive in addition to his pension the salary allotted to such office.

May 17—State Gov't Com.

**A 757 Keith**  
 May 17—Permits the governing body of any municipality to require the new owner of a bankrupt subdivision to furnish a Performance Guarantee if he intends to complete the work.

May 17—Co. & Mun. Gov't Com.

**A 758 Farrington, Sweeney, Woodson**  
 May 17—Permits the Township of Princeton, Mercer County, to waive the provisions of the general statutes which require that members of its police force must reside within the township provided they live within 5 miles from the police headquarters.

May 17—Passed Assembly under emergency resolution.

May 24—Passed in Senate under emergency resolution.

Oct. 8—Approved, Chapter 180.

**A 759 Burke, Wallwork, Kimmelman, Everett, Policastro, Addonizio**

May 17—Authorizes leaves of absence with pay for members of the New Jersey State Patrolmen's Benevolent Association, Inc., Fraternal Order of Police, Firemen's Mutual Benevolent Association, Inc. and the Uniformed Benevolent Association to attend regular monthly meetings of such organization.

May 17—State Gov't Com.

**A 760 McDermott, McDonough, LaCorte, Collins**

May 17—Defines "executive officer" of a bank as every officer who participates or has authority to participate in the operating management of the bank otherwise than in the capacity of a director of the bank.

May 17—Business Affairs Com.

**A 761 Lynch, Sweeney, Farrington**  
 May 17—Repeals the public utilities anti-strike law (P.L. 1946, c. 38).

May 17—Hwys, Trans & Pub Util Com.

**A 762 Hierung, Sweeney**  
 May 17—Provides that the salaries of the County freeholders shall be equal to but not in excess of the maximum salary fixed by law and paid to the officers of Sheriff, Surrogate, or County Clerk; effective January 1, 1966.

May 17—Co. & Mun. Gov't Com.

**A 763 Hierung, Keegan, A. Smith, Rimm, Hauser, Maraziti, Sears, Musto, Werner, Tanzman**

May 17—Permits a person hospitalized after the cut-off date for requesting an absentee ballot to vote in a primary or general election; effective January 1, 1966.

May 17—Judiciary Com.

**A 764 Hauser, Musto, Crabiel**  
 May 17—Provides a pension for the judge of the city district court, county district court, county court, juvenile and domestic relations court; effective July 1, 1965.

May 17—Passed both houses under emergency resolution.

June 1—Approved, Chapter 82.

**A 765 Higgins, Bateman, Crabiel**  
 May 17—Requires the Election Law Revision Commission to submit their report to the 1966 instead of the 1965 Legislature.

May 17—Passed Assembly under emergency resolution.

May 24—Passed in Senate under emergency resolution.

May 28—Approved, Chapter 73.

**A 766 McDonough, Lynch**  
 May 17—Includes any members of a board of education under workmen's compensation.

May 24—Education Com.

**A 767 Gelber**  
 May 17—Validates certain proceedings at meetings or elections of school districts and any bonds or other obligation issued or to be issued pursuant to such proceedings.

May 17—No Reference.

May 24—Judiciary Com.

**A 768 Hughes, Musto, Kordja, Curry, Brigiani, Lynch, McGann, Maraziti, Sears, Doren, Keegan, Tanzman, Halpin, Policastro, Addonizio, Burke**

May 17—Defines the word "obscene" with relation to the exposure, sale, loan, gift or distribution of publications, photographs to a child under 18 years of age.

May 24—Passed in Assembly.

Dec. 13—Passed in Senate.

Jan. 11—Vetoed by the Governor.

**A 769 Kay**  
 May 17—Provides for the examination, licensing and regulation of the practice of polygraph examining and persons engaged in the profession; creates a board of polygraph examiners; appropriate \$9,000; effective January 1, 1966.

May 17—Pub Safety, Def & Vet Aff Com.

**A 770 Hauser, Maraziti, Hauser**  
 May 17—Permits the State Department of Education to establish, operate and maintain snack bars and vending machines for the sale of foodstuffs, beverages, and tobacco products on the premises of any or all of the New Jersey State Colleges.

May 17—Education Com.

**A 771 Bateman, Crabiel**  
 May 17—Exempts from taxation the housing exclusively for persons 60 years of age and over together with accessory and related facilities for the care, maintenance and welfare of such residents.

May 17—Inst., Pub. Health & Welf. Com.

**A 772 Gelber, Moraites, Woodcock, Randall, Vander Plaats, Mallett, Higgins**

May 17—Permits the freeholders of any county to appoint a county commission or council on human relations.

May 17—No Reference.

May 24—Judiciary Com.

**A 773 Crabiel**  
 May 17—Designated "Industrial and Business Survey Loan Act of 1965", provides for State loans up to 50% of the cost for feasibility surveys for private industries and businesses interested in locating in New Jersey; appropriates \$200,000.

May 17—Agric Cons & Econ. Dev. Com.

**A 774 Policastro, Addonizio, Farrington**  
 May 17—Creates a 6 member bipartisan Health Benefit Study Commission, 2 citizens each appointed by the Governor, President of the Senate, Speaker of the General Assembly to study and review the obligations of public employers in regard to providing health insurance benefits to retired employees, appropriates \$10,000; requires a report on or before July 1, 1967.

May 17—State Gov't Com.

**A 775 Wallwork**  
 May 17—Requires all refrigerator repairmen to be licensed by the State Department of Labor.

May 17—Business Affairs Com.

**A 776 Tanzman**  
 May 17—Increases the membership of the Real Estate commission from 5 to 7 members, 5 of whom shall have been licensed real estate brokers for at least 10 years.

May 17—Business Affairs Com.

**A 777 Dickey, McCord, W. Smith, Bergund**

May 17—Provides for the docketing of judgments or orders for the payment of money entered in the juvenile and domestic relations court on the County Court or the Superior Court.

AN ACT to amend "An act creating an Election Law Revision Commission, prescribing its powers and duties, repealing chapter 81 of the laws of 1961, and making an appropriation therefor," approved May 4, 1964 (P. L. 1964, c. 29).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*  
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. Section 6 of the act of which this act is amendatory is amended to  
2 read as follows:

3 6. The commission shall make its final report to the Governor and the  
4 Legislature not later than at the [1965] 1966 Session of the Legislature  
5 accompanying its report with its final proposed revision of the election law.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
