BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the
5 State of New Jersey

1. N.J.S. 18A:6-34 is amended to read as follows:

7 18A:6-34. There shall be a State Board of Examiners,
consisting of the commissioner ex officio and one assistant
9 commissioner of education, two presidents of State colleges, one
county superintendent, one superintendent of schools of a Type I
11 district, one superintendent of a Type II district, one high school
principal, one elementary school principal, one school business
13 administrator, one librarian employed by the State or by one of
its political subdivisions and four teaching staff members other
15 than a superintendent, principal, school business administrator or
librarian, all of whom shall be appointed by the commissioner
17 with the approval of the State board.

BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the*

1. N.J.S. 18A:6-34 is amended to read as follows:

7 18A:6-34. There shall be a State Board of Examiners,
consisting of the commissioner ex officio and one assistant
9 commissioner of education, two presidents of State colleges, one
county superintendent, one superintendent of schools of a Type I
11 district, one superintendent of a Type II district, one high school
principal, one elementary school principal, one school business
13 administrator, one librarian employed by the State or by one of
its political subdivisions and four teaching staff members other
15 than a superintendent, principal, school business administrator
or librarian, all of whom shall be appointed by the commissioner
17 with the approval of the State board.

2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

23 This bill increases the membership of the State Board of
Examiners with the addition of one school business
25 administrator. A school business administrator is considered to
be a member of the professional staff of a school district, and is
27 required to hold an appropriate certificate. The inclusion of a
school business administrator on the State Board of Examiners
29 will help provide necessary expertise with regard to
certification requirements for this position and for the review of
31 applications for certification.

The Assembly Higher Education and Regulated Professions Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 144.

This bill increases the membership of the State Board of Examiners to 15 with the addition of a school business administrator to the board. The current membership consists of the Commissioner of Education, ex officio, one assistant commissioner of education, two State college presidents, one county superintendent, one superintendent of a type I and one superintendent of a type II school district, one high school and one elementary school principal, one librarian and four teaching staff members.

The State Board of Examiners issues those professional certificates which are necessary for employment in the public schools (N.J.S.18A:6-38). All teachers, administrators, supervisors, guidance personnel and school nurses are required to have an appropriate certificate. Under N.J.S. 18A:17-14.2, school business administrators are specifically required to hold "an appropriate certificate as prescribed by the State board."

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1988 session pending technical review. As reported the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.

The Senate Education Committee favorably reports this bill without committee amendments.

This bill increases the membership of the State Board of Examiners to 15 with the addition of a school business administrator to the board. The current membership consists of the Commissioner of Education, ex officio, one assistant commissioner of education, two State college presidents, one county superintendent, one superintendent of a type I and one superintendent of a type II school district, one high school and one elementary school principal, one librarian and four teaching staff members.

The State Board of Examiners issues those professional certificates which are necessary for employment in the public schools (N.J.S.18A:6-38). All teachers, administrators, supervisors, guidance personnel and school nurses are required to have an appropriate certificate. Under N.J.S. 18A:17-14.2, school business administrators are specifically required to hold "an appropriate certificate as prescribed by the State board."

This bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 2141.
