AN Act to amend an act entitled "An act to establish a thorough and efficient system of free public schools and to provide for the maintenance, support and management thereof," approved October nineteenth, one thousand nine hundred and three.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. Section twenty-nine of the act to which this is an amendment be and
2 the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

3 29. There shall be a State Board of Examiners, consisting of the Com-
4 missioner of Education, one assistant Commissioner of Education, [the] two
5 principals of the State Normal Schools, a county superintendent of schools
6 [and], a city superintendent, a supervising principal of schools [a], a high
7 school principal or high school teacher, a principal of an elementary school or
8 an elementary teacher. [Said assistant Commissioner of Education, said
9 county superintendent of schools, and said city superintendent of schools,]
10 With the exception of the Commissioner of Education, who shall be chair-
11 man of the board, the members shall be appointed by the State Board of
12 Education [.] upon the nomination of the commissioner. [The county and
13 city superintendent so appointed shall hold office for one year from date
14 of their respective appointments as aforesaid. Each of the] Members shall
15 hold office for two years from the date of organization of the board ex-

16 cept that in the first appointments one-half of the members shall be appointed
 17 for a term of one year. Vacancies in membership shall be filled for the un-
 18 expired term in the same manner as for full terms. All persons [so] ap-
 19 pointed to said board [except] other than the Commissioner and the assist-
 20 ant Commissioner of Education shall receive [for his services, in addition
 21 to traveling expenses, such compensation as may be fixed by the State Board
 22 of Education, not to exceed ten dollars for each meeting of said board of ex-
 23 aminers.] reimbursement for necessary traveling expenses for attendance
 24 upon meetings of said board of examiners. Said board shall [hold examina-
 25 tions of teachers] grant State certificates to teach, based upon certified scho-
 26 lastic records or upon examinations, and revoke the same under rules and
 27 regulations prescribed by the State Board of Education.

1 2. The terms of the present members of the State Board of Examiners
 2 shall expire on July first, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, and the
 3 State Board of Examiners as constituted in this act shall organize not later
 4 than September fifteenth of any year.

STATEMENT

The State Board of Examiners has been provided by law in order to place the certification of teachers in New Jersey on a uniform and effective basis which shall be State-wide. When the law was originally passed, there were in New Jersey only three normal schools. At the present time there are six. It appears that the provisions of the act place a high proportion of normal school principals on the board. Experience has demonstrated that a board of nine is desirable because it provides opportunity for the presentation of a variety of views. In order to further broaden representation on this board, the reorganized personnel includes representation from the counties, cities, and boroughs, and the teaching staff.

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An act to establish a thorough and efficient system of free public schools and to provide for the maintenance, support and management thereof," approved October nineteenth, one thousand nine hundred and three.

1 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New
2 Jersey:

1 1. Section twenty-nine of the act to which this is an amendment be and
2 the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

3 29. There shall be a State Board of Examiners, consisting of the Com-
4 missioner of Education, one assistant Commissioner of Education, one prin-
5 cipal of a State Teachers College, one principal of a State Normal School,
6 a county superintendent of schools, a city superintendent, a supervising prin-
7 cipal of schools, a high school principal and a high school teacher, a princi-
8 pal of an elementary school and an elementary teacher. With the excep-
9 tion of the Commissioner of Education, who shall be chairman of the board,
10 the members upon the nomination of the commissioner shall be appointed by
11 the State Board of Education. Members shall hold office for two years
12 from the date of organization of the board except that in the first ap-
13 pointments one-half of the members shall be appointed for a term of one
13½ year. Vacancies in membership shall be filled for the unexpired term in

14 the same manner as for full terms. All persons appointed to said board
15 other than the Commissioner and the assistant Commissioner of Educa-
16 tion shall receive reimbursement for necessary traveling expenses for
17 attendance upon meetings of said board of examiners. Said board
18 shall grant State certificates to teach, based upon certified scholastic
19 records or upon examinations, and revoke the same under rules and regula-
20 tions prescribed by the State Board of Education.

1 2. Nothing contained in this act shall be construed to conflict with the
2 present existing tenure rights of teachers under chapter two hundred and
3 forty-three, pamphlet laws one thousand nine hundred and nine, and the sev-
4 eral amendments thereof and the supplements thereto.

1 3. The terms of the present members of the State Board of Examiners
2 shall expire on July first, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, and the
3 State Board of Examiners as constituted in this act shall organize not later
4 than September fifteenth of any year.
