A SUPPLEMENT to an act entitled "An act creating a Department of State Police, providing for the appointment of a Superintendent thereof, together with the officers and men who shall constitute the force, defining their powers and duties, and making an appropriation for the expenses connected therewith," passed March twenty-first, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, authorizing the Attorney-General or any assistant to represent and defend the said department or any member thereof.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:*

1 1. The Attorney-General is authorized personally or by any assistant to defend
2 all criminal actions and proceedings in which the department or any member thereof
3 is concerned as a party, which requires the services of attorney or counsel, in order
4 to protect the interests of the State as may be necessary for the purposes of the de-
5 partment or the members thereof, or the Attorney-General may appoint an attorney
6 for the purpose of such defense and certify the expense thereof to the Department of
7 State Police for payment, which shall be paid by said department upon the warrant
8 of the Comptroller by the State Treasurer.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT.

The purpose of this act is to provide for legal advice to members of the State Police in cases where charges are made against them for acts performed in the line of duty.
