STATEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to require agents of domestic insurance companies to be licensed by the Commissioner of Banking and Insurance, the same as is required of agents of outside insurance companies to do business in the State and to thus place all such agents of record with the Department of Banking and Insurance; and the requirement to pay a fee of one dollar (\$1.00) for the licensing of each agent. The bill is recommended by the Department of Banking and Insurance.
