AN ACT to amend "An act for the establishment of a police and firemen's retirement system for the police and firemen of a municipality, county or political subdivision thereof," approved May twenty-third, one thousand nine hundred and forty-four (P. L. 1944, c. 255).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. Section one of the act of which this act is amendatory is amended to
2 read as follows:

3 1. The following words and phrases as used in this act unless a different
4 meaning is plainly required by the context shall have the following mean-
5 ings:

6 (1) "Retirement system" shall mean the Police and Firemen's Retire-
7 ment System of New Jersey as defined in section two of this act.

8 (2) "Policeman or fireman" shall mean any permanent and full time
9 active uniformed employee, and any active permanent and full-time employee
10 who is a detective, lineman, fire alarm operator or inspector of combustibles,
11 of any police or fire department of a municipality or a fire department of a
12 fire district located in a township or a county police department.

13 (3) "Member" shall mean any policeman or fireman included in the mem-
14 bership of the retirement system as provided in section three of this act.

15 (4) "Board of trustees" or "board" shall mean the board provided for
16 in section thirteen of this act to administer the retirement system.

17 (5) "Medical board" shall mean the board of physicians provided for in
18 section thirteen of this act.

19 (6) "Employer" shall mean the county, municipality or political sub-
20 division thereof which pays the particular policeman or fireman.

21 (7) "Service" shall mean service as a policeman or fireman or county
22 policeman paid for by an employer.

23 (8) "Creditable service" shall mean service rendered for which credit is
24 allowed as provided under section four of this act.

25 (9) "Regular interest" shall mean interest as determined from time to
26 time by the board of trustees under the provisions of section thirteen, sub-
27 section fifteen, of this act.

28 (10) "Aggregate contributions" shall mean the sum of the amounts de-
29 ducted from a member's salary and credited to his account in the annuity sav-
30 ings fund.

31 (11) "Annuity" shall mean payments for life derived from the aggregate
32 contributions of a member. All annuities shall be paid in equal monthly in-
33 stallments.

34 (12) "Pension" shall mean payments for life derived from contributions
35 by the employer. All pensions shall be paid in equal monthly installments.

36 (13) "Retirement allowance" shall mean the sum of the pension and
37 annuity, if any.

38 (14) "Earnable compensation" shall mean the full rate of the salary that
39 would be payable to an employee if he worked the full normal working time
40 for his position. In cases where salary includes maintenance, the board of
41 trustees shall fix the value of that part of the salary not paid in money which
42 shall be considered under this act.

43 (15) "Average final compensation" shall mean the average annual earn-
44 able salary of an employee during his last [ten] five years of service as an
45 employee or if he had less than [ten] five years of service, then his average
46 earnable salary for his total service.

47 (16) "Retirement" shall mean withdrawal from active service with a
48 retirement allowance granted under the provisions of this act.

49 (17) "Annuity reserve" shall mean the present value of all payments to
50 be made on account of any annuity or benefit in lieu of any annuity computed
51 upon the basis of such mortality tables as shall be adopted by the board of
52 trustees, and regular interest.


53 (18) "Pension reserve" shall mean the present value of all payments to
54 be made on account of any pension or benefit in lieu of any pension computed
55 upon the basis of such mortality tables as shall be adopted by the board of
56 trustees, and regular interest.

57 (19) "Actuarial equivalent" shall mean a benefit of equal value when
58 computed upon the basis of such mortality tables as shall be adopted by the
59 board of trustees, and regular interest.

60 (20) "Beneficiary" shall mean any person receiving a retirement allow-
61 ance or other benefit as provided by this act.

STATEMENT

The purpose of this amendment is to conform with other State-operated pension systems.
