The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably an Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 5075.

This Assembly Committee Substitute removes the New Jersey Fire Engine and Equipment Museum from the auspices of the Department of Environmental Protection and requires it to be reorganized and established as an independent, non-profit organization. The museum is to oversee the permanent fire museum and fallen firefighter memorial to honor New Jersey's proud history of firefighting service and the brave men and women who have sacrificed their lives in the fire service.

The substitute requires the museum to be operated by a board of directors, which is to consist of the following members: the Secretary of State or a designee; the Director of the Division of Fire Safety or a designee; the Executive Director of the New Jersey Historical Commission within the Department of State or a designee; one public member appointed by the President of the Senate, one public member appointed by the Speaker of the General Assembly; one public member appointed by the Governor; and the membership of the board of directors of the New Jersey Fire Museum and Fallen Firefighter Memorial who served on the board prior to the effective date of the bill. The substitute also allows the board to appoint additional voting members by a unanimous vote of the existing members.

The board of directors for the New Jersey Fire Engine and Equipment Museum would have the following rights and responsibilities:

- to make, amend, and repeal rules and bylaws for its own governance and guidance not inconsistent with State and federal law;
- to maintain an office within the State as it may designate;
- to contract for, accept, solicit, or collect any grants, loans, funds, property, or other aid in any form from the federal government or any agency or instrumentality thereof, from the State or any agency, instrumentality, or political subdivision thereof, or from any other public source;

- to make and enter into contracts, leases, agreements, and purchases necessary for the use, or incidental to the performance of, the board's duties and the exercise of its powers established by the substitute;
- to insure against any losses in connection with the board's properties, operations, or assets;
- to formulate and adopt rules and regulations for the efficient conduct of the work and general administration of the board, its officers, and employees;
- to institute or cause to be instituted any legal proceedings or processes as may be necessary to properly enforce and give effect to any of the powers or duties of the executive director or the board;
- to develop an economic development master plan identifying the board's objectives, policies, and programs which will encourage the museum's attraction, expansion, and retention;
- to support and maintain existing museum facilities and services for the educational or recreational use and benefit of the public;
- to maintain exhibits and displays to promote and develop public interest and understanding of firefighter history;
- to develop, raise funds for, build and operate a fire museum, fire safety education center, and fallen firefighters memorial, and to provide for the display of fire apparatus and equipment, along with the history and documentation available for preservation;
- to determine the best course of action regarding museum collections both owned by and lent to the museum including, but not limited to, continuing any current ownerships agreements or memorandums of understanding entered into by the board prior to the substitute's enactment;
- to oversee museum facility expansion, development, and strategic planning;
- to address marketing, budget, and fundraising issues;
- to conduct educational and recreational programs held at the museum facilities;
- to make plans and preparations for preservation and restoration of museum collection pieces; and

(3) The substitute adds to the board of directors the membership of the board of directors of the New Jersey Fire Museum and Fallen Firefighter Memorial Commission who served on the board prior to bill's effective date;

(4) The substitute also allows the board to appoint additional voting members by a unanimous vote of the existing members.

(5) The substitute allows the New Jersey Fire Engine and Equipment Museum to partner with affiliate organizations to borrow and lend temporary or permanent museum collections and to raise funds.

(6) Allows board of directors to be dissolved upon a majority vote of the board members and requires return of donated museum collections upon the board's dissolution; and

(7) The substitute makes a \$200,000 appropriation to the Jersey Fire Engine and Equipment Museum.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably the Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 5075 (1R), with committee amendments.

As amended and reported by the committee, the Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 5075 removes the New Jersey Fire Museum and Fallen Firefighters Memorial from the auspices of the Department of Environmental Protection and requires it to be reorganized and established as an independent, non-profit organization. The museum is to oversee the permanent fire museum and fallen firefighter memorial to honor New Jersey's proud history of firefighting service and the brave men and women who have sacrificed their lives in the fire service. Under the substitute, the museum collection donated by Ernest Day is to be transferred from the Department of Environmental Protection and placed in the custody of the New Jersey Fire Museum and Fallen Firefighters Memorial.

The substitute requires the museum to be operated by a board of directors, which would have the following rights and responsibilities:

- to make, amend, and repeal rules and bylaws for its own governance and guidance not inconsistent with State and federal law;
- to maintain an office within the State as it may designate;
- to contract for, accept, solicit, or collect any grants, loans, funds, property, or other aid in any form from the federal government or any agency or instrumentality thereof; from the State or any agency, instrumentality, or political subdivision thereof; or from any other public source;
- to make and enter into contracts, leases, agreements, and purchases necessary for the use, or incidental to the performance of, the board's duties and the exercise of its powers established by the substitute;
- to insure against any losses in connection with the board's properties, operations, or assets;

Pursuant to Article V, Section I, Paragraph 14 of the New Jersey Constitution, I am herewith returning Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 5075 (Second Reprint) with my recommendations for reconsideration.

This bill removes the Fire Engine and Equipment Museum from the auspices of the Department of Environmental Protection ("DEP") and establishes and reorganizes it as the Fire Museum and Fallen Firefighters Memorial ("Fire Museum") overseen by an independent, non-profit organization and governed by a Board of Directors (the "Board").

While I support the Fire Museum's reorganization, I am concerned that the bill may be overly prescriptive in detailing the responsibilities and duties of the Board of a private entity. I am therefore recommending, with the support of the bill's sponsors, the removal of various provisions regarding the Board that are more appropriately established by the Board through its foundational documents, bylaws, collection policies, and similar policy documents.

Therefore, I herewith return Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 5075 (Second Reprint) and recommend that it be amended as follows:

**A-5334/S-3442 (Lopez, Mazzeo, Stanley/Diegnan, T. Kean)** – Requires DOT, NJT, and DHS to study and implement transportation mobility and accessibility improvements for persons with autism and developmental disabilities

**A-5484/S-3817 (Dancer, Caputo, Houghtaling/Lagana)** – Requires New Jersey Racing Commission to adopt procedures to enforce internal controls; requires annual audit

**A-6033/S-4194 (Bramnick/Sweeney, T. Kean)** – Classifies golf caddies as independent contractors for purposes of State employment laws

**A-6157/S-4202 (Speight, Moen/Ruiz, Beach)** – Prohibits circumventing intergovernmental transfer process for law enforcement officers in certain circumstances
