AN ACT regulating the use of commercial vehicles on the streets, roads and highways of  
this State.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:*

1 1. Every vehicle used for commercial purposes on any of the streets, roads and  
2 highways of this State shall have conspicuously displayed thereon or on a name plate  
3 affixed thereto, the name of the owner of said vehicle and the name of the city,  
4 town, or township or other municipality in which such owner resides, which sign  
5 or name plate shall be in plain view and in letters not less than three inches in height.

1 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate or drive or cause or permit to  
2 be operated or driven any commercial vehicle on any of the roads, streets or highways  
3 of this State which does not conform to the provisions of this act.

1 3. Any person violating the provisions of this act shall, upon conviction thereof,  
2 be fined a sum not exceeding ten dollars, or on failure to pay such fine, be impris-  
3 oned in the county jail for a period not to exceed ten days.

4 Moneys received for fines under the provisions of this act shall be accounted for  
5 and forwarded to the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles and by him paid over to the  
6 State Treasurer of the State of New Jersey, to be used as a fund for the repair of the  
7 improved roads throughout the State, regard being had to the repair of the most im-  
8 proved roads and the distribution of the benefits of this act throughout the several  
9 counties of this State.

## STATEMENT.

The object of this bill is to furnish easier means of identification of commercial vehicles which may be used for unlawful purposes, or the drivers of which may violate traffic laws.
