AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An act for the limitation of suits respecting titles to land" (Revision of 1877, page 598).

1. **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. Section one of the act to which this is an amendment is hereby amended to read as follows:

1. ~~【Sixty】~~ Thirty years' actual possession of any lands, tenements, or other real estate, excepting woodlands or uncultivated tracts and that sixty years' actual possession of any woodlands or uncultivated tracts, uninterruptedly continued by occupancy, descent, conveyance or otherwise, in whatever way or manner such possession might have commenced, or have been continued, shall vest a full and complete right and title in every actual possessor or occupier of such lands, tenements, or other real estate; and shall be a good and sufficient bar to all claims that may be made, or actions commenced by any person or persons whatsoever, for the recovery of any such lands, tenements, or other real estate."

2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

3. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT.

This bill changes from sixty to thirty years the time for the limitation of suits respecting titles to land.
